The City of Cross Plains will be awarded \$13,176 in homeland security preparedness funding.

"The success of all our homeland security efforts greatly depends on how prepared we are at the local level," Perry said. "Texas already is one of the best prepared states in the nation, and these funds will further assist our communities in facing any challenge, should they be

natural or man-made." The 2004 First Responder Equipment Grants will help communities purchase items such hazmat suits and other equipment to support regional re-

Funds are distributed by the state to local councils of governments (COGs) based on population and the number of jurisdictions covered by the COG. Area risks and vulnerabilities assessments help determine city and county funding.
