**TAHOKA BROTHERHOOD RAISES FUNDS**

At the meeting of the Tahoka Baptist Brotherhood Monday night, members contributed \$105.00 to the funds being raised by the Baptists of District Nine for the construction of a swimming pool on the South Plains Assembly grounds seven miles south of Floydada. Two or three men, however, contributed the major portion of this amount. About \$45.00 had been contributed at the Church Service Sunday morning.

The latest estimate given out was that about \$12,000 would be required to build the structure. A considerable portion of this fund has already been raised. The Brotherhoods of the eighteen or twenty counties in the district have undertaken to raise the money through the churches or the various Brotherhood Associations. Much more will be expected from Tahoka.

#### THOMASES VISIT OTHER HAWAIIAN ISLANDS

The News received another letter last week-end from W. O. Thomas, who, with his wife, is visiting the Hawaiian Islands. There are eight of these islands and possibly other tiny ones.

The principal city, Honolulu, is situated on Oahu, and that is where the Thomases have spent most of their time, but they have taken side trips to others of the group. Hawaii is the largest of the entire group with an area of more than 4,000 square miles, with Hilo as its largest city. Although the area is less than that of five ordinary South Plains counties, it has two mountain peaks that tower more than 13,000 feet above sea level, one of them being 13,680 feet high and the other 13,825 feet. Mr. Thomas enclosed a map of this island showing all these facts. Mr. Thomas writes very briefly. Here is his latest letter, dated April 13:

"We went by plane yesterday to Hilo (Hawaii) which is, as you know, the largest island of the Hawaiian group. Drove out to the volcano house and around several craters, none of which are very active at present.

"They raise lots of sugar cane and orchids; have one ranch, Parker, which they claim to be the largest in the world, but we did not take time to go to this ranch. However, I doubt if it is as large as the King ranch in South Texas.

"On our way over we flew over the island which has the leprosy colony. This island is called the Molokai. We also saw some of Lanai and Maui. Be home soon. — W. O. Thomas.

