INTERESTING MANILA DAILY PAPER EXHIBITED HERE

C. C. Williams, secretary of the Ta. hoka Chamber of Commerce, exhibited to us this week a copy of a special ssue of the Manila Bulletin published in Manila, Phillipine Islands, dated February 1, 1929, and being No. 25 of Vol. 73 of this newspaper; which means that the paper was established more than 73 years ago. This special edition contained 76 pages and had the general appearance of any big American daily newspaper. Its pages, however, are filled with 'n'eresting informaton about the

Phillipine Islands. From its pages we learn that the Phillipine Archipelago contains 7,038 islands, that the land area amounts to 114,400 square miles, considerably less than half the area of Texas, hat 94 per cent of the area is contained in the eleven largest islands, that only 2,441 of the islands are named while 6,637 of them have an area, of less than one square mile each, that 30 of them have an area of over 100 square miles each, these being the only important ones.

We also learn that the total railway mileage in the islands is 792, and that motor busses and trucks do a thriving business.

They have picture shows, beauty parlors, and discussions of Prohibition. In fact, the Islands seem to have become largely Americanized, even in the respect that th natives desire independence and are rather bitter, according to Mr. Williams, against America because complete independence has not been accorded




