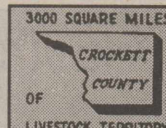

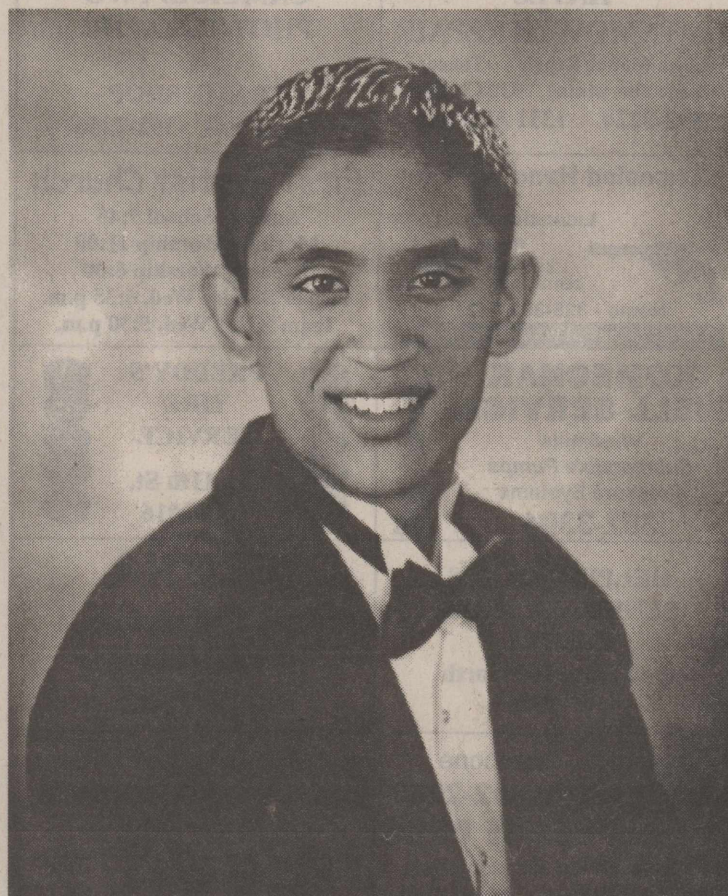

ONB centennial 'Barbecue in the Park' celebration Saturday

In 1905 several ranchers and businessmen in Ozona established the Ozona National Bank. It opened on June 1, 1905 in the rear of the Smith Drugstore. Total deposits on the first day were

\$12,847.85.

The first permanent bank structure was erected in 1906. It was designed by Oscar Ruffini using native limestone. This original building is still standing on

the west side of the town square. Since 1968 the Bank has been located in its black marble building on the south side of the square.

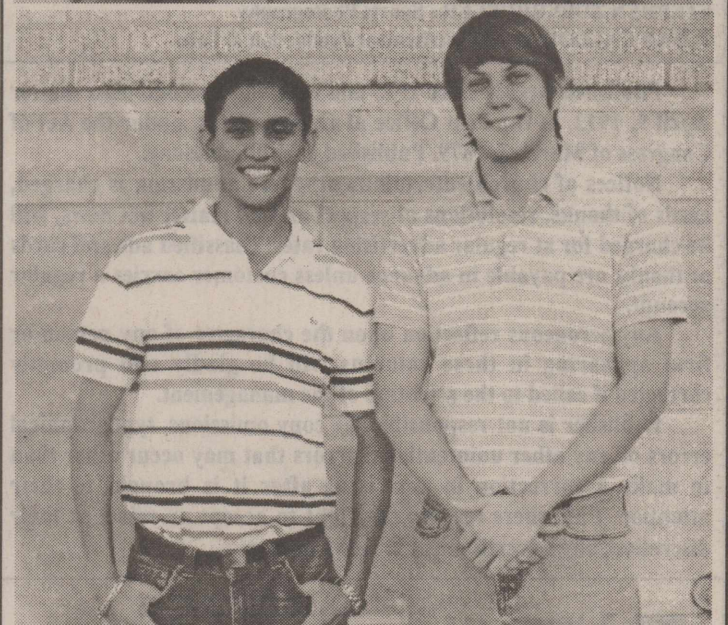
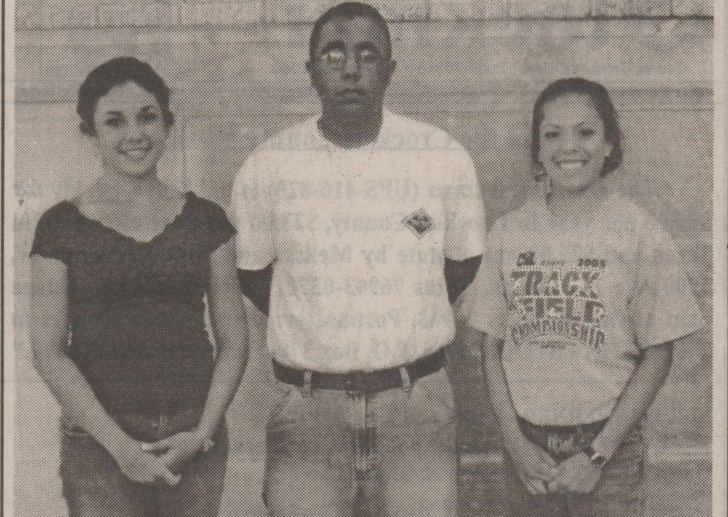

Far too many children suffered serious illnesses that today can be avoided by a simple vaccination.

