# November is COPD Awareness Month

November - a month in which we celebrate Thanksgiving.

Are you aware it is also a month in which COPD is brought to the attention of the public? COPD - Chronic Obstructive Pulmonary Disease - includes asthma, chronic bronchitis and emphysema and is a killer amongst many in the United States.

Recently an article appeared stating that the disease was rising among women in the nation's population. The Efforts foundation (a web site) has a great deal of information as well as a support group to help people with education as well as support. It also has been associated in getting the word out to the public. Your neighbor may be one who is struggling to breathe and you may not be aware of it.

Very few people know anything about this disease even though it is the fourth leading cause of death in the nation. The death rate for COPD has shot up to 163% in the last 30 years while other major causes of death - cancer and heart disease - are dropping. COPD deaths among women are driving up that increase. Early detection and treatment of COPD is the key to slowing the decline in lung function and preventing premature death from the disease.

A new program initiated by the American Academy of Chest Physicians targets family doctors, internists and other primary care providers to increase their aware-

ness of the disease. The program promotes screening for the disease just as for other chronic conditions such as diabetes, high blood pressure and high cholesterol.

Michael C. Iannuzzi, MD and chief of pulmonary, critical care and sleep medicine at Mount Sinai Medical Center in New York City, recommends that people who have symptoms or risk factors for the disease receive spirometry testing during their regular health check-ups. This tests measures lung function and can confirm a suspected diagnosis of COPD. The patient exhales into a machine attached to a computer which provides a measurement percentile based on the patient's age, height and weight.

## Ladies compete at regional

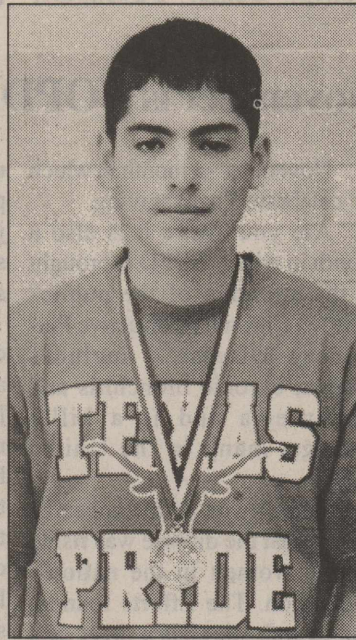

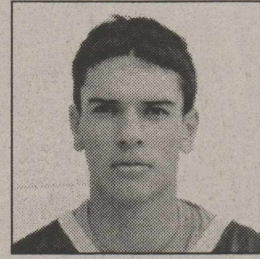
"I am very proud of these girls," said Coach Ricky King. "They have worked extremely hard and had a great cross country season in spite of setbacks from injuries. They ran their heart

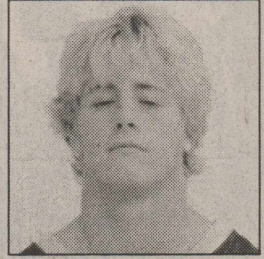


ELISEO TRETO was named to the All-State Cross Country Team.

