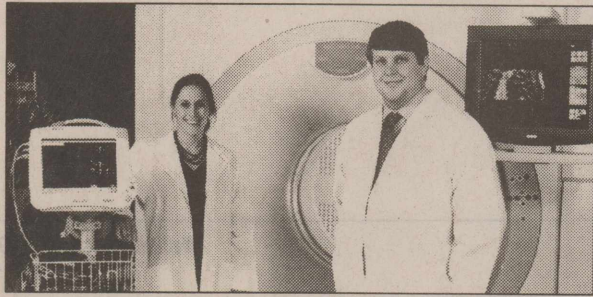
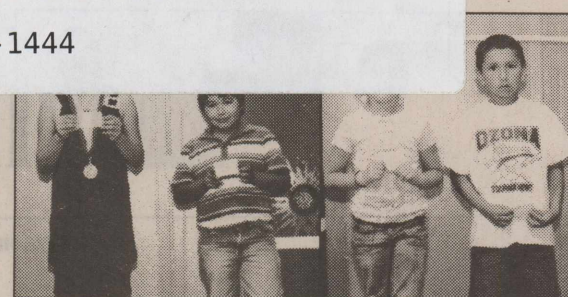

Graduates look to the future

Valedictorian 'voices his opinion' during speech

His Valedictory address started with a quote from Thomas Jefferson and ended with a standing ovation from his fellow classmates.

During the Ozona High School graduation ceremony Friday at Lion Stadium, Ethan Lamour English spoke on how his class's senior year has been compared to a "roller-coaster ride."

English also stated how "decisions made this year have lowered the moral at Ozona High School, but that the Class of 2009 came together to find success at Ozona High School."

"In the last 17 to 18 years, we have learned qualities and developed character. We have learned how to ask questions and how to find the answers," he said. "While we are ended a path in the growth of our education, we are beginning an adventure that is also a test coming in ways unimaginable."

English ended his speech by reminding his classmates to be strong in their faith.

"If you have a relationship with the Lord Jesus Christ,

that can carry you through every situation you face," he said.

He quoted Psalm 27, which states "The Lord is my light and my salvation-whom shall I fear? The Lord is the stronghold of my life-of whom shall I be afraid?"

"Success could mean one more second of endurance, one more phone call or one more try," English said.

After his speech, English made a statement of how the speech he gave was his original Valedictorian speech that was not approved by his principal. He was told that the sentence about the "decisions made this year have lowered moral at Ozona High School" would harm the public's perspective of English.

English said that this speech was his opinion as a student at Ozona High School and that it was the opinion of most, if not all, of his fellow students.

"This is how I felt about myself and my classmates due to the circumstances that fell upon my class," he said. "I was taught to learn the truth, to speak the truth and to do it

with absolute integrity."

After the ceremony, English said that this statement was not an attack on the administration.

"I wanted to voice the perspective of the OHS students

to the community because we tried it with our administration and we felt like we were ignored. I was denied this opportunity, so I took the necessary steps to see that my rights were not denied and the

students' voices were heard," English said.

English also said that while some decisions that were made by local administration did disappoint the students, but there were more actions taken

by individuals not part of the administration, such as the UIL's overreaction to postponing the UIL spring events due to the H1N1 (swine flu) virus.

"Energetic and passionate about preaching God's word" is how Chris Johnson describes his new role as pastor of the First Baptist Church of Ozona.