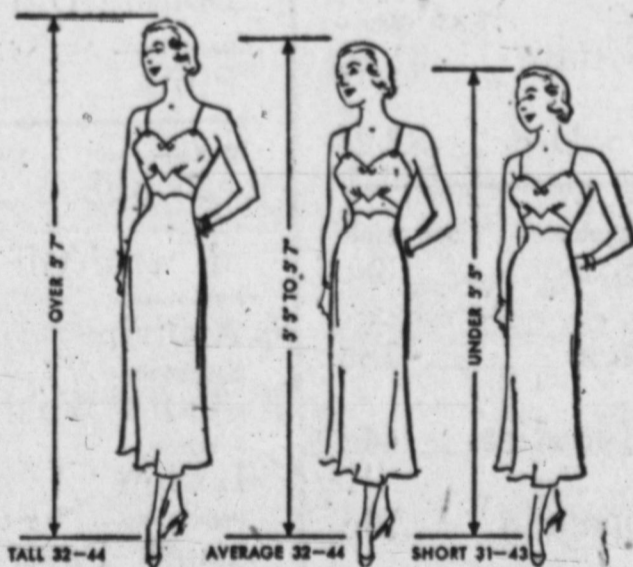

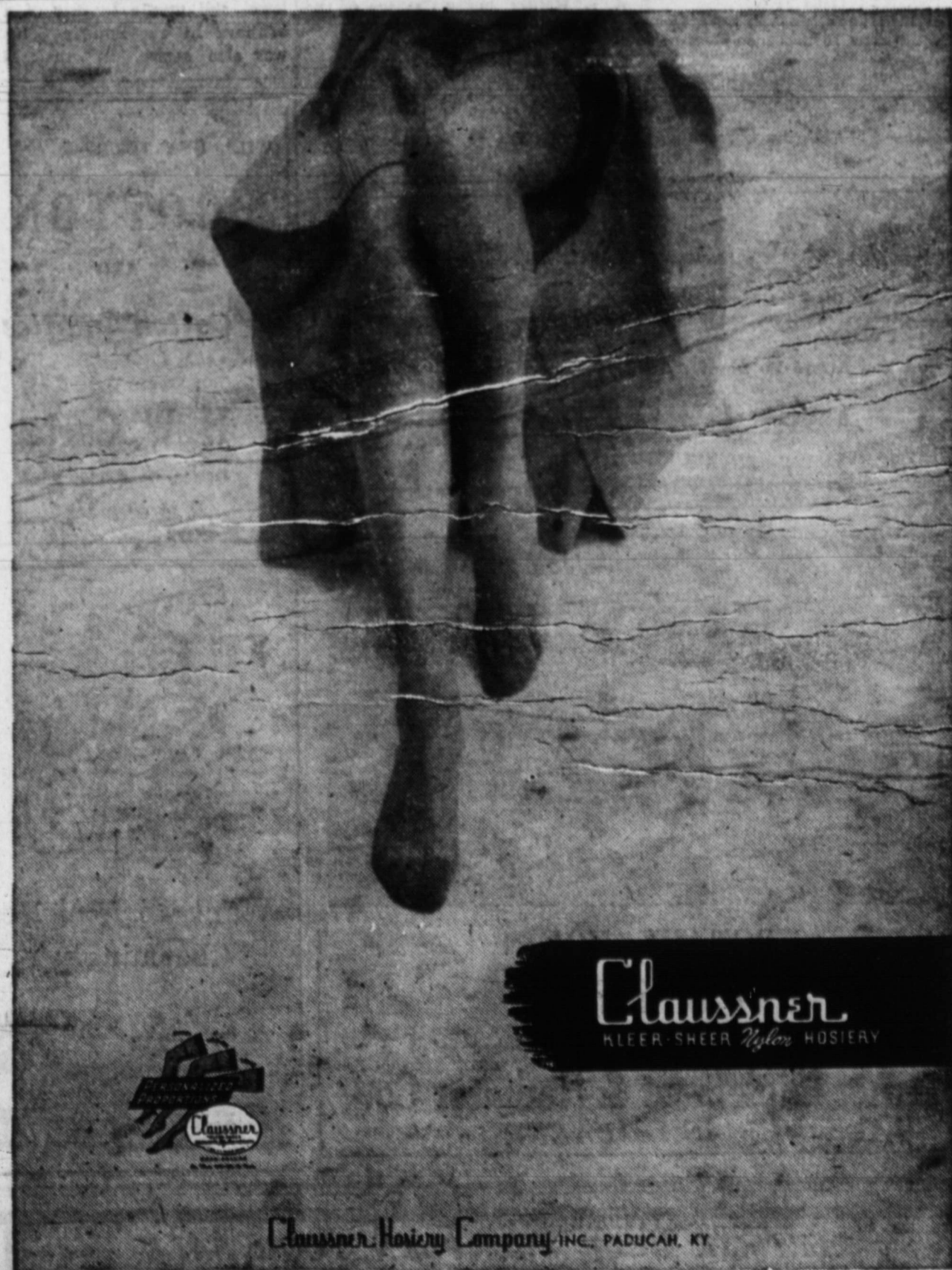

### Earl Curtis Kills

the mouth made evidently by the discharge of a shot-gun while she was engaged in preparing supper. The body of Curtis was lying face down with the head resting against the back door frame, a gaping wound in the skull through which a portion of the brain had been blown out. Officers declare that it was a gruesome sight.

Sheriff Clem and the other officers theorized that Curtis had first shot his wife with the 12-gauge shot gun lying near by and had then turned the gun upon himself.

Justice of the Peace P. D. Server rendered a verdict of homicide and suicide committed by Curtis.

This was the third tragedy that had come in the Curtis family.

A few years ago, one of his sons killed himself in the same room with the same gun that Mr. Curtis used.

Curtis's mother is now a mental patient in a state hospital, it is said.

Mr. Curtis himself had become addicted to the use of intoxicating liquor on occasion, it is further reported, and Justice of the Peace P. D. Server, who held the inquest, got the information that upon returning home without his pick-up he

explained that he had sold it, but he had no money except a little pocket change. One theory is that this circumstance brought on the trouble. Some think that he suddenly became mentally unbalanced. Whatever the cause, it was a gruesome tragedy.

Separate funeral services were conducted Monday.

Mrs. Curtis was an active member of the Methodist Church, and was highly respected. Mr. Curtis was also well thought of.