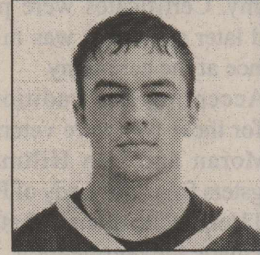

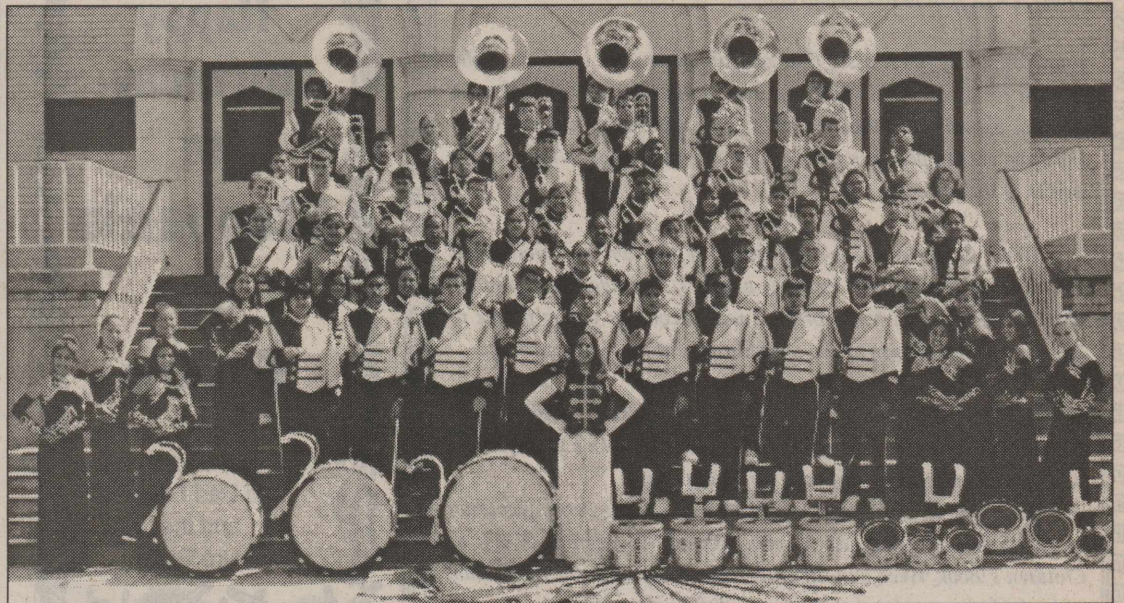

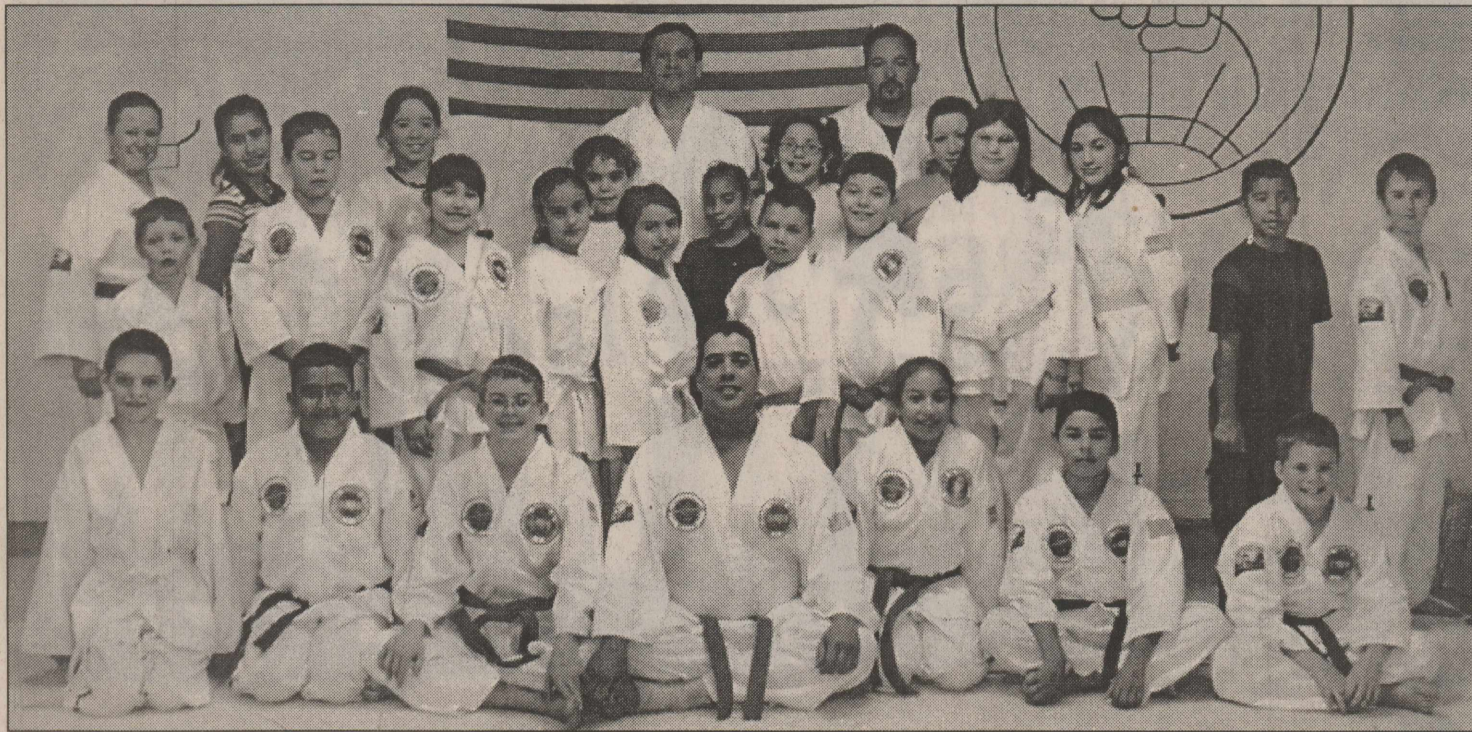

# Southwest TaeKwon-Do celebrates one year anniversary in November

Charyoot... Kyung Nae' These foreign words were heard by about 35 Ozona residents who enrolled at Southwest TaeKwon-Do to begin their martial arts training one year ago this month. Family and friends were also present to see the students, ranging in ages from 5 years old to over 35, patiently, but eagerly await instructions from Mr. Galindo, as he lined the students up in descending order by age.

The students, donned in their snow-white uniforms closely resembling pajamas, and their white belts tied in the required square knot, were anxious to get on with learning the required kicks, self-defense techniques, and training exercises that they had "learned" by watching movies from Bruce Lee to Steven Segal to Jackie Chan and Jet Li. Most students however, soon realized that it takes many months, if not years, to become as proficient in a martial art as the movies show. But still today, TaeKwon-Do is alive and growing in Ozona, and the once foreign vocabulary heard 12 months ago is as recognizable to those who have continued

their training in TaeKwon-Do, as the everyday English or Spanish spoken by local and area residents.

TaeKwon-Do, pronounced "Tie-kwon-doe" is a Korean martial art that is based on ancient Korean kicking techniques; in the mid 1930's Japanese hand techniques were incorporated and a "super karate" was born. Introduced to the world in 1955 by a group of Korean scholars, historians, educators and martial arts masters of the day, headed by General Choi, Hong-Hi, TaeKwon-Do today is arguably the best method of unarmed self-defense and is practiced worldwide. General Choi (pronounced "Chay") is credited with naming this super karate "TaeKwon-Do" and is known as the Founding Father of TaeKwon-Do.

