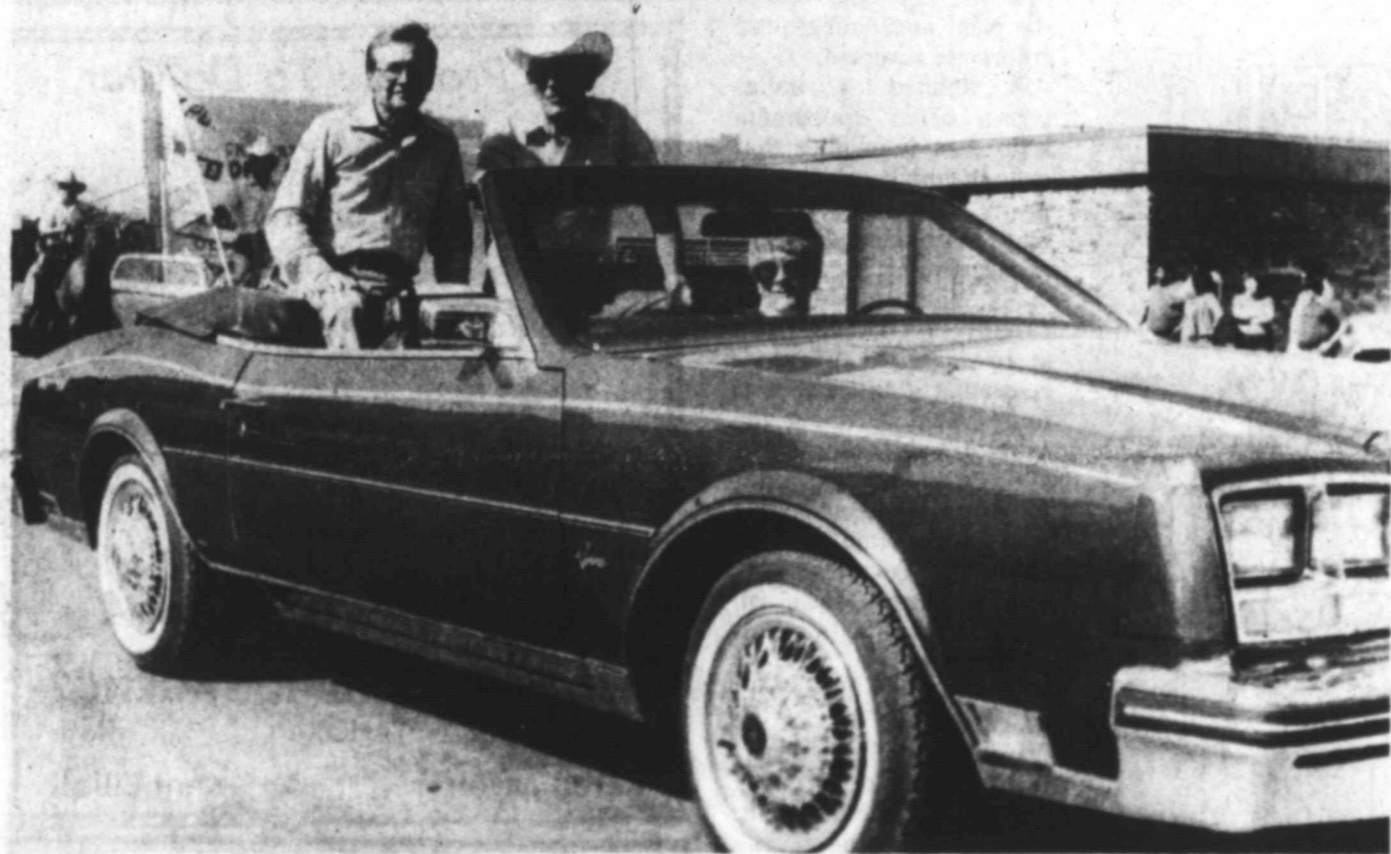

By the way, anyone interested may drive by our home and look at our dead trees. We will never get yard of the month.