Curtis was manager last year of the Farmers Co-op Gin at Ackerydown the Big Spring road southeast of Lamesa. He had worked at other times for the O'Donnell Farmers Co-op gin and for the Wells Co-op gin northwest of O'Donnell. His survivors include one son, Raymond K. Curtis of Wink, his mother, Mrs. B. G. Flatt of O'Donnell; and eight brothers, Lon of Big Spring, Herman of Lamesa, Ennis of Los Angeles, Clarence of Wink, Bynum of Plains, J. B. of Manzoia, Colo., Garland of Grand Prairie, and J. W. of Kermit; and one grand-child.

Mrs. Curtis's survivors include her mother, Mrs. Alice Robinson of Waco; eight sisters, Mrs. Marvin Herman of O'Donnell, Mrs. M. D. Minix of Waco, Mrs. Joe Lee of Beaumont, Mrs. Charley Brown of

West, Mrs. Roy Campbell of Waco, Mrs. Wallace Tyler of Waco, Mrs. David Brock of Waco, and Mrs. Ewal Dugst of Winnie; three brothers, Raymond, Robinson of Moron, Henry Robinson of Waco, and Elvin Robinson of Tulla.

### Neal Stanley Dies

Big Spring and Tahoka. In addition to the large delegation of Tahoka Masons taking part in the ceremonies, Mr. Stanley's Sunday School class of boys was present in a body and sat together in the services. Many other Tahoka friends were also present, as were also many Big Spring friends. In fact the audience overflowed the auditorium and galleries and some could find seats only in adjoining Sunday School rooms.

Mr. Stanley's injuries consisted mainly of injuries to the left leg, although no bones were broken. The flesh and arterial injuries were so severe, however, that physicians and surgeons decided that an amputation of the leg was imperative. The amputation was performed on Saturday, April 9, but it was still impossible to save his life. Mr. Stanley dying nearly a week later, April 15.

Mr. Stanley had been a resident of Tahoka for nearly three years, having purchased the W. M. Harris Funeral Home here in July, 1946.

Earl O'Neal Stanley, better known here simply as Neal Stanley, was born in Baird on December 11, 1915, and was therefore 33 years old at his last birthday. He graduated from the Baird high school, attended the University of Texas, and in 1939 graduated from the Dallas School of Embalming with the highest rating attained by a student in that institution. He was also president of his class there.

Later, he was associated for some time with the Elberley Funeral Home in Big Spring and was an active member of the Big Spring Lions Club and took much interest in civic affairs. For a short time before coming to Tahoka he was with the Vautrain Funeral Home in San Angelo.

Upon coming to Tahoka, he quickly won popularity because of his genial disposition and his interest in the civic and religious affairs of the town and community. He had been a member of the Methodist Church since boyhood, served as a steward in the Church here, and was a teacher of a class of boys in the Sunday School. He was also active in the Masonic

Lodge and the Robby Club, and at the time of his death was president of the Tahoka Chamber of Commerce.

On July 2, 1939, he was married to Joyce Terry, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. J. L. Terry of Big Spring, and three children were born to them, Terry O'Neal, 8, Chere Jan, 5, and John Patrick, 1, all of whom survive. Mrs. Stanley has greatly assisted him in his work here and is likewise very popular.

Others survivors are his parents, Mr. and Mrs. Frank Stanley of Carlsbad, New Mexico; one sister, Mrs. Eunalie Everett of Big Spring; three brothers, Frank Stanley Jr. of Carlsbad, N. M., Tommy Stanley of Baird, and Bobby Stanley of Tahoka, together with numbers of other relatives.

Bobby has been associated with him here for some time in the operation of the funeral home and has

been a valuable aid. Mr. Stanley will be greatly missed in Tahoka.

