For Frozen Fruits Properly prepared, frozen frult a tasty topping for ice creams and sherbets. But without special prep
aration, fruits suffer radical chen in color, favor and appearance.
After washing the fruit carefully, prepare it for parkeng truit carefully,
slicing. Berries may betting or frozen
whe slicing. Berries may be frozen
whole or sliced. The fruit should
then be packed in try sumar syrup, or \& sym
and corn syru If the dry pack is used, mix three
parts of fruit with shaking the container after the fruit
is packed to be is covered with sugare. By the time
freezing starts, the sugar will be dissolved.
When you use the sugar syrup pack, prepare and pack the fruil
and then cover it with a sugar syrup solution, allowing from a half inc
to an inch head space in the con-
thers to an inch head space in
tainers to permit expansion.