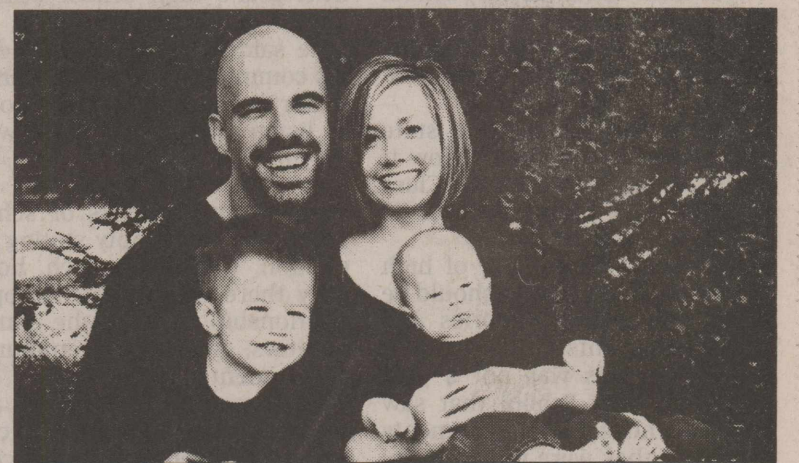

The event will start at 11:30 a.m. and end by 1 p.m.

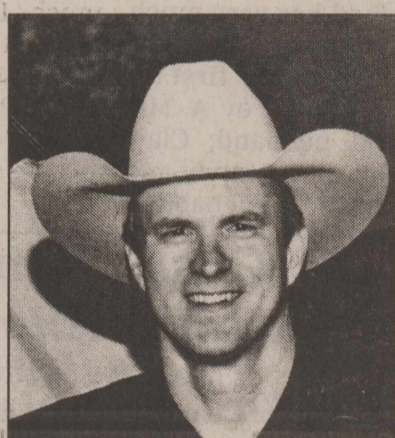
Hilderbran continues to strengthen rural admission to public universities, limit public taking of private property, continues to fight child abuse and fight for taxpayers.

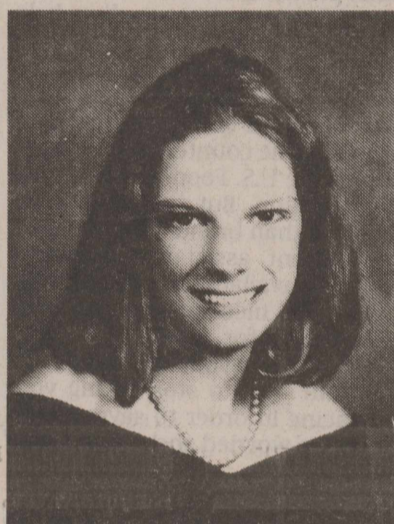

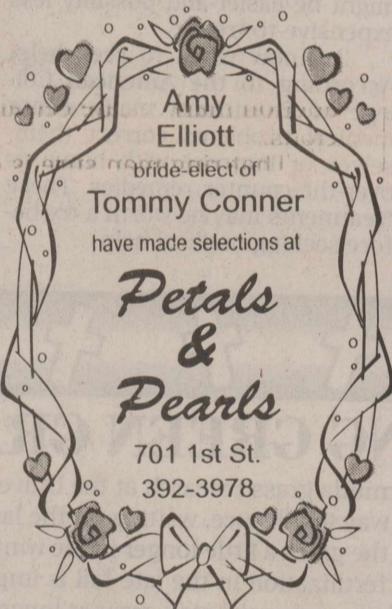

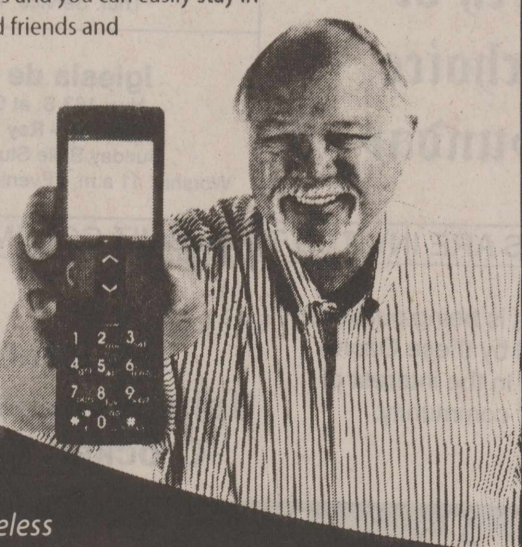

Health care in hard times: four ways to help keep medical costs down

Get active. Balancing your activity level with your caloric consumption will help you maintain a healthy weight.

