M First Federal in 1959 increased in assets by $\$ 3,527,237.41$, or 6.36 per cent, total assets climbing from $\$ 21,557,012$ at the beginning of the year to $\$ 25,084,249.86$ on December 31,1959 . his highly significant gain was largely due to a vastly increased flow of savers and home borrowers to our door. Such widespread use of our thrift and home financing services is gratifying since it indicates a feeling of confidence in our nstitution on the part of the people of Clovis and its trade area. For this confidence, we are most grateful.

The number of new savers who opened accounts with us was particularly impressive. In 1959 a total of 1597 opened new savings accounts, boosting our saver ranks to a total of 7941.
