## Test scores, attendance start off school board meeting

Summer school testing scores and attendance were the start of the CCCSD School Board July 23 regular meeting.

The board was presented with the summer school report on the TAKS and End-of-Course high school retest results.

OHS scores came in below the state average in the areas of Algebra and English.

Board Vice President Orlando DeHoyos asked why the scores were so low.

OHS Counselor Tisha Harrison said attendance is a big issue.

"Students need to be in class. At the beginning of the year there were a lot of absences," Harrison said.

The report stated that right at 50 percent of the students that failed an End-of-Course test had at least 10 absences or more, which

amounts to missing school for at least two weeks.

Superintendent Raul Chavarria said the district's goal is to be at 97 percent on attendance.

The district averaged 95.6 percent at the end of the 2013-2014 year. The state average is 96 percent.

"We need to get on to the parents to get their kids to school," said Roland DeHoyos, board member.

Chavarria said the district plans on being more assertive on filing charges.

Also, the high school has incentives in place for students to be in school, such as long lunch periods and not have to be at tutorials.

Students with a semester average higher than 70 have a chance to be eligible for semester exam exemptions, as long as they do not have any absences, the report stated. Any student with an unexcused absence will not be exempt.

"Incentives for the high school during test week is the

way they are going," Chavarria said.

Attendance was also discussed in the pre-k area. OES has an open enrollment pre-k policy where any student can attend.

Board member Grizz Medina asked if the district can go back to closed pre-k.

"The benefits far out way the attendance problems," Chavarria said about the pre-k. "This is a team effort. It takes parent involvement."

### RESIGNATIONS AND HIRINGS

After meeting in closed session for a short time, the board approved the resignations of Butch Gonzalez, Kayla Graves and Esmi Barrera.

The board also approved the hiring of Christa Carrasco as the new OHS Softball Coach. Carrasco comes to Ozona from TLC Academy and is a graduate from Sul Ross State University. She also coached for Sul Ross State University.

The board also approved the hiring of Lynn Curry and Hiram Carrizalez for OES.

### PEACE OFFICER

Chavarria asked the board, during his report, for permission to explore the possibility and cost of adding a resource, or peace, officer for the district.

The position would be a certified peace officer. Chavarria said he is going to talk to the county about sharing the position and having the person work for the county in the summer.

Chavarria said the principal still has more authority than anyone on the campus, and that the peace officer would report to the principal.

Orlando DeHoyos said the district needs to check with their lawyer to get the exact rules of the officer's duties.