2. Have a primary care physician. Seeing a doctor regularly can help keep your immunizations up-to-date.

3. Know when to seek help. According to the American College of Physicians, many minor medical problems correct themselves or improve with home or over-the-counter remedies.

Regular appointments also provide opportunities for screening tests. These tests may catch health problems early.

For instance, if you sprain an ankle, many doctors recommend the R.I.C.E. approach to treatment.

Whatever you do, don't decide on your own to stop taking your medicine in order to save money.

Together, you can work to keep costs under control while staying on top of your health.

"Granted, things changed that disappointed students at OHS, but we realize that much of that could not be avoided. On that issue, we want our opinion to be considered by the administrators, but such disappointments were only part of what lowered morale at OHS. The attacks on our school, students and faculty from the community contributed much," English said. "If the administration saw (the speech) as an attack, they were mistaken. However, I refused to be censored regardless, and I was going to voice my opinion." In her welcome speech, Salutatorian Chelsea Michelle Spence spoke of five "important" reasons to go to college. They were: 5. To live in a place with more than one radio station; 4. To live in a town where the biggest stores aren't Dollar General and Town & Country; 3. When you get in trouble, everybody won't be talking about it the next day; 2. The number of students on campus outnumbers the population in your town and 1. There's more to do besides going on "road trips." Spence also spoke on how the teachers at Ozona Schools have touched the students' lives, and what they were taught will help them in the future. "We are all fixing to leave our comfort zones. Whatever path we choose to follow, we know we can come home to Ozona where our support system is," Spence said.

During her speech, Spence also recognized five of her classmates who will be entering the military. They are: English, Benjamin Jason Flores, Matias G. Gandar, Christopher Michael Lara and Jesse Ramos. Quoting Proverbs, Spence ending her speech saying "Trust in the LORD with all your heart, and do not lean on your own understanding. In all your ways acknowledge Him, and He will make your paths straight." Heather Janee Thompson, the third-highest graduate, took her speech from a familiar source. Twenty-three years ago, Thompson's father, Brad Thompson, gave this very speech on the same stage. "Tonight is all about reaching one of our most important goals. As you choose your route, speak to each person you know and meet with kindness. Live each day as if it was your last, show everyone you meet love, joy and understanding and set goals for yourself," she said. "This speech shows that if these things are carried out today, they will go forward to our children and our children's children. The lessons are still the same that we learned from those who came before us." Daniel Craig Anderson, the fourth-highest graduate, spoke on the journey his class has had since they began that first day in kindergarten. "I personally cried the first

