# Only 900 Votes Cast In County **General Election**

Republicans may sweep the nation but Lynn county remains almost solidly Democratic.

In the ten voting boxes which had been tabulated Wednesday night, Murray C. Sells, Republican candidate for the United States Senate, received only 19 votes against a total of 613 for the Democratic incumbent, Tom Connally, and Eugene Nolte Jr., Republican candidate for governor, had received 20 votes against 612 for his Democratic lopponent, Beauford Jester. In nine boxes reporting, Mohler Temple rolled up a total of 16 votes for Congress against 574 citizen is urged to aid the drive by for George Mahon, Democrat.

Two of the proposed constitutional amendments were approved by the people of Lynn county by Many Will Close heavy majorities, but the social security amendment for the benefit of state and county employees seems to have failed to receive a majority vote in this county.

The ten boxes tabulated give the Tarleton College amendment a vote of 385 for and 159 against; the state and county employees amendment received a vote of 228 for, 283 against; the gasoline-road-tax amendment, 402 for and 130 a gainst.

The ten boxes tabulated are South Tahoka, North Tahoka, O'-Donnell, Draw, Three Lakes, Grassland, Garnolia, West Point, Newmoore, and Dixie.

Boxes which had not reported were Wilson, New Home, Gordon Morgan, and Lakeview.

It will be noted that in the ten boxes tabulated only 632 votes were States senator. Both bad weather and lack of interest contributed to the smallness of the vote. Had the weather been favorable, however, the vote probably would have exceeded 1,500.

The two boxes in Tahoka polled a combined vote of 302, 120 in South Tahoka and 182 in North Tahoka,

In O'Donnell, 122 votes were cast 71 at Draw, 42 at Grassland, 36 at Dixie, 34 at Newmoore, 14 at West Point, 14 at Garnelia, and only 5 at Three Lakes.

# Crop Gets Added Time As Cold Spell Passes By

A large portion of Lynn county's feed crop barely missed disaster this week when the temperature dropped down just a bit below the freezing point, leaving a white coat of first Wednesday morning on roofs and car-tops. The mercury showed a low temperature of 30. It had dropped to a low of 33 on Tuesday morning.

Two degrees below the freezing point is rarely ever very injurious to growing crops, and especially when there is an abundance of national chairman for the the 1946 moisture in the air and on every growing thing.

This frost followed two days of inch. The skies cleared during the early morning hours Wednesday, pessibly soon after midnight, and the temperature dropped to the lowest point reached this season, but the grass and all plant life were heavily covered with dew and with the mist that was still falling in the early hours of the night. after a prolonged churning period may be traced to several causes. One main cause of the trouble 'is that the cow is too far advanced in the period of lactation, and this can be partially remedied by adding to the churning some cream from a cow that is early in the fresh

Cow feed that produces hard fat is another cause of the trouble. Such feeds are cotton seed meal and timothy hay. More silage and other "juicy" feeds will help to evercome the condition.

Churning conditions can also result in failure to obtain butter, says Miss Martin, The cream may be too thin, too rich, too sweet or the churning temperature too low. If cream contains over 30 percent butter fat, it is probably too rich for satisfactory churning. It is also sometimes necessary to raise the churning temperature to 65 or 70 degrees Fahrenheit to get butter. The churn shouldn't be too full, either, Miss Martin says. It is hard to get enough concussion to make butter in a churn that is over one-

Sterilizing all utensils and generally producing the milk and cream under sanitary conditions is another measure that prevents the ropy fermentation of the cream that causes difficult churning
