The cotton growers should be glad every time a new use for cotton is discovered, for it means just that much greater demand for their pro-Experiments have been conducted recently with cotton roads, laying a heavy strip of duck saturated with asphalt over a dirt road, and rejected. have been particularly successful with lateral roads over which the travel is not heavy. Strangely too, this process is cheaper than laying tion in Lynn County, Texas.

Another experiment has found that cotton can be used instead of silk for insulation of electric wire, as all the objectionable qualities disappeared after the cotton was washed in pure water.

As these experiments continue, there is sure to be an increased demand for cotton, which is the crying need of the South today.

#### PAYS TO FEED GROWING PULLETS

The value of proper feeding of growing pullets has been amply deconstrated to the folks in Blackland community near Roscoe in Nolan county by A. G. Faust. Last summer is eight hundred White Leghorn pul. lets began laying, but eggs were cheap and he did not feel able to feed them a laying mash. But C. H. Clark, the county agent, persuaded him to divide the flock and properly feed one lot of 400 birds. That flock continued laying through the fall and early winter while the other lot went into an early fall molt, stopped laying and were way below full production even by the middle of December. | "Feeding growing pullets right pays in the long run" is Mr. Faust's comment.