couple of weeks because I was scared," he said. Throughout their school years, the Class of 2009 learned how to climb rope during P.E. class at intermediate school, switch classes, get the most fireball candy from Coach Bachman and play sports in middle school and then enter high school full of excitement. "What a ride it has been. Some of us have excelled in academics, some in athletics. We have been through crazy weather from snow to hiding in a flooding basement during a tornado," he said. Anderson also remembered a fellow classmate, Freddy Veloz, who died last year. "He was taken away from us too early," Anderson said. In the end, Anderson congratulated all his fellow seniors. "I hope you all accomplish all of your goals," he said. Diplomas were conferred on 41 students. Giving the invocation was Nathan Kyle Knox, and the benediction was given by Amber Nicole Lewis. The President's Academic Excellence Award winners were recognized. They are English, Spence, Thompson, Lewis, Anderson and Barbara Jean Caperton. Awards were also presented to the 18 honor graduates. 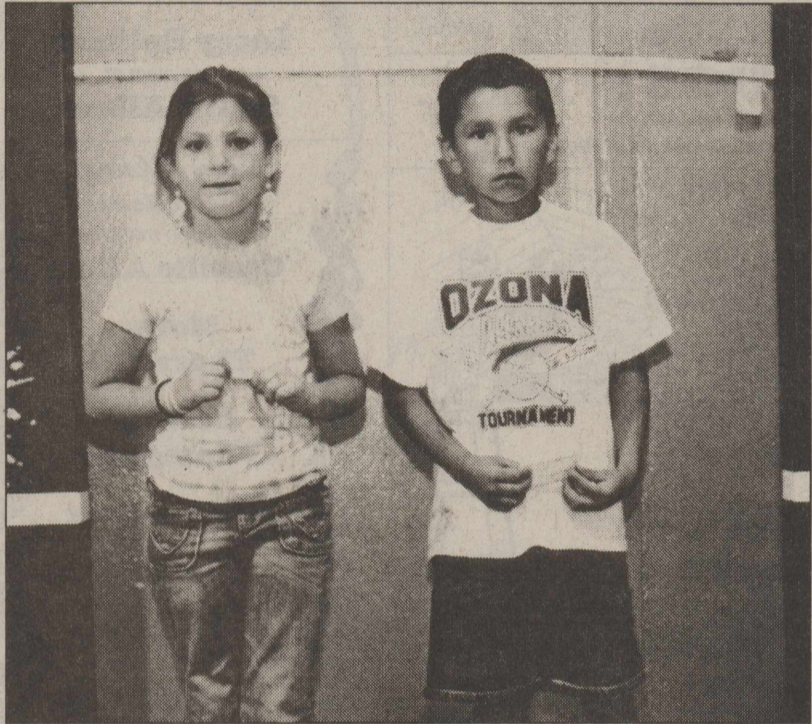

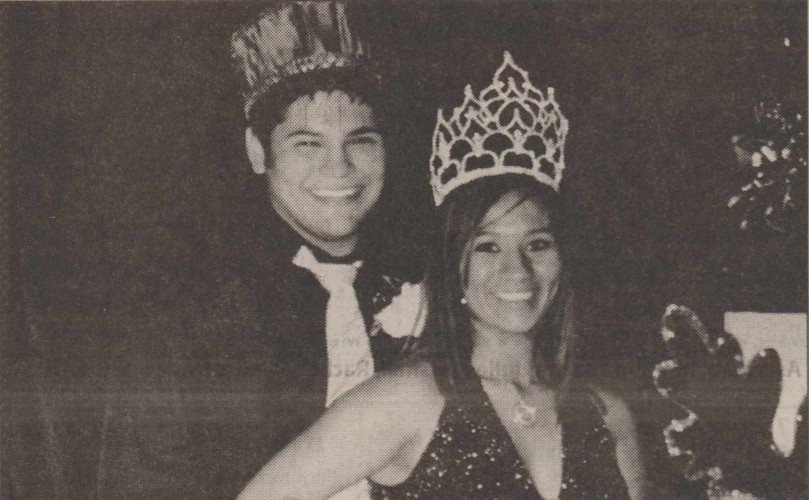

Property Tax Protest and Appeal Procedures

The law gives property owners the right to protest actions concerning their property tax appraisals. You may follow these appeal procedures if you have a concern about:

- the market or appraised value of your property
- the unequal appraisal of your property
- the inclusion of your property on the appraisal roll
- any exemptions that may apply to you
- the qualification for an agricultural or timber appraisal
- the taxable status of your property
- the local governments which should be taxing your property
- the ownership of property
- the change of use of land receiving special appraisal
- any action taken by the chief appraiser, appraisal district or appraisal review board that applies to and adversely affects you.

Review by the Appraisal Review Board
 If you can't resolve your problem informally with the county appraisal district (CAD) staff, you may have your case heard by the appraisal review board (ARB).