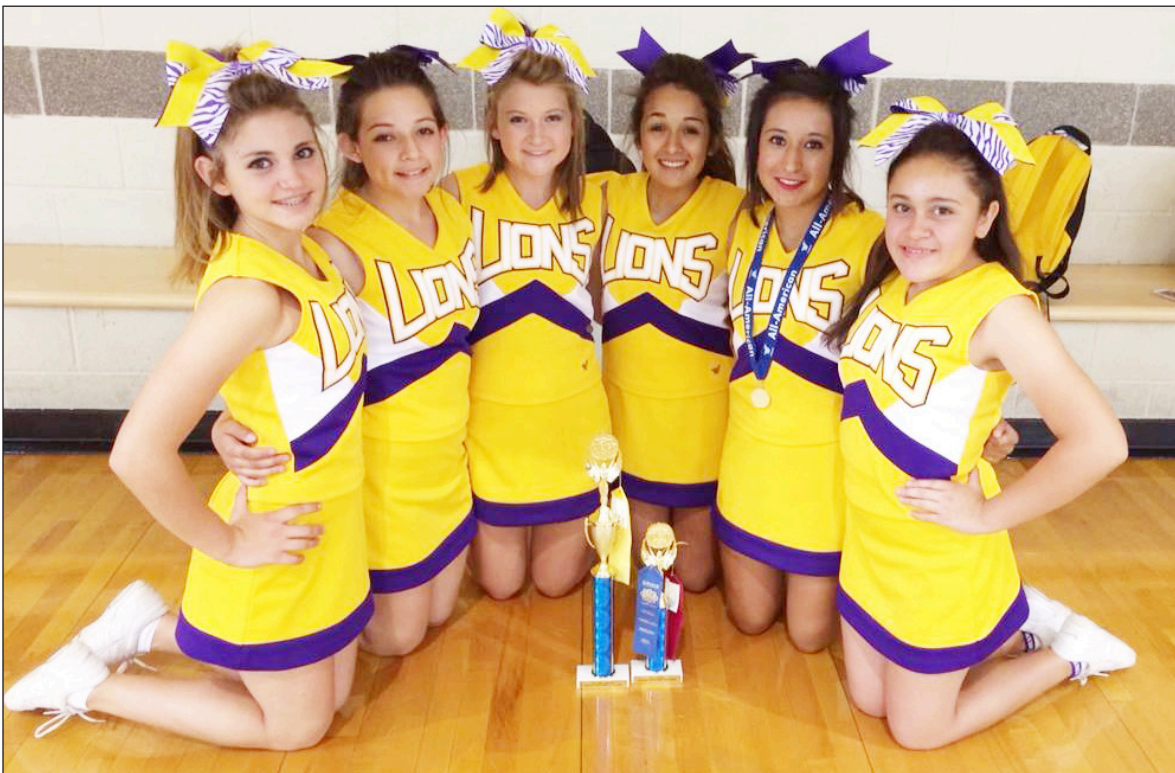

**WORDS OF INSPIRATION**

*God Rejoices*

"For the Son of Man came to seek and to save what was lost." Luke 19:10 (NIV). In Luke 15 Jesus gives us a trilogy of parables about something that was lost being found. He gave us the parable of the lost sheep, the parable of the lost coin and the parable of the lost son. Please notice three things briefly about these three parables. First, notice the great value which is ascribed to each lost

subject. Jesus is the shepherd, the woman and the loving father in these three parables. We are the lost sheep, lost coin and the lost son. The shepherd, the woman

and the loving father highly value and deeply treasure their loved one. In the same vein God so highly valued and deeply treasured the lost souls of mankind that He would give anything to redeem us, even the shed blood of His own Son. Second, notice the diligence with which the lost subjects are sought. The shepherd, the woman and the loving father would go to any lengths to find the lost object or person. Likewise, Jesus went all the way to Calvary and His own death seeking lost souls. He would stop for nothing and give His all to redeem the lost.

Thirdly, notice the great joy and celebration when the lost one is found. In each parable, when the lost was found the neighbors, friends and family were called and they celebrated with great joy. Vs. 10 says, "In the same way, I tell you, there is rejoicing in the presence of the angels of God over one sinner who repents." Who is in the presence of the angels?? God Himself is in the presence of the angels and He is happy, glad and rejoices with great joy when a lost soul is found.

Winston A. Koerth, 77 of Ozona died Wednesday, July 23, 2014 in Ozona. Graveside services were Friday, July 25, 2014 at 11 a.m. in Cedar Hill Cemetery.

Winston was born in Fayette County, Texas October 31, 1936 to Felix and Meta Koerth.

He graduated from Caldwell High School in 1954. In September 1954, he went to work for the Texas Highway Department in Llano County and Burnet County under the Burnet County resident engineer. Don't forget the trade table. We have really had a good time with the trash to treasure table lately. Thank you to the ones that have donated to this table.

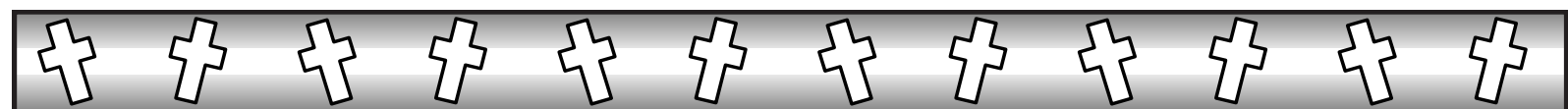

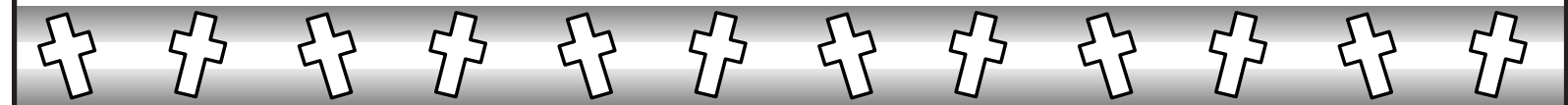

**Texas Tech law school offers taxpayer assistance**

Over four percent of all taxpayers that have an adjusted gross income of less than \$25,000 will be audited each year. This doesn't sound like much but if you are faced with an IRS audit, it can be very stressful.

