## NEXT MONDAY

We are planning a special service next Monday in our local cemetery to honor those who have given their lives in war for our country. It was originally called Decoration day and started during the American Civil War but many of us know it Memorial Day. Flowers or wreaths were placed on the graves of loved ones and then finally to any soldier that had given
their life while serving. In 1886 May 30 th was designated as the day to honor them but in 1971 the day was changed to the last Monday of May. We will celebrate it nationally by the placing of a wreath on the grave of the unknown soldier in Arlington National Cemetery in Washington DC.