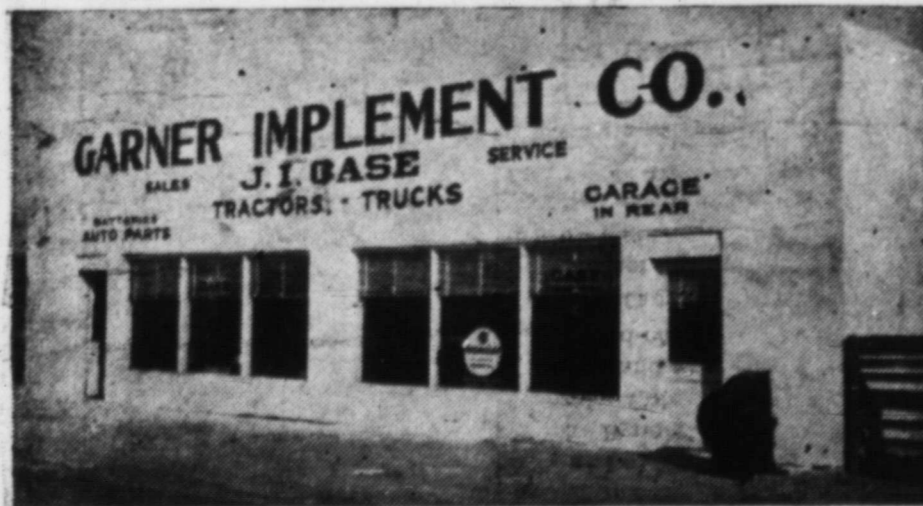

The chief purpose of these Press Associations is not primarily to promote the interests of the individual members but to cultivate friendship and fellowship among them and to promote the interests of the respective sections of the state in which they are organized.

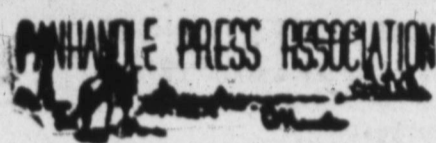

**THE LIQUOR SERPENT RAISES HIS HEAD**

The commissioners' court of Crosby county has ordered an election to be held in that county on Saturday, May 7, to determine whether or not the sale of beer shall be legalized. If the proposition should carry beer containing not more than four percent of alcohol could be legally sold. The petitions asking for the election contained 402 names. There are 2,003 qualified voters in the county, it is estimated, probably more than that.

Those who have promoted the election claim to have high hopes of winning. They are putting up the stale plea that they are merely seeking to eliminate "bootleggers" and to bring about "regulation" of the traffic in liquor, professing to believe that legalization will reduce the amount of liquor sold and drunk in the county.

They are also making the argument to the business men of the county that the legalized sale of beer will increase business. The Falls Banner, one of the few newspapers on the South Plains that openly favors the legalization of beer, stated last week that "The Banner is receiving telephone calls and personal visits from persons outside the county who desire to purchase real estate and business property here. The Avalanche Journal reported yesterday that they are receiving similar calls, both local and long distance, from people who are under the impression that the election has already been held and the issue approved.

These calls and inquiries, no doubt, come from persons who desire to open up beer joints in the county if the proposition carries. And if by any hook or crook it should carry, we predict that beer joints would spring up like Johnson grass all over the county. The proprietors would not only expect to enjoy an ever-increasing patronage from the old sets and the young men and the young women and the boys and the girls of Crosby county but they would also expect to reap rich harvests from the boozers and prospective boozers of Lubbock, which is legally dry. Crosby county's beer joints and cafes doubtless would experience a great boost in business, but so also would the number of car wrecks on the highways and human wrecks on the streets and home wrecks throughout the county also greatly increase.

We hope and predict that the good people of Crosby county will defeat the proposal by a crushing vote, not only for the benefit of the people of that county but also for the benefit of the people of other South Plains counties, for if beer should win over there, a move

for beer elections in Lynn county and other near-by counties would doubtless be started at once. The Banner says that opponents of alcoholic beverages are girding for battle, that trained campaigners from state headquarters of the Woman's Christian Temperance Union are expected to campaign the county, and that local churches have indicated that an organized fight will be made. Whether the W. C. T. U. sends any "trained campaigners" or not, we hope that the people of Crosby county will get up in arms and crush this liquor devil.

Of all the silly stunts that we have ever seen pulled for publicity purposes that story about the little 11-year-old girl kissing the broken statuette of St. Ann and bringing tears to the eyes of the plaster image just about takes the cake. And the silliest thing about it was the way thousands of supposedly intelligent people flocked to the home of the little girl to see the miracle. And many of them including one or two newspaper men declared that they saw the tears form in the statuette's eyes and roll down the cheeks. A priest who was contacted for a comment stated that he could not explain it but that such miracles sometimes happen. We don't know just exactly who Saint Ann was but of course she was some good woman that the Pope had Sainted after her death. And it will be noted that this "miracle" happened just at Easter time, and the Catholics got a lot of publicity out of it. How gullible those Syracuse folks must be. And Syracuse is a way up North too, where the folks are supposed to be more intelligent and cultured than we folks down here in the South. If folks down here in Tahoka could be taken in by such crude stunts as that, believe we would move on to the Fiji Islands.

