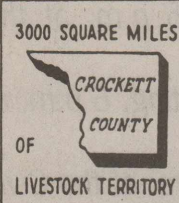

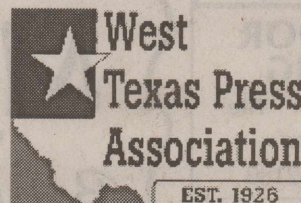

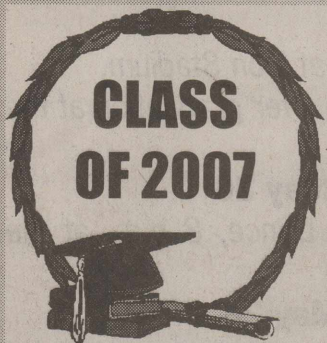

## Commissioner arrested for allegedly portraying a law enforcement official

Crockett County Commissioner Alfredo Tobar was arrested last week for allegedly impersonating a law enforcement official and for allegedly possessing another person's social security card.

Tobar was arrested on May 14. He is currently out on bond.

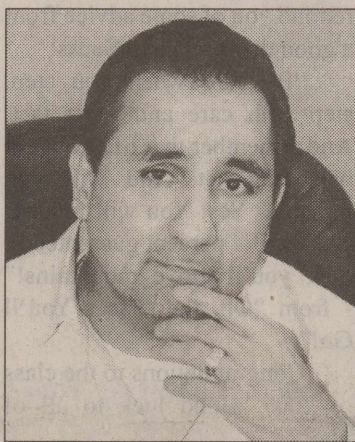
He was charged with impersonating a public servant, which is a third degree felony and is punishable up to 10 years in prison and a fine not to exceed \$10,000, according to the Texas Penal Code.

Tobar was also charged with fraudulent use of possession of identifying information, a state jail felony that is punishable up to two years in prison and a fine not to exceed \$10,000.

According to an affidavit filed in the Crockett County Justice of the Peace Office by Chief Deputy Ron Hawthorne, Tobar talked to two employees of Amigo Chemical Control, while they were working at the gate to the Devon gas compressor station on May 13. The station is located 3.5 miles south of Ozona.

Tobar approached the employees and said that he was working with the law, the affidavit stated.

Tobar then asked both employees if they had a license to spray, the affidavit stated. Both

men stated that their employer, Brooks Long, had a license.

Tobar also asked both men for their social security cards so he could photograph them.

Jose Antonio Rivera gave Tobar his card for the photograph, as well as a sample of the chemical they were using, the affidavit stated.

Rivera said he thought Tobar was a law enforcement official, the affidavit stated.

The other employee, Armando Prado, refused to give Tobar his social security card, the affidavit stated. Prado also told Tobar that he worked for Brooks Long who also works for law enforcement. Long is the Texas Ranger for Crockett County and other areas counties.

Prado then called Long on a telephone. Tobar spoke to Long on the phone and then left, the

affidavit stated.

Prado's son, Armando Prado Jr., saw Tobar arrive in a black pickup truck and start taking photographs of the site, the affidavit stated.

Prado Jr. said he thought Tobar might be a safety officer, the affidavit stated.

Prado Jr. also said he saw Tobar take a photograph of an Amigo Chemical Control business card that his father presented to Tobar. Also, Prado Jr. stated he saw his father call Long about Tobar being there, the affidavit stated.

Christopher Martinez, another employee of Amigo Chemical Control, stated that he was turning into the gate at Devon, and he saw Tobar talking to two of the crew members, the affidavit stated.

Martinez also said that as he drove up Tobar was taking a photograph of Long's business card that Prado gave him, the affidavit stated.

Martinez then got out of his truck and asked Tobar what he was doing. Tobar started walking away, and said the chemicals they were using were illegal and that the men are not licensed to use them, the affidavit stated.

According to the crew, they thought Tobar was a representative of law enforcement or they would not have cooperated with him, the affidavit stated.

## Former wool manager faces federal charges

The former manager of Wool Growers Central Storage Co. has been officially charged by the U.S. Attorney's Office.

