

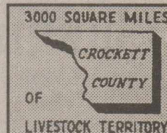

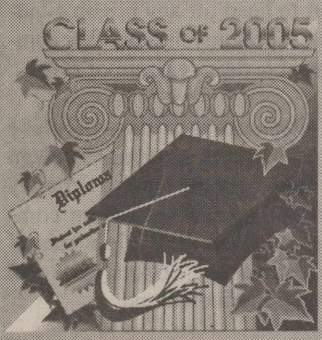

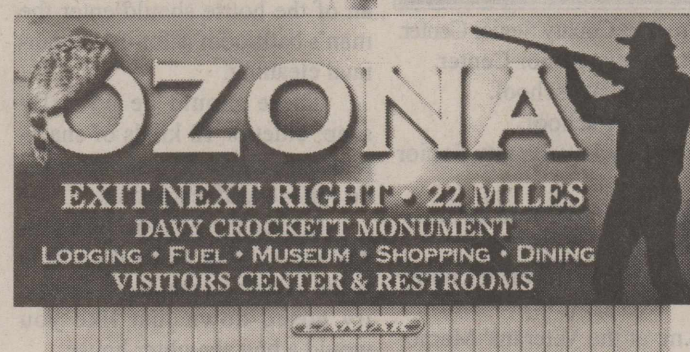
The board also unanimously approved to accept change elementary counselor 2005-2006 employment contract from 11 months to 10 1/2 months employment at request of counselor.

**NEWS REEL MAY 23, 1946**

The Crockett County School Board named high school principal Foy Moody to the post of Superintendent of Schools, replacing L.B.T. Sikes who resigned last Tuesday night.

## It's the Pitts

### Spouse House

I am often asked what is the secret to my long and happy marriage and my response is always the same: good architecture.

I recently picked up a slick magazine with these words on the cover: "Designing the perfect ranch home."

Inside were several pictures of subdivisions in big cities that were built in the "ranch style."

I have news for those editors...the perfect ranch home is not situated 10 feet from its neighbor and does not have a loggia, ramada, solarium, atrium, loft or pied a terre. Whatever that is.

Trust me on this one, the most important feature in a ranch house is separate bathrooms for the Mr. and Mrs. of the house.

No side-by-side sinks or showers for two, but totally separate bathrooms.

The bathroom belonging to the man of the house should be soundproofed and the maximum distance possible from social or dining areas.

Ideally, it would be in a separate building.

It should be equipped with at least two industrial strength fans and large windows that open to the fullest extent possible.

There should be a sign on the door that says, "Enter at your own risk," and the only time the woman of the house should enter the man's bathroom is for its semi-annual cleaning.

There should be no frilly soap, bidet or 12 kinds of shampoo in the shower nor should there be wall-to-wall carpeting.

Instead there should be a simple cement floor with a drain hole in the middle so that it can be easily hosed down just like you would a hog slaughter house.

Under no circumstances should guests be allowed to use the man's bathroom or previously close friendships could be lost forever.

A good ranch house is not split level but split in two: the head of the household should have her own master bedroom and the man his own, even if it is smaller than the wife's walk-in closet.

You will need a three car garage to store all your stuff in with no room left for your vehicles.

I see no need for a library as there is probably one of those in town.

A dining room is the biggest waste for there may be the temptation to get out the fine China and crystal for formal family get-togethers. And who wants in-laws snooping around?

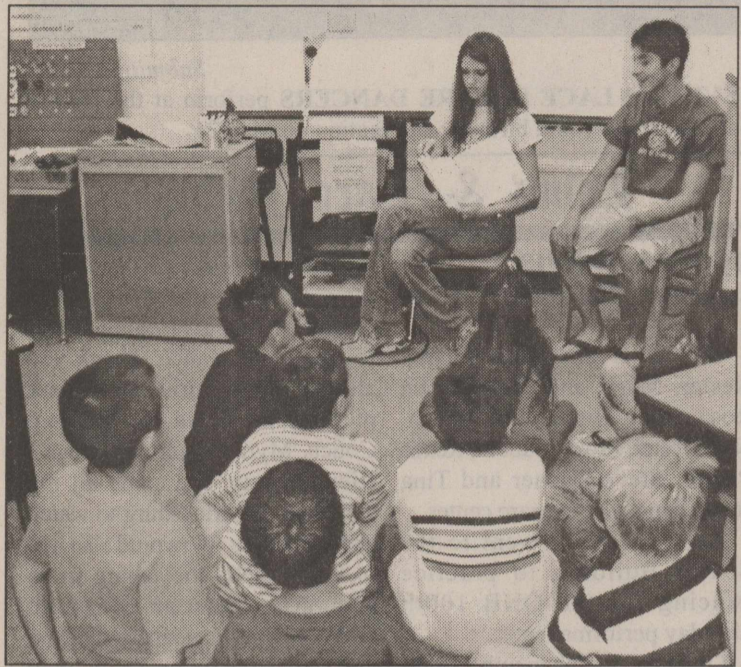
You'll need a porch so the dog and man of the house will have somewhere to sleep after family disagreements.

But you should never include in your house plans a media room, living room or entry hall where spouses might come in frequent contact with one another.