General Choi passed away in the summer of 2002 at the age of 84, but up until his death, still held seminars and training sessions for hundreds of black belts across the United States and the world. Mr. Galindo, who has trained in TaeKwon-Do since 1982, and holds a 4th degree black belt, was fortunate enough to train under General Choi in Burbank, Califor-

nia in 1995, and again in Denver, Colorado, in 1999. When asked about his training experiences under General Choi, Mr. Galindo stated that "General Choi's demeanor, his ability to teach with patience, and even his flexibility when demonstrating a kick or punch, was nothing less than awe-inspiring especially considering his age; General Choi's love of his martial art, TaeKwon-Do, was something that was quite evident in his being."

The by now familiar Korean terminology still echoes proudly in Ozona at 714 11th Street, at least twice each week on Mondays and Wednesdays, as students train and prepare for their next belt test; those who have continued their training since beginning last November are now about halfway to becoming black belts in TaeKwon-Do. As Mr. Galindo says "the only ones who don't make it (to black belt) are those who quit."

There are 10 ranks that a student must attain before becoming eligible to test for black belt; the starting rank begins at white belt and continues through yellow, green, blue, red, and then black belt. There are intermediate ranks

between each solid color belt, but all ranks are equally important in achieving the black belt rank. The students test for a new rank about every 10 weeks.