Donnie Laughlin is facing a federal felony charge of allegedly engaging in monetary transactions in property derived from specified unlawful activity, which falls under racketeering, or conspiring to organize a crime, in the U.S. Code.

According to court documents filed May 17 in the U.S. District Court for the Northern District of Texas, Laughlin carried on a scheme to defraud and obtained \$2,072,326.56 from the producers/owners of mohair

and wool stored at the Ozona and Sanderson warehouses.

Laughlin allegedly carried out the scheme by selling producers' wool and mohair, and not paying the producers the money they were owed, the documents state. Laughlin also sold the products without the producers' knowledge or permission.

Instead of deducting fees for storage and commissions from these sales, and paying over the balance to the producer, Laughlin would either keep the money for himself or transfer the money from the mohair/wool sales bank account to the bank account of the Wool Growers retail business, the documents state.

## Three campus options include building a new primary school

Four options, including one that will build a new school for Pre-K through fifth grades on the primary school site, were presented to the School Facilities Improvement Committee and the Crockett County CCSD Board of Trustees during a meeting on May 17.

Architects from Pfluger and Associates presented options that also included Pre-K through fifth at the primary school and fourth through eighth at the middle school, Pre-K through fifth at the intermediate and fourth through eighth at the middle school and Pre-K through fifth at the intermediate school.

The options also included new kitchens for the Pre-K through third or the Pre-K through fifth campuses.

At an earlier meeting, the committee and the board voted to

go to from four campuses to three.

Cost for the building of a new school on the primary site was estimated at \$9.5 million. This price also includes the cost of demolishing the current primary school.

To keep the primary, while splitting grades with the middle school, it was \$9.4 million.

To keep the intermediate, while splitting grades with the middle school, it was \$8.165 million.

The classrooms at the middle school would be added on to the back of the school, and would be adjacent to the cafeteria and gymnasium. The property across from the middle school would be designed as a new playground area.

To house Pre-K through fifth at the intermediate, it was \$6.836 million.

The last two options did not include costs for possible demolition to the primary school.

The prices are only construction costs. Around 18 to

23 percent needs to be added to count for surveys, architect fees and inflation, said Kent Niemann with Pfluger and Associates.

"All of the amounts are close and based on the amount of work that we do," Niemann said.

During the meeting, a vote was taken by the group as to which option was liked best. Thirteen people voted for building a new school at the primary site, six people voted to have Pre-K through third at the intermediate and fourth through fifth at the middle school and four people voted for Pre-K through fifth at the intermediate.

At the end of the meeting another vote was taken again. This time 14 people voted to build a new school, six voted to house Pre-K through fifth at the intermediate and one voted to have Pre-K through third at the intermediate and fourth and fifth at the middle school.

## Green: As In Cash

The big fad these days amongst politicians, Hollywood actors and environmentalists is to be "carbon neutral". Theoretically you do this by canceling out your carbon emissions with carbon credits. The best example I can think of to explain this concept is to use the man who started all this with his horror-documentary about the world-ending possibilities brought about by global warming.

SAN ANGELO — Charles K. Black of San Angelo, Texas, passed away Thursday, May 17, 2007, in a local care center due to complications from cancer.

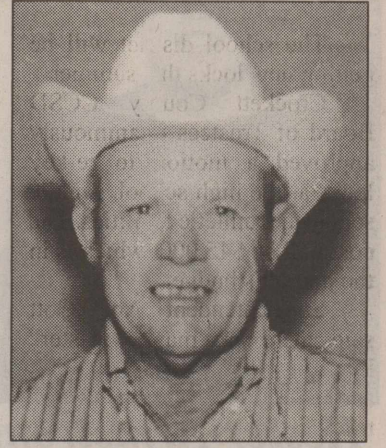
Graveside service was Sunday, May 20, in Cedar Hill Cemetery in Ozona. Arrangements were by Preddy Funeral Home.