What most of it consists of is pictures of some knobby kneed girls in bathing suits, standing on top of automobiles, trucks, or holding out a cigarette, a can of oil or a pair of socks. The pictures were taken in Keokuk or at the beach at Cuckoo Kee and she is the maid

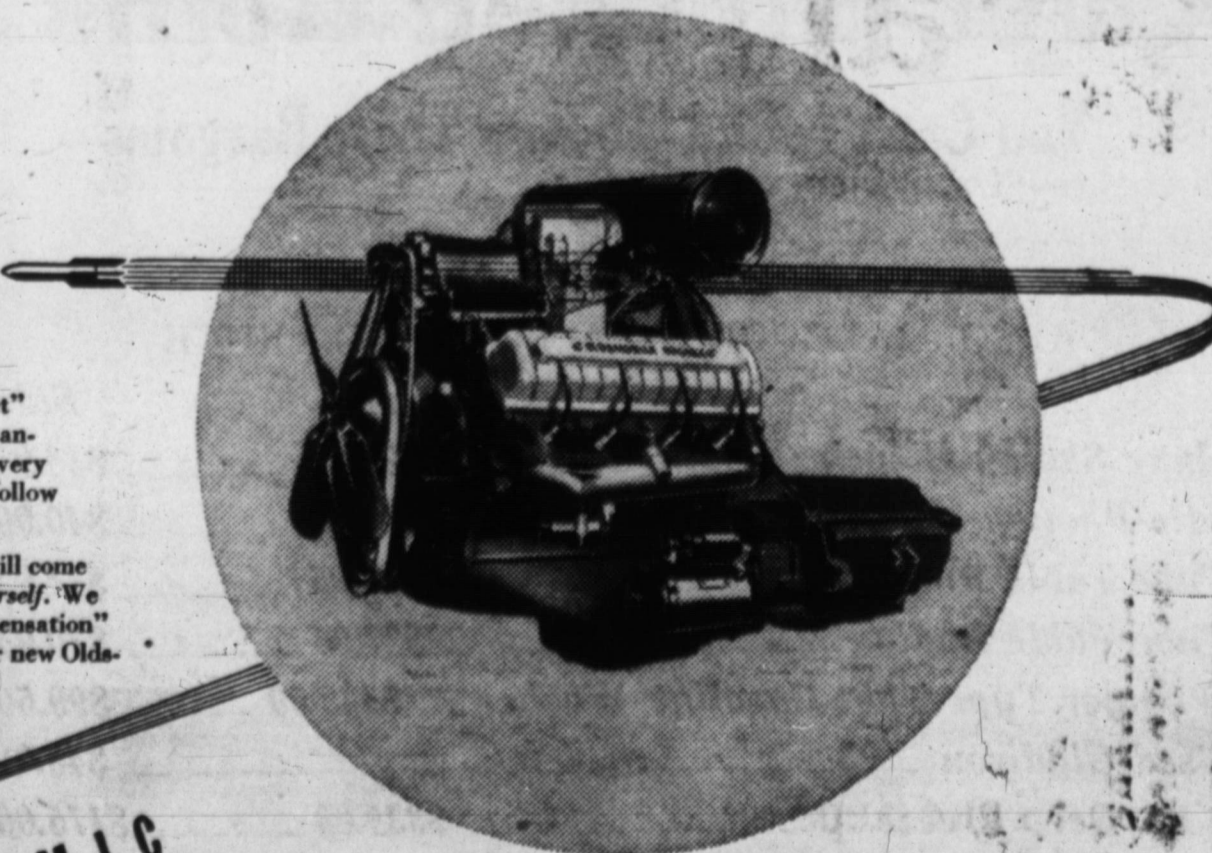

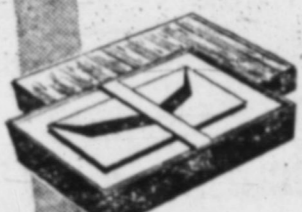

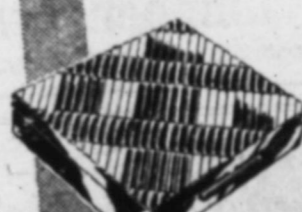