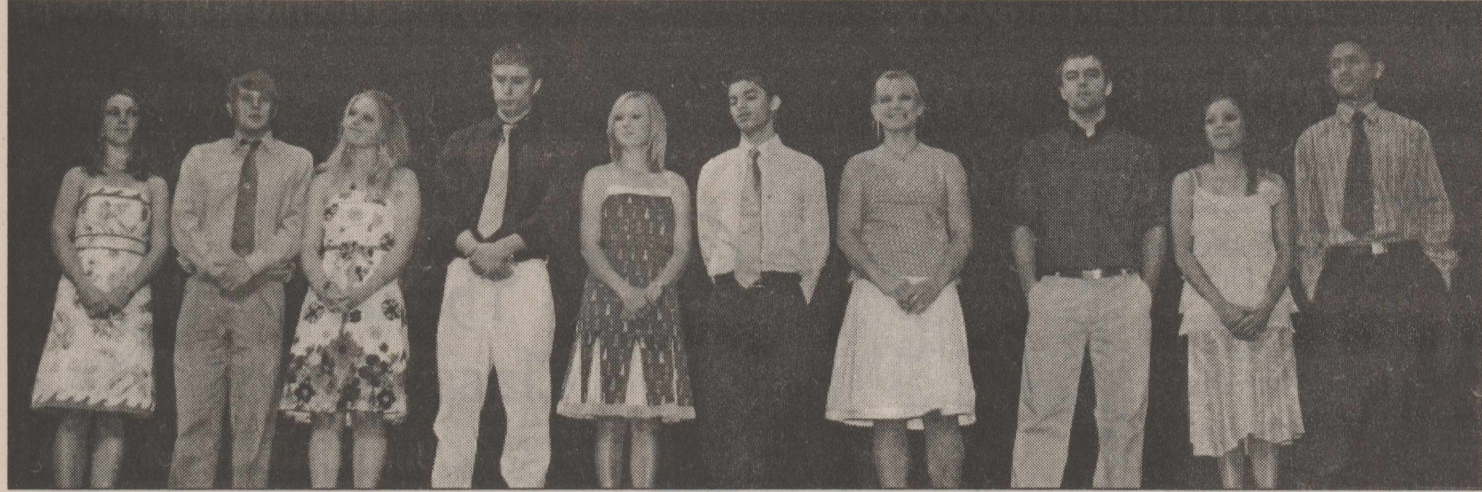
He plans on attending Baylor University and majoring in pre-medicine to become a doctor of internal medicine or study cardiology.

## Voters to decide on marriage definition

AUSTIN - If all goes as lawmakers hope, the final gavel will fall on the 140-day regular session of the 79th Legislature on May 30.

Conference committee discussion continues on school finance and property tax reform, but after a vigorous battle in the Senate, lawmakers in the upper chamber voted 21-8 to put a constitutional amendment banning gay marriage on the fall general election ballot.

If voters approve the amendment on Nov. 8, the provision likely would be challenged in court as have similar laws in other states.

At one point during the discussion of the same-sex marriage measure, Sen. Juan Hinojosa (D-McAllen) offered an amendment that would prohibit people with three previous marriages from tying the knot a fourth time.

That amendment and six others did not survive. Hinojosa was one of the Democrats who voted against the resolution, and his amendment had not been serious.

**Transportation bill goes to conference committee...**

The Senate also approved a transportation bill that would among other things require a yes from voters before an existing "free" highway built with gasoline tax revenue could be converted into a toll road.

But that provision is not in the House version of the bill, so it is headed to a conference committee.

**Benefits update...**

Looks like the state's 145,000 full-time workers will get a 4 percent pay raise effective Sept. 1, followed by a 3 percent pay hike on Sept. 1, 2006. That's the result of a House-Senate compromise, but still subject to approval of the final budget bill, Senate Bill 1.

Despite early-in-the-session rumors of significant tinkering with state retirement system rules, no changes have been made regarding retirement eligibility or the multiplier used to determine the size of a state employee's retirement check.

**Lawmakers raise their pension by \$6,000...**

The House has approved an enhanced retirement package for legislators, the governor and other elected officials.

The measure, tacked on to a bill giving a pay raise to district and appeals court judges, will add \$6,000 to the annual retirement check a lawmaker would receive on retiring at age 50 after 12 years of service.

Though a record vote is required if only one member asks for one, no one asked.

**DPS honors fallen officers...**

The Memorial Day most Texans know about is May 30, but the Department of Public Safety and other law enforcement agencies observe another memorial day as well - one recognizing peace officers who die in the line of duty.

The DPS, which staged its observance May 17, noted that 14 Texas officers lost their lives in 2004 and the first five months of this year.

Of those, four died as a result of felony crimes and 10 were killed in duty-related accidents.

**Senate honors TPA...**

Members of the upper chamber have had some emotional debates this session, but a resolution honoring the Texas Press Association on its 125th anniversary moved through the Senate on May 19 with only a few chuckles.

Sponsor Sen. John Whitmire (D-Houston) quipped to his colleagues: "Hold your applause, or your boos, until after I complete reading the resolution."

Lawmakers, he added, couldn't do their job without newspapers.

## Department of Public Safety warns against pocket bike use

With summertime just around the corner, officials at the Department of Public Safety are warning owners of the use of miniature motorcycles.

Miniature motorcycles, also known as pocket bikes and pocket rockets, are illegal to operate on public roadways and can only be operated on private property, according to the DPS. Many people have been told that the vehicles are legal on public streets in certain circumstances, but there are no exceptions, the DPS stated.

One misconception about the vehicles is that they meet the same requirements as a motor assisted scooter. Pocket bikes do

not meet the Texas Transportation Code requirements because they cannot be registered as vehicles and they do not meet equipment standards required by federal and Texas law, the DPS stated.

Drivers using these mini-vehicles could face numerous, potential charges including operating an unregistered vehicle, no drivers' license, no insurance and various equipment violations, the DPS stated.

It is also illegal to use these vehicles on sidewalks.

In Texas, there have been a number of injury crashes involving pocket bikes, and at least one fatality in Laredo in January, the DPS stated.