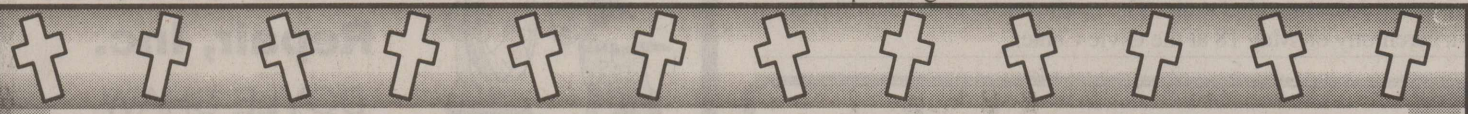

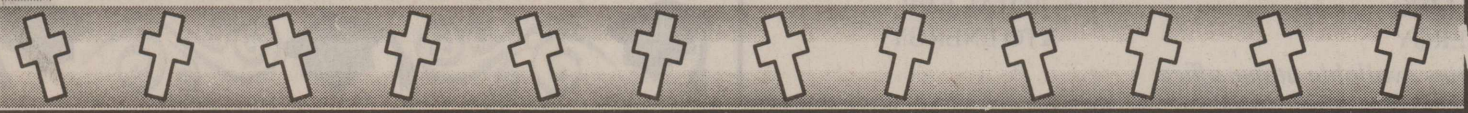

# Board approves new key-lock system

The school district will be getting new locks this summer.

Crockett County CCSD Board of Trustees unanimously approved a motion to re-key locks at the high school, middle school and athletic facilities. The cost will be \$45,000, which is in the district's budget.

Superintendent Abe Gott said there are many "master" keys floating around the district, and that the new system the district will use keys that cannot be copied.

The system will also require some changing of some hardware on some of the doors, as well as

gathering keys from faculty and staff, but maintenance should have the new locks in place as quickly as possible, Gott said.

The district expects to receive the new lock system at the end of June.

In his report, Gott said Levi and Whitney Box had resigned to move to Big Lake.

Also, six new employees have been hired. They are: Theresa Hanzik, OMS band director; Olga Mandrano, OMS special education aide; Quinton Odom, district-wide technician; Angela Smrkovsky, OMS special education teacher and Mundo Vargas and Willie Vargas, maintenance.

The board also unanimously approved hiring Katie Parker as a

special education teacher at high school.

The district's student enrollment is at 777, which is same as last year at this time, Gott said.

In maintenance, they have started working on the roof on the apartments on Avenue G and the roof work on the high school library, band hall and woodshop will begin in two weeks.

The group also discussed the severe weather that occurred on May 9.

Gott said he called each campus and informed principals to keep an eye on the weather. Also, each campus has a weather radio and by the time the tornado warning was issued students were in halls and in position, Gott said.

"Some parents were angry that we would not release the kids. I'm letting a kid go when tornado sirens go off," Gott said. "It was a nice exercise for us, but I don't want to do it again."

Gott said the district has applied to the Federal Communications Commission for the school to have its own frequency with hand-held radios, so they can communicate with just school officials and not have to talk over the county frequencies.

The board also unanimously approved an update on a board policy and a local policy.

# Talamantez, Clark plead guilty

A woman who committed arson by burning down the rent house she was living in pled guilty last week in district court.

Janet Brumley Talamantez, 41, pled guilty to arson, a second-degree felony.

Talamantez was sentenced to 10 years of community supervision and is ordered to pay \$9,000 in restitution, according to court documents. She also has to perform 240 hours of community service, a \$60 monthly supervision fee and \$322 in court costs.

The restitution is for the removal of the house that Talamantez set fire to. The house is located at 302 Avenue H.

On Aug. 16, 2005, Talamantez and her husband, Albert Talamantez, apparently had an argument earlier that evening. Albert Talamantez left and when he returned around 10:42 p.m. he found the house to be on fire, said Fire Marshall Steve

Kenley. A gasoline can was found in the living room, Kenley said.

After setting the fire, Janet Talamantez turned herself into the Crockett County Sheriff's Office.

The house is owned by Antonio R. Gomez.