Mr. Galindo says that Ozona students are eager to learn new techniques, especially new kicks, and further states that "my biggest reward is in seeing the subtle improvements in each student turn into more obvious progress not only in their TaeKwon-Do training, but in other aspects of their lives, such as improvements in grades and even school athletics, in attitudes and outlook, and even in behavioral aspects at home or school."

Many parents agree with Mr. Galindo and have commented on their children's improvement in many areas. Mr. Bobby Knox, long-time Ozona resident, indicated to Mr. Galindo that "Duncan (Mr. Knox's youngest son) was showing me the he can stand on one leg without much trouble now; he wasn't able to do that prior to TaeKwon-Do training." Duncan had trouble with his balance due to a premature birth. Mr. Galindo agreed that Duncan's performance in TaeKwon-Do classes

has improved tremendously. Other comments have been made by Ozona teachers regarding an improvement in some of the TaeKwon-Do students' dyslexia problems, like Erik Duenes, a third grader at Ozona Elementary School, who now seems to have much less trouble distinguishing rights from lefts; this improvement was attributed to TaeKwon-Do training.

All TaeKwon-Do students are required to bring their school report cards to their instructor, and those that have all "A's" receive a red star as part of their uniform; this designation moves the student up in the ranking system. Those that don't get all "A's" receive a friendly reprimand from their instructor, and a promise from the student to do better in their school performance for the next six weeks.

TaeKwon-Do has had a positive impact on local residents' lives, and continues to do so. Students learn that achieving a goal can be difficult, but fun at the same time; they learn that in real life, there are winners and losers; they learn that with dedication and determination, they can accomplish physical feats not thought possible prior to TaeKwon-Do training; they learn that they can work with each other, get along with all peoples from all walks of life, and be better for it; they learn that we all have positive attributes to offer, and negative weaknesses that we need to improve on; they learn that TaeKwon-Do is not simply about kicking and punching, and jumping and yelling, but about building a better environment and doing the best we can with what we have today.

