



Drug bust arrests plead guilty, receive

Sentences

Arrests that were made during the September 2006 drug bust are being heard in court.

The 112th District Attorney's office has prosecuted and convicted nine of the 21 people that were arrested on Sept. 20,

The following is a list of those that have pled guilty to the court up to this date:

• John Daniel Ramirez Jr., delivery of a controlled substance on three counts on March 19, 2008. Ramirez was sentenced to eight years in the Texas Department of Criminal Justice-Institutional Division for count one, a second-degree felony; two years in the Texas Department of Criminal Justice-State Jail Division for count two, a state jail felony and eight years in the Texas Department of Criminal Justice-Institutional Division for count three, a second-degree felony.

• Mona Lisa Sanchez, delivery of a controlled substance, second-degree felony, on March 19, 2008. Sanchez was sentenced to five years in the Texas Department of Criminal Justice-Institutional Division.

• Ida Perez Tambunga, delivery of a controlled substance, state jail felony, on April 9, 2008. Tambunga was sentenced to 15 months in the Texas Department of Criminal Justice-State Jail Division.

• Judy Ann Sanchez, delivery of a controlled substance on three counts, all state jail felonies, April 8, 2008. Sanchez was sentenced to 15 months in the Texas Department of Criminal Justice-State Jail Division for count one, 15 months in the Texas Department of Criminal Justice-State Jail Division for count two and two years in the Texas Department of Criminal Justice-State Jail Division for count three.

• Yuri Briones Saenz, delivery of a controlled substance, state jail felony, Aug. 20, 2007. Saenz was sentenced to 16 months in the Texas Department of Criminal Justice-State Jail Division.

• Albert E. Ramos Jr., delivery of a controlled substance on two counts, both state jail felonies, July 12, 2007. Ramos was sentenced to 18 months in the Texas Department of Criminal Justice-State Jail Division for count one and 18 months in the Texas Department of Criminal Justice-State Jail Division.

• Ezekiel Rivera, delivery of a controlled substance, seconddegree felony, Dec. 5, 2006. Rivera was sentenced to seven years in the Texas Department of Criminal Justice-Institutional Division.



A park bench in memory of Chief Deputy Fred Fierro will be placed in the Triangle Park.

Crockett County Commissioners approved the installation of the bench during Monday's regular meeting.

The project was presented by Betty Hawthorne and J.R. Kenley who originally suggested placing the bench in the town square park.

County Judge Fred Deaton said that since the Ozona Garden Club is working on improving the Triangle Park, which is located in front of the Village Shopping Center, a bench is needed for that area.

"I never think about that park very much, and it's a very beautiful park," Deaton said. "I think the bench would be beautiful there and that it would be a positive thing for everyone."

Commissioner Frank Tambunga said an area for park memorials is needed and that installing the bench in memory of Fierro would be a good start.

"I'm looking toward the future where other people can also be remembered," Tambunga said. "We've had people ask us about memorials in the past, and we've never come up with a place to put them all."

Hawthorne and Kenely said the bench would be made of granite or marble, and have a back on it for the inscription.

Accounts have been established at Crockett National Bank and Ozona National Bank for anyone wishing to donate to the Chief Deputy Fred Fierro memorial fund.

AUSTIN - State authorities on April 3 entered YFZ Ranch, a 1,700-acre compound located near Eldorado, owned by the Fundamentalist Church of Jesus Christ of Latter Day Saints and under construction since 2004.

Over a period of a few days 416 children and 139 women who resided in the compound were placed in state custody and transported by bus to temporary quarters in San Angelo.

The women reportedly left the compound voluntarily.

Emergency calls made to a local family violence shelter prompted the state to take action.

A caller who identified herself as a 16-year- old mother reported that she had suffered physical and sexual abuse inside of the compound, according to a six-page affidavit filed in Schleicher County.

Family and Protective Services directed the relocation of the YFZ women and children to San Angelo. An estimated 700 workState authorities intervene

UNLICENSED LOCKSMITHS

ARE CAUGHT The Texas Department of Public Safety in late March arrested seven employees of unlicensed locksmith companies and three employees of unlicensed alarm companies in El Paso.

Arrests were made when the individuals offered alarm and locksmith services to undercover officers, the DPS reported on April 8.

"These companies have access to private homes, and the licensing process guarantees that their employees have undergone criminal background checks, are not registered sex offenders and meet basic requirements established by Texas law," said DPS chief, Col. Thomas A. Davis Jr.

CORRIDOR COMMENT PERIOD EXPIRES

On April 18, a 30-day extension of the public comment period for the Texas Department of Transportation's "Interstate-69/Trans-Texas Corridor Tier One Draft Environmental

Impact Statement" expires. TxDOT Executive Director Amadeo Saenz said the agency conducted more than 500 public meetings on the proposed Interstate 69 and Interstate-35 projects.

Citizens voiced resistance to the proposals at many of the public meetings and hearings.



It was such a different environment for a Texas boy where I had grown up faced with hot summers and the possibility of droughts and hurricanes. Shortly after we arrived there we had to start preparing. We had to have numerous items some of which included a two weeks supply of dried food, water, emergency radio, extra clothing, blankets, first aid kit, candles and matches. In the event the sirens went off we had a special place to run to. It had a steel lid and led to an underground tunnel that was our place of refuge in the event of attack. As a teenager living on the northern tip of the main island of Japan, (Honshu) during the Cold War and being only a short distance from Soviet Russia really led to a different way of life. Those events remind me of situations that Christians face in life. Are we prepared for spiritual attacks and what do we do in the event of one? Rest assured we are going to have them. Having our little refuge, (hiding place, Psalm 18:2), getting quiet and praying is the way to withstand any attack, (Psalm 27:1&9, 62:1&2). When the nation of Israel was in great danger and about to be annihilated by the Egyptian army Moses stood before then and told them to trust in God who would deliver them, (Exodus Brother J 14:13&14).