Also entering a guilty plea last week was John Mansell Clark.

Clark, 39, pleaded guilty to burglary of a habitation, a second-degree felony.

Clark was sentenced to 10 years of community supervision, 240 hours of community service, \$60 monthly supervision fee, \$400 court appointed attorney fees if applicable, \$329 court costs and \$76.67 in restitution to Shots #2, Shelton Oil & Gas Company.

Both cases were prosecuted by 112th District Attorney Laurie English and Assistant District Attorney Stephen Smith.

112th District Judge Pedro Gomez Jr. presided over both cases.

Craig Deaton said he voted to house Pre-K through fifth at the intermediate school because that is the newest building in the district.

"If we are going to add on to something, we need to add on to our newest building and get rid of our oldest building," he said.

Bernice Fierro said she doesn't like have Pre-K students in the same building with fifth graders. She said she would rather see the fourth and fifth grades at the middle school.

Fierro also said it would be easier to sell the intermediate campus than the primary because the primary needs so much repair work.

Board member Tom Anderson said the district is lacking in housing, and that the district could convert the property into apartments.

"In my mind our main option was to shrink down to three campuses. I doubt seriously the

intermediate school will ever sell. It will be used as storage or offices, and we have gone back to a four campus situation," said Dennis Clark.

The board will try to sell the intermediate school, said Dwight Childress, board member.

Building a new school with a new kitchen and main cafeteria is one of the best scenarios the district has, said Board Vice President Laurie Hale.

"We sit and hear about the problems at the primary school constantly," Hale said. "The intermediate school is the newest and most efficient. We can leave the intermediate school and we can have a new building that is more energy efficient than the intermediate school. We can walk away from the intermediate school at a point in time and not worry about maintenance."

Wade Richardson said if a

new school is built, one of better quality is needed.

Niemann said the building would last 30-50 years.

"In 30-50 years this county will not be able to afford the building. I find it funny all the kids went to the Heritage Building when the tornado sirens blew. I think our economy should point to something different. We can't afford to build another new school in 30 to 50 years," Richardson said.

Concern was also brought up that if a new school is built at the primary site, where the children would be relocated. The construction would take two summers and one school year.

Superintendent Abe Gott said the previously churches housed students and that room can be made at the intermediate and middle schools.

"We want to minimize the

impact on as many kids as possible," Gott said. "We would figure something out."

Niemann said building a new school would be the hardest plan to implement, while leaving the primary school and moving students to the intermediate would be the easiest.

Gott said the board and the committee also needs to think about other maintenance issues the district has, including an estimated \$215,000 to replace the Heritage Building windows and two buses that need to be replaced.

A separate bond could be called for the maintenance issues or the bond could have several propositions listed, Gott said.

Niemann said his firm would return with options including the top priority maintenance issues.

The next meeting is set for 5:30 p.m. June 7 at the high school library.

Tobar was indicted in February on two counts of obstruction and two counts of unlawful restraint.

According to court documents, the charge of unlawful

restraint has been moved from district court to county court. The charge is a class A misdemeanor, which is punishable up to one year in jail and a fine not to exceed \$4,000.

A motion will be filed for District Attorney Laurie English to continue to prosecute the case.

The grand jury also indicted Tobar's son, Timothy Joe Tobar,

26, on two counts of aggravated assault and one count of intoxicated assault.

Tobar is currently serving his first term as commissioner of Precinct 4.

The camp invites 15 boys and 15 girls from all across Texas. Participants must be of high school age and have an interest in water quality and conservation, and be willing to participate as a team member

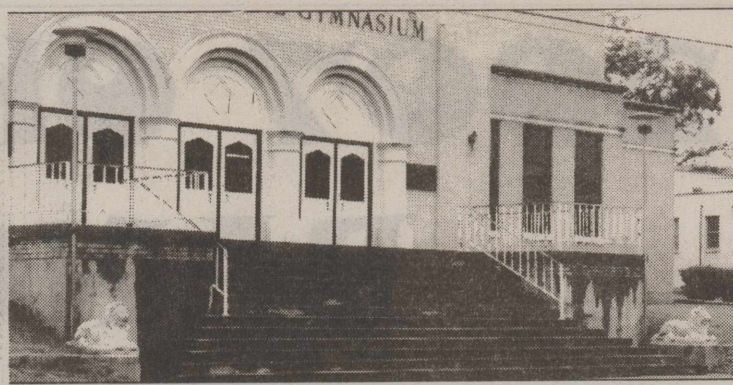
during the week long camp.