The ARB is an independent board of citizens that reviews problems with appraisals or other concerns listed above. It has the power to order the CAD to make the necessary changes to solve problems. If you file a written request for an ARB hearing (called a notice of protest) before the deadline, the ARB will set your case for a hearing. You'll receive written notice of the time, date and place of the hearing. If necessary, you may request a hearing in the evening, Saturday or Sunday. Prior to your hearing, you may ask to review the evidence the CAD will use to uphold their determination. The CAD may ask you for a copy of the evidence you plan to present. The hearing will be informal. You or a designated agent may appear in person to present evidence or you may send notarized evidence for the ARB to review at your hearing. The CAD representative will present evidence about your case. You may cross-examine the CAD representative. The ARB will make its decision based on the evidence presented. The CAD has the burden of establishing the property's value by a preponderance of the evidence presented. In certain protests where the owner has submitted an independent appraisal before the hearing, the chief appraiser has the burden of proving the property's value by clear and convincing evidence. Note: You shouldn't try to contact ARB members outside of the hearing. The law requires ARB members to sign an affidavit saying that they haven't talked about your case before the ARB hears it.

Review by the District Court or an Arbitrator
 After it decides your case, the ARB must send you a copy of its order by certified mail. If you're not satisfied with the decision, you have the right to appeal. If you choose to go to court, you must start the process by filing a petition within 45 days of the date you receive the ARB's order. As an alternative and within the same time period, you may file a request for binding arbitration with the county appraisal district in certain cases.

Tax Payment
 You must pay either the amount of taxes due on the portion of the taxable value not in dispute or the amount of taxes due on the property under the order from which the appeal is taken.

Deadline for Filing Protests with the ARB*

Usual Deadline
 On or before May 31 (or 30 days after a notice of appraised value was mailed to you, whichever is later).

Late protests are allowed if you miss the usual deadline for good cause. Good cause is some reason beyond your control, like a medical emergency. The ARB decides whether you have good cause.

Late protests are due the day before the appraisal review board approves records for the year. Contact your appraisal district for more information.

Special Deadlines
 For change of use (the appraisal district informed you that you are losing agricultural appraisal because you changed the use of your land), the deadline is before the 30th day after the notice of the determination was mailed to you.

For ARB changes (the ARB has informed you of a change that increases your tax liability and the change didn't result from a protest you filed), the deadline is before the 30th day after the notice of the determination was mailed to you.
 (You may insert deadline for protests concerning omitted property if doing so would avoid taxpayer confusion.)

June 26, 2009

If you believe the appraisal district or ARB should have sent you a notice and did not, you may file a protest until the day before taxes become delinquent (usually February 1) or no later than the 125th day after the date you claim you received a tax bill from one or more of the taxing units that tax your property. The ARB decides whether it will hear your case based on evidence about whether a required notice was mailed to you.

* The deadline is postponed to the next business day if it falls on a weekend or holiday.

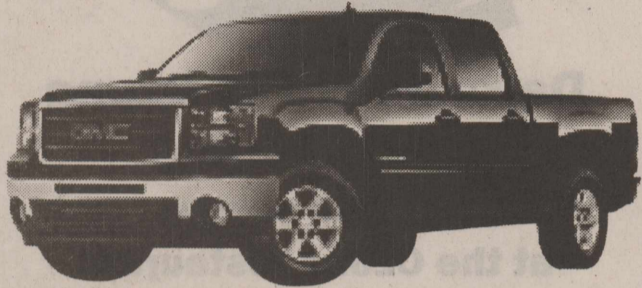

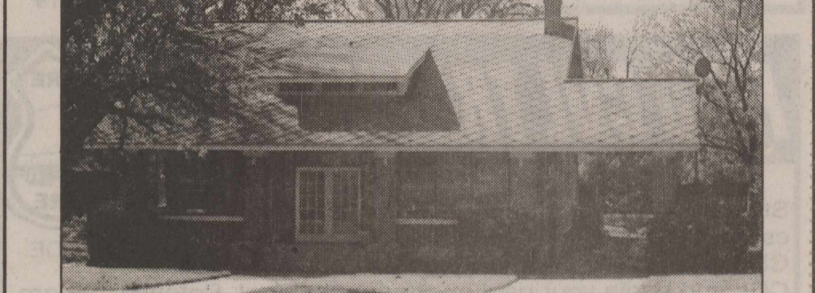
