SCHOOL TRUSTEE ELECTION

GROUND BEING BROKEN FOR TECH DORMITORIES

Lubbock, March 14.—Ground has been broken in actual construction work of the two Texas Technological College Dormitories which are to cost \$650,000, according to President Bradford Knapp.

The general contract for the structures is \$440,765, and has been awarded to the Bellows Construction Co. of Oklahoma City. Four other contracts, plumbing to A. Kahn Plumbing Co., Dallas, \$14,910; heating to Young and Pratt, Lubbock and Austin, \$36,745; electric wiring, Eugene Ash Electric Co., Fort Worth, \$24,191.50; and refrigeration to Baker Ice Machine Co., Fort Worth, \$8,500.

The two structures will be built of brick and concrete in the shape of the letter "E". The girls' dormitory will have the long side facing north, and will be located slightly south and between the present home economics building and the home management house.

The boys' dormitory will be across the drive, facing the other structure. "It is hoped," Dr. Knapp said, "that they will be ready for occupation by October 1."