## 4-Hers perform well at Boerne

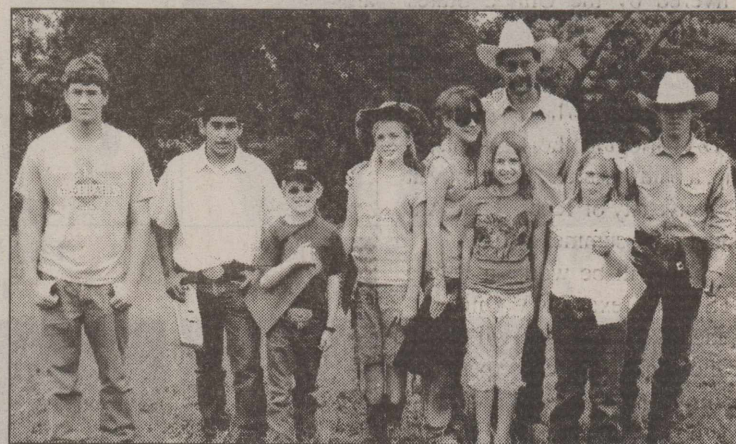

# WOOL: Laughlin allegedly committed mail fraud

Once the money from the fraudulent sales had been transferred and deposited into the Wool Growers retail business bank account, Laughlin would then order the money to be used for regular business expenses of the Wool Growers retail business or would be used by Laughlin in the form of unauthorized additional salary checks and cash, the documents stated.

The documents also state that Laughlin allegedly committed mail fraud by authorizing approximately 34 envelopes from five buyers of wool and mohair that were addressed to "Wool Growers Central Storage" in Ozona. The envelopes contained approximately 34 checks payable to "Wool Growers Central Storage" or "Sanderson Wool Commission" totaling approximately \$758,552.63.

Each of the envelopes, and its contents, were to be sent and delivered by the United States

Postal Service, the documents state.

The mail fraud scheme allegedly took place between Feb. 1, 2002 and May 25, 2006, the documents state.

Laughlin was hired in 1991 as manager of Wool Growers.

Former bookkeeper of Wool Growers, Tonya McGuire Stalcup pled guilty during a May 3 hearing to frauds and swindling and aiding and abetting, court documents stated.

Central Storage Co.

Stalcup is out on bond awaiting sentencing, but is facing a possible prison term of 20 years and a fine to not exceed \$250,000, or a fine not more than twice the amount of the criminally derived property involved in the transaction.

There's also the possibility of an initial term of supervised release of three years, which follows a term of imprisonment, and restitution to the victims or

community.

In the plea agreement, Stalcup agreed that the total loss amount is approximately \$200,000 and that she owes restitution.

Wool Growers filed for bankruptcy in April 2006. A hearing on the bankruptcy reorganization plan was held May 3 in the U.S. Federal Courthouse in San Angelo.

The majority of creditors have filed to approve the plan, but a group called the Wardlaw Creditors filed an objection and voted against the plan.

The Wardlaw Creditors consist of Jack David Wardlaw, Jesse Lem Wardlaw and Warlaw Brothers, which is composed of Jack David Wardlaw III, Mack Miers Wardlaw and William Chase Wardlaw, all of Sonora.

As of press time Monday, U.S. Bankruptcy Judge Robert L. Jones had not issued an opinion, ruling on the plan.

Laramie is a political science major at Texas State University. She grew up in Ozona before moving to San Angelo where she graduated from Central High School.

