





PROHIBITION KILLING

The newspapers are being in ed upon by the news-gathering cies which are reporting the boo gers' story of killings by probib officers, and carefully phrasing "stories" for propaganda effect. the Congressional Record of Jun 1929, is a complete list of all p bition officers killed and all per killed by them, with a detailed count of the facts in the case office has made a careful anal of that report. The news "stor have made the public believe these killings were all of "inne citizens." In reporting what S tor Brookhart said upon the Se floor recently one agency stated he was defending the killings of innocent persons."

The following fac:s taken from a Congressional Record referred to we show how "innocent" they were: the 155 killed, 55 were shooting the Federal officers when the officers began shooting, 10 others agaged in shooting with the officers, 32 others pulled their guns fix but the officers were better shots, others made attempts upon the live of the officer with other instrument than guns. Most of the others we endeavoring to escape. In 149 cas of the 155 the "innocent citizen was known to be a bootlegger."

Among the six innocent parti killed, one was a boy who was arour the still when it was being raids who was not seen-till after the figwas over, and then found wound 200 yards away. Another, when the officers were chasing a bootlegge suddenly stepped out from behind truck in front of the officer's car The officers had no time to stop be fore striking him. The third car was not killed by a federal officer but by a man who wos piloting th officers to a still and who ran in another car and killed its driver. H received a prison sentence of from one year to life. A man and his daughter were killed in a boat sion and another was killed as h handed a gun to his confederate, be lieved to be for the purpose of kill ing the officer.

In 65 cases of the above killings the Grand Juries, after hearing th evidence, refused to indict the off cers. In 59 instances the officer were indicted but acquitted on trial As indication of how unfairly we have treated the prohibition officers of the four convictions had, one of them was being shot at by the bootleggers before he returned the fire and yet he received a three year sentence for killing the bootlegger in self defense. No bootlegger in America would hove been convicted under such circumstances. In num erous instances where the officers were killed by the most outrageou methods on the part of the bootleg gers, the bootleggers have gone scot-free as was the case at El Paso. The fact is, we are so unfair to our officers that there is not a law upon the Federal statutes by which a man can be tried for murdering a Federal officer.

Will those who are howling about these bootleggers being killed in open defiance of our laws, permit me to call their attention to the fact that 55 of our Federal officers have been murdered by the bootleggers and several hundred of our state officers have been murdered. These 155 citizens, with six possible exceptions, were all guilty of defying the laws of their country. These officers were all innocent citizens ond died in the line of duty just as much as did any American soldier who died upon the battle field of France.

As President Hoover said recently, the outlawed liquor traffic is at war with our government. And he has repeatedly called upon America citizens to show their loyalty to their government in this crisis. We have nothing against the citizens of Ger many, but when their government was at war with ours, we much preferred seeing her soldiers fall, the to seeing our own soldiers fall in battle. In this war between the outlaw ed liquor traffic and our govern we much prefer seeing the enemies of our government fall than to a our own faithful officers die in bat n behalf of our country's honor, as we believe every loyal American ci

Because Hoover was elected as dry and is honestly trying to enforce the law, the outlawed liquor traffin doing its best to discredit both prohibition and Hoover's administration. This is the reason that our papers are filled with these gross min-representations concerning the killings of "innocent citizens."