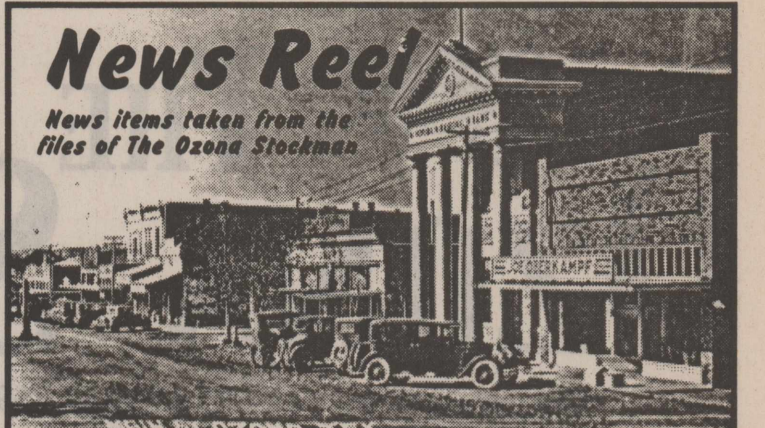

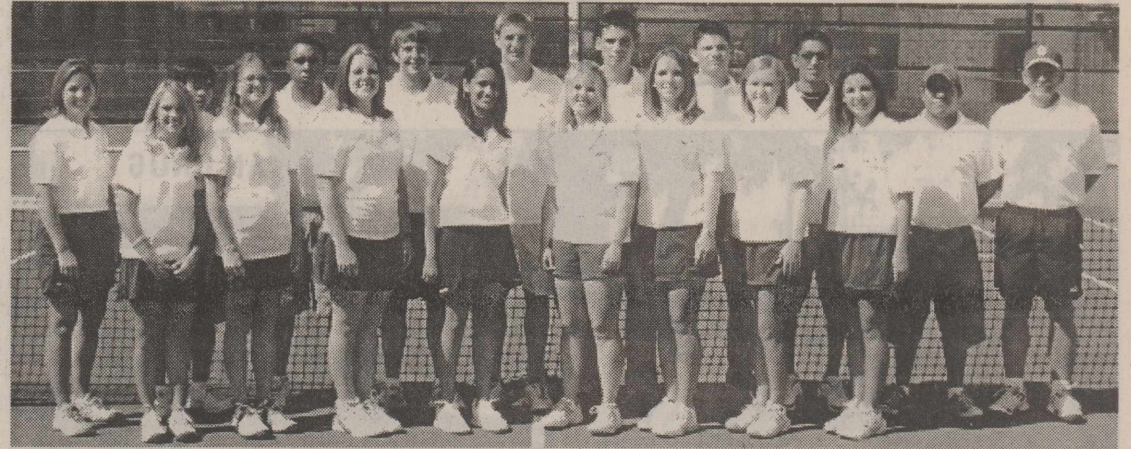

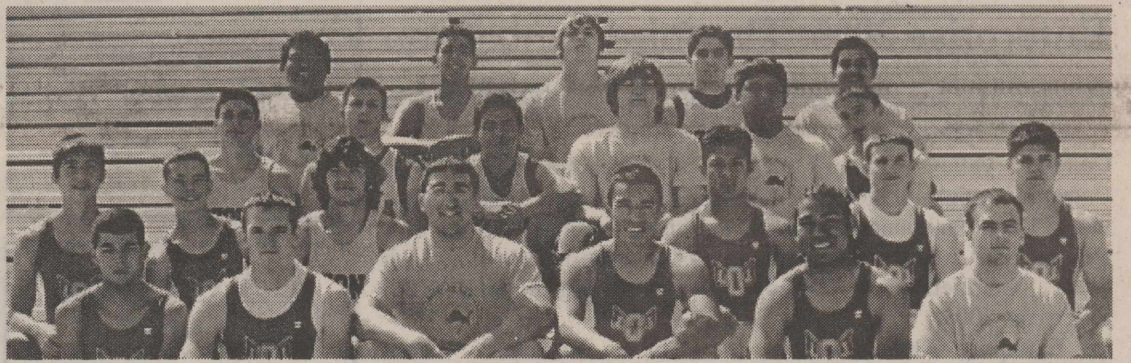

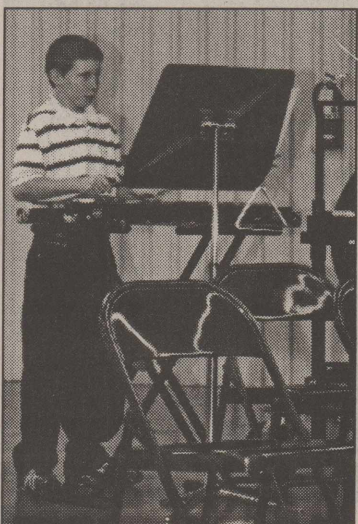
This was Moore's first venture to the "Big Show" and she certainly did not disappoint anyone.

Replacing Marty on June 11 as commander of the 19,600 men and women of the Texas National Guard will be Brig. Gen. Charles G. Rodriguez. The 51-year-old San Antonio native will be the state's first Hispanic adjutant general.