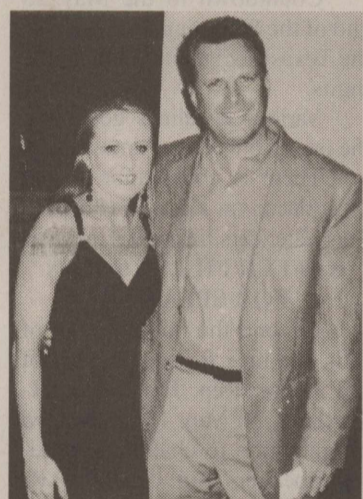
She is the daughter of David and Tammy McWilliams of Ozona and Gerald and Peggy Creel of San Angelo.

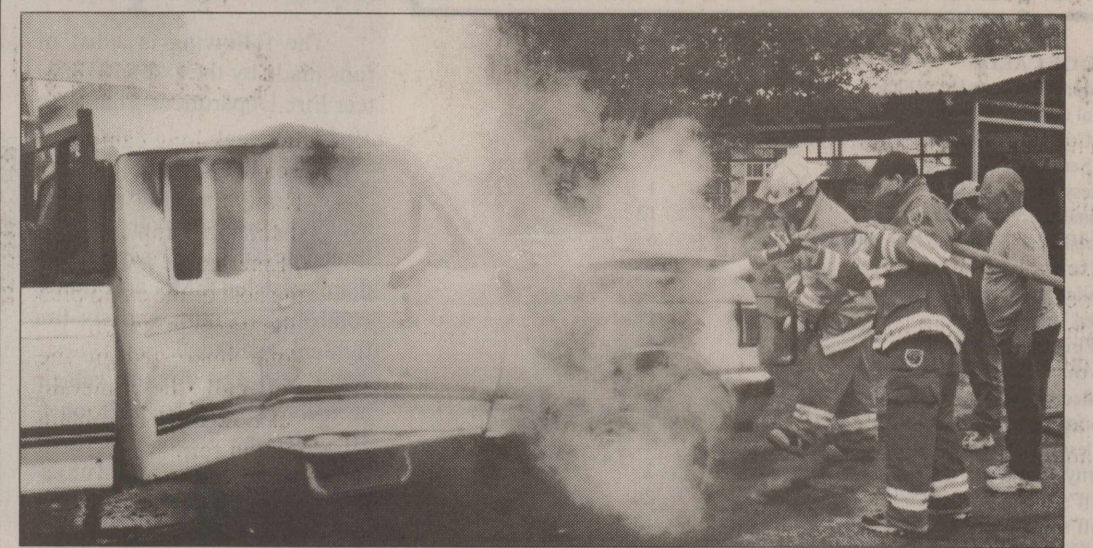

## DPS reminds drivers to be safe Memorial Day weekend

While Texans prepare for the Memorial Day weekend, the Texas Department of Public Safety is asking drivers to do the "in" thing—drive safely.

"We'll have all available troopers out on Texas roadways, looking for folks who are speeding, not wearing seatbelts, and who appear to be driving while intoxicated. Slow down, buckle up and drive sober, so you can have a more enjoyable weekend," said Col. Thomas A. Davis Jr., director of the DPS.

Drivers who are not sober should expect that they will be pulled over; and if they fail field sobriety tests, they will be arrested. Drivers who are intoxicated and have children under the age of 15 in the vehicle face state jail felony charges.

DPS troopers and many other Texas law enforcement agencies are participating in Click It or Ticket, a national campaign aimed at increasing the number of people who use their seatbelts

correctly, every time they get into a vehicle.

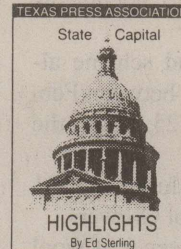
Drivers pulled over for seat-belt violations should expect to receive a ticket.

Pickup trucks will be a particular target for enforcement because they roll over twice as often as passenger cars in fatal crashes. Wearing a safety belt will reduce the risk of dying in a rollover pickup truck crash by up to 80 percent.