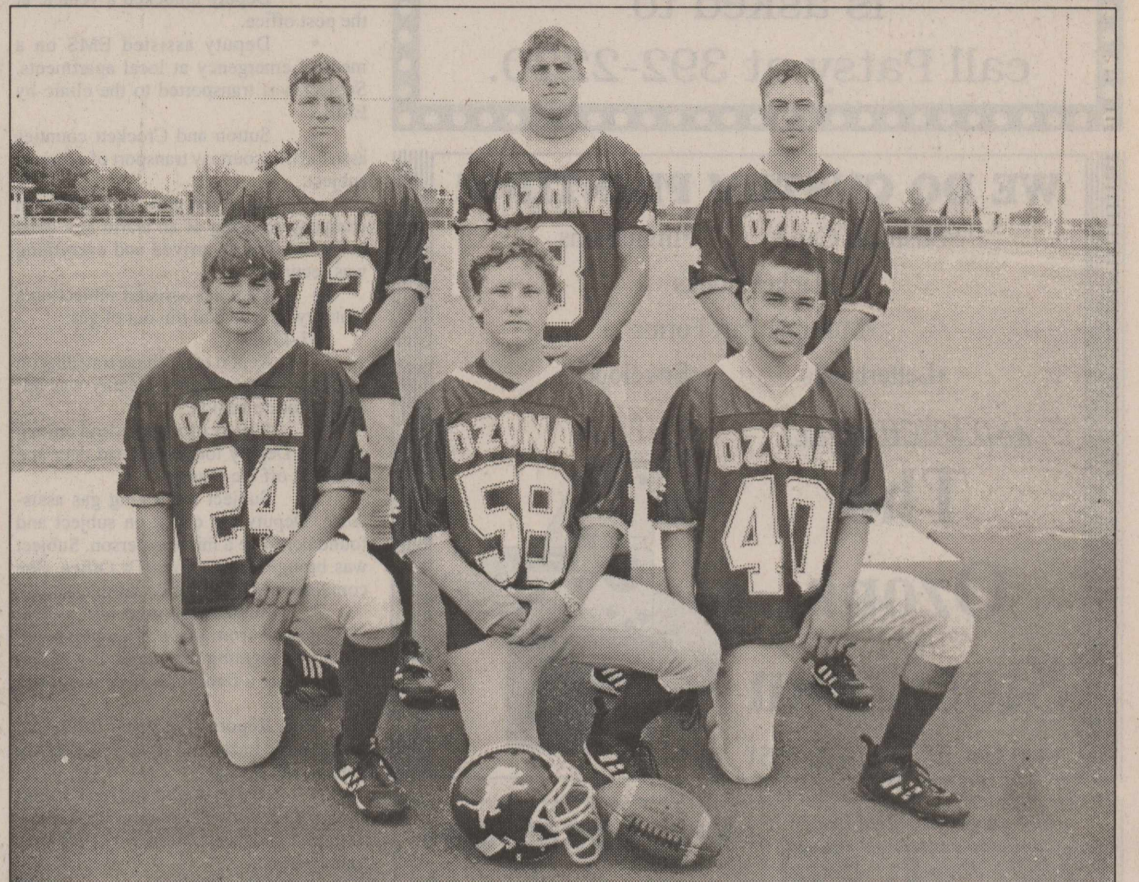

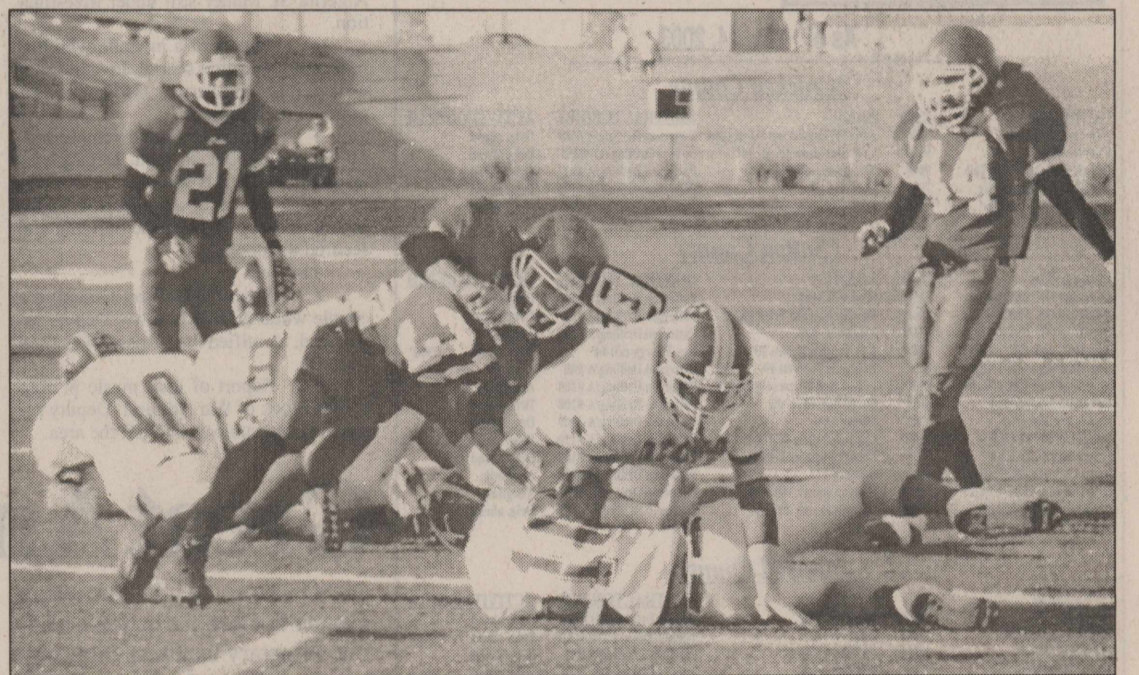

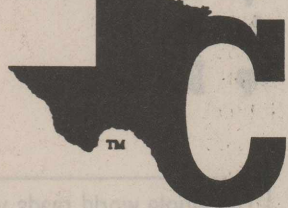