Low-income taxpayers facing an audit situation, seldom have the resources to hire an attorney to assist with preparing for the audit, but the Texas Tech University School of Law offers assistance. The Low-Income Tax Clinic (LITC) through the Community Outreach Program at the School of Law offers free assistance for anyone facing federal tax issues such as audit appeals, examination notices, collection notices, earned income credit controversies, dependency issues, non-filer issues, identity theft issues and innocent and injured spouse issues.

Nancy Mojica, LITC Community Outreach Coordinator said, "We are glad to offer assistance to any qualified individual in our area. We provide our services free to anyone in over 75 counties in the Panhandle, South Plains, Permian Basin, Rolling Plains of West Texas, Far West Texas and Eastern New Mexico."

The clinic is open all year, Monday through Friday from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. except during Texas Tech University holidays. In addition to the clinic, tax law students are available to provide free educational workshops and short presentations.

"We can teach small or large groups and the workshops can be taught individu-

ally or in a short series," Mojica said. "Our law students are under the supervision of a law professor for handling any cases but we do not prepare returns or handle criminal tax matters."

Taxpayers seeing representation must contact the LITC at 806-742-4312 or toll free at 800-420-8037 for the initial eligibility screening. If you are eligible for free tax assistance, an appointment must be scheduled either in person or by telephone.

When attending your appointment, you must bring any tax bills or letters from the IRS, any letters you have written to the IRS and any federal individual income tax returns that are part of your tax problem. The LITC offers Spanish translators for those whose native language is not English.

Workshops available to be presented include 'Who needs to file and penalties for not timely filing,' 'How IRS collections work,' 'Earned Income Tax Credit pitfalls,' 'Innocent Spouse,' and 'Injured Spouse.' Also, the LITC conducts workshops for high school aged persons who are working for the first time and who will be filing their first tax returns. Educational workshops can be customized according to the needs of the organization sponsoring the workshop.

The LITC is funded by a matching grant from the IRS and it provides legal help to taxpayers with incomes equal to or less than 250 percent of the federal poverty level in disputes with the IRS.

The LITC and its employees and volunteers are not affiliated with the IRS and a tax-

payer's decision to use the LITC will not affect the taxpayer's rights before the IRS.

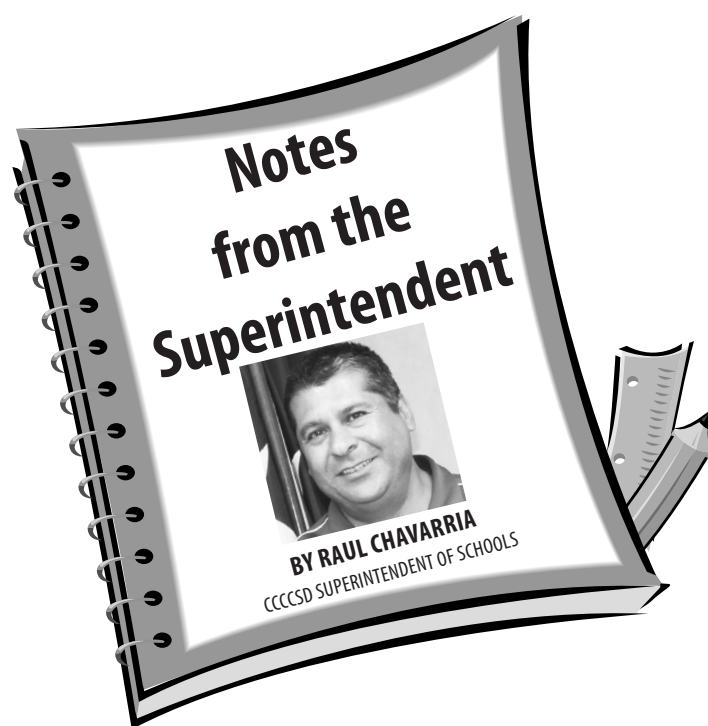

## Sales Tax Holiday is Aug. 8-10

Texas Comptroller Susan Combs reminds shoppers they can save money on certain items priced under \$100 during the state's annual sales tax holiday. This year, the sales tax holiday is scheduled for Friday, Saturday and Sunday, Aug. 8-10.

The law exempts most clothing, footwear, school supplies and backpacks priced under \$100 from sales tax, which could save shoppers about \$8 on every \$100 they spend during the weekend.

"Families gearing up for the new school year will not pay any sales tax for many back-to-school items ranging from pens to blue jeans," Combs said. "When the back-to-school list is long and the money is short, it can be difficult for Texas families. We hope this tax break will help ease that burden."