Texas law requires every person sitting in the front seat of a vehicle to wear a safety belt. The law also states that all children under 17 must be secured with a safety belt, or in a child safety seat, whether they are sitting in the front or in the back seat. A child less than five years old and less than 36 inches tall must be secured in a child safety seat.

Another nationwide effort designed to reduce fatalities is the C.A.R.E. - Combined Accident Reduction Effort - program. State police officers across the nation participate in C.A.R.E., maximizing enforcement on major interstate highways to reduce fatalities commonly associated with holiday weekends.

## Perry vetoes House version of toll road legislation



AUSTIN - On May 18 Gov. Rick Perry vetoed HB 1892, legislation that would have preserved local control over toll road projects in the

North Texas and Houston regions and placed a two-year moratorium on the governor's massive new toll road plan.

Perry wants a bill that will centralize control through the Texas Department of Transportation. TxDOT would execute his Trans Texas Corridor plan, a statewide matrix of toll road projects to be built and run by Zachry, a San Antonio-based firm, and Cintra, a Spanish company.

In his explanation of the veto, Perry said HB 1892 "jeopardizes billions of dollars of infrastructure investment and invites a potentially significant reduction in federal transportation funding."

"Projects important to fast-growth communities would be placed on hold without alternative financing mechanisms to get them constructed. Even more egregiously, the bill serves to break up the state highway system by permitting local control over state assets," Perry said.

Perry's hopes are now pinned to SB 792, a bill similar to HB 1892 but amended to address highway infrastructure issues in a manner more acceptable to him. The House passed SB 792 with amendments. The Senate did not concur with the House amendments, so the bill will be considered by a conference committee.

The governor has threatened to call a special session if the final version of the bill doesn't suit him.

#### LITTLE TIME LEFT TO DEAL WITH BILLS

Countdown to the May 28 end of the 80th regular session of the Texas Legislature is in single digits.

Various deadlines governing the fate of bills come almost daily.

There is competition to get bills placed on House and Senate floor calendars before it's too late.

#### KEFFER FILES TO RUN FOR SPEAKER

Beyond the bubbling vat of bills is a race for speakership of the House. Rep. Jim Keffer, R-Eastland, on May 15 announced his intention to challenge standing Speaker Tom Craddick, R-Midland, for that high office. Keffer

suggested three terms are enough for anyone to be speaker. Craddick is completing his third term.

But Craddick, 63, made it plain he wants a fourth term, putting to rest any speculation that he feels like he has had enough time on the rollercoaster. His wife approves.

"I have talked to Nadine and I fully intend to run for speaker. The paperwork was already filed last February," Craddick said.

The announcement by Keffer means a long campaign to wage until the 2009 session. And, it is likely Keffer won't be the only House member challenging Craddick. Names that come easily to mind are Reps. Jim Pitts, R-Waxahachie, and Brian McCall, R-Plano.

Pitts and McCall already attempted to unseat Craddick at the beginning of the present session. They could try again.

#### JESSICA'S LAW HEADS TO GOVERNOR

The House and Senate agreed to compromise language on HB 8, "Jessica's Law" legislation enacting new charges and tougher penalties for sexually violent acts against children younger than 14.

The bill, by Rep. Debbie Riddle, R-Houston, will make sexually violent offenders subject to penalties ranging from a 25-year minimum sentence on a first offense to the death penalty for repeat offenses.

Certain offenders also would be denied parole and subjected to GPS monitoring should they ever be released from prison, the author said.

And, HB 8 directs the Texas attorney general's office to support local prosecutors in pedophile cases.

Gov. Perry is expected to sign the bill, which is written to take effect Sept. 1.

In a related matter, Perry already has signed another piece of legislation that requires the Department of Public Safety to collect detailed information on sexual assaults that occur in Texas.

HB 76 by Rep. Eliott Naishtat, D-Austin, and Sen. Judith Zaffirini, D-Laredo, addresses a lack in statewide statistics on sexual assault.

Under their bill, what will be collected is information about the offender, the offender's relationship to the victim, any weapons used and any injuries sustained by the victim.
