## Announcement of the Incorporation and Charter OF THE

Bailey County Memorial Park was Chartered under the laws of the State of Texas, receiving charter No. 77616 on November 1, 1954. The chart er is registered and certified by Sec. of State C. E. Fulghom, with capital stock of $\$ 12,000$. Maps and registration are recorded in the Bailey County Clerk's office in Muleshoe.

## GUARANTEE OF PERPETUITY

A trust fund has been set up at Security State Bank in Littlefield guaranting $\$ 7,000$ for each acre in Bailey County Memorial Park. In case of default by the incorporators, the trust fund will be administered by the banks trust officer to insure th perpetual care of the Park. The money in the trust fund is loaned out, drawing interest at all times.

## OFFICER

Officers of the corporation are all members of one family: Hamp McCary is vice-president; Rhenard McCary, his son, is president, and Beatrice McCary is secretary-treasurer. Financial references and inquiries should be directed to either Security State Bank or First National Bank in Littlefield Texas.

Becuse Bailey County Memorial Park will be of great benefit to Bailey County residents, the incorporators feel duty bound to acquaint them with the following facts and background information to prevent misunderstanding

Any person recommended, who is accepted and who is participating in our program will be allowed to recommend three or more families for participation in the program. Representatives at present will not call on persons unless recommended by participants in our program. Recommendations will be taken only from persons who are now participants in the program. The incorporators feel the program to be a sacred one for the people of Bailey County, and can only make one call, and one call only to recommended persons to explain the program. At the present time the incorporators are GIVING plots for the good will of recommended friends and the only charge is :for perpetual care. This perpetual care is good for as long as the American dollar draws interest.

Bailey County Memorial Park is located $31 / 2$ miles from Muleshoe on the south side of Clovis highw ay. It is a par: of tho Southwest quarter of section 33, Block X, W.D. and F. W. Johnson subdivision, with 10 acres dedicated to Garden I of Memorial Park. The land encompasses 25 acres in all.