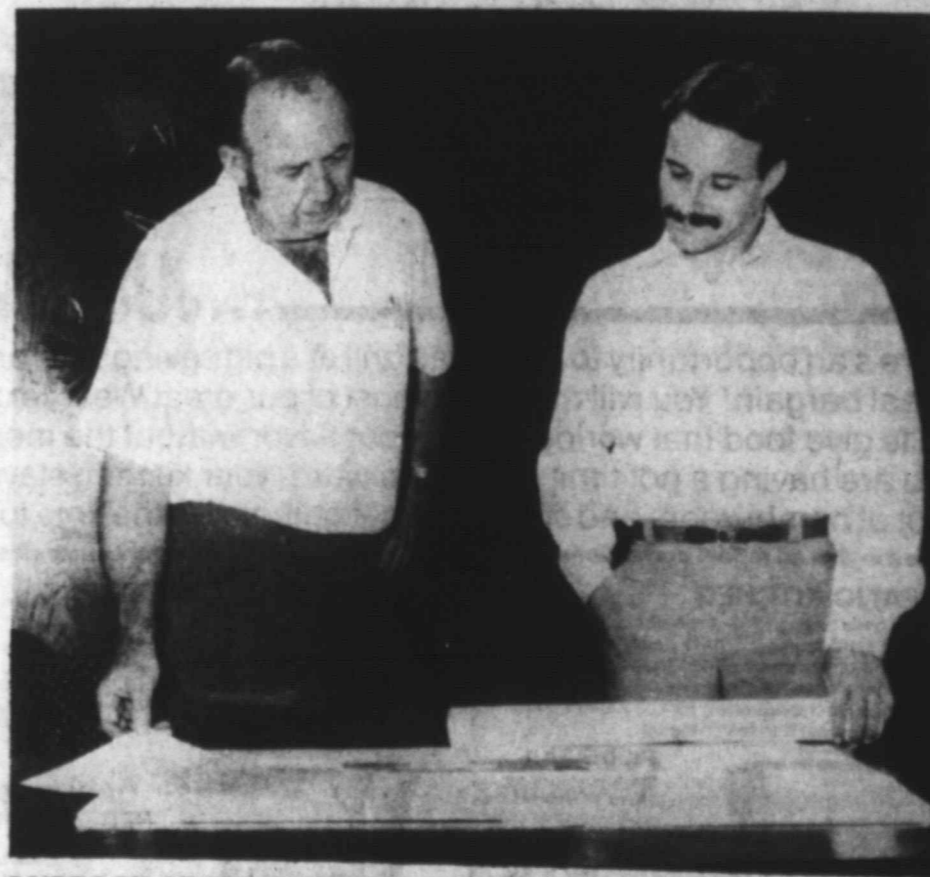

Farmers have an unparalleled opportunity this year to improve their soil and water conservation systems, said Peter Myers, Chief of the USDA's Soil Conservation Service. Under the Payment-In-

Kind (PIK) program and other acreage limitation programs, farmers in Texas are taking 9.3 million acres out of production. One-fifth of the nation's cropland is pledged to the program and now farmers can put a great deal of soil

and water conservation on the ground.

Some of the erosive and less productive acreage will be taken out of annual crop use and planted to grasses and legumes as cover crops. This has the potential for saving soil and water resources as well as building up natural fertility.

Myers said this is also a good time for planning ways to fit no-till or other conservation tillage methods into the farm operation.

On more erosive acres, permanent conservation practices such as terraces, grassed waterways, windbreaks and other enduring practices can be installed without interrupting cash crop production.

On the most erosive or other marginal land, farmers are encouraged to discontinue use of those acres for crop production. Those acres may be best suited for permanent grasses, trees or wildlife habitat.

The 1983 programs offer farmers a rare opportunity to balance their short-term cash needs with their longer conservation and productivity goals said Myers.

Electronic telephones are becoming an increasingly popular choice for those who buy their own phones, says Bonnie Peirnot, a family resource management specialist. Electronic phones can be programmed to perform special functions such as dialing frequently called numbers or preventing the person on the line from hearing while you talk to someone in the room with you. "People with physical disabilities can really benefit from some of the options such as automatic dialer, amplifiers, large dials and number pads that electronic phones make available," says the specialist.

**Planting And Deficiency Payments**

Deficiency payments are, by law, tied to planted acres. Prevented planting would be used for history purposes only with no payment. If you have planted and the crop has failed, you are expected and required to replant until June 10 for cotton or June 30 for grain. You may plant later if you choose to. Normal farming practices are expected to be carried out. Failure to carry out normal practices will mean a reduction in payments.

**Failed Crop Acres**

It is very important to certify and report failed acres before replanting to another crop or destroying evidence of the crop. Failure to certify and report failed acres will reduce the number of acres on which deficiency payment will be made. This means if you are not going to replant some failed cotton, you must certify all the cotton on that farm number before replanting the failed acres to another crop.

**Measurement Service**

We are accepting requests for measurement service for spring seeded crops and CUA. Measurements will be taken by slides from an airplane. The rate is 120 per farm plus \$9 per slide after the first two slides. Requests that require ground visits to determine acreage will be \$30 for the first plot and \$25 for each additional plot. Bring a sketch showing crops planted, different patterns, out spots, etc. Sept. 15 is deadline to complete all requests. Requests should be made by July 1.

July 15 is the final date to certify spring seeded crops and CUA. An accurate certification is very

**Sales Tax Rebate Told**

State Comptroller Bob Bullock sent checks totaling \$43.8 million in local sales tax payments to 974 cities that levy the one-percent sales tax. Certifications not within tolerance will face loss of program benefits and, if in PIK, be subject to liquidating damages.

**Cotton Bids**

CCC has extended the sign-up for accepting bids on outstanding 1982 loan cotton until June 16. The number of bales retained by the producer is your bid. A bid greater than 7 per cent will not be accepted.

**Cover on CUA**

Producers that requested a farm visit and allowed wheat to mature on CUA are reminded that the wheat must be destroyed by July 1. Spot checks will be made to determine if the wheat has been destroyed. Weeds and wind erosion must be controlled on CUA. Cotton, grain sorghum, soybeans, and sunflowers are not approved covers for CUA. Sudan, sudan crosses, and legumes are approved covers for CUA. Grazing of CUA cannot begin until Oct. 1.

The land must have been planted to a row crop or small grain two of the last three years to be used for CUA. The minimum size for CUA is one chain wide and five acres in size. This includes terraces this year.

**County Oil Production Listed**

Texas Mid-Continent Oil and Gas Assn. reports that an 11th consecutive year of production at the maximum effective recovery rate in nearly all of Texas' oil fields kept 1982 petroleum production in the state above the 900-million barrel figure. Avery Rush Jr., chairman of the Dallas-based Assn., says that figures compiled by its staff show the total petroleum output of 901,910,343 barrels included 871,780,379 barrels of crude oil and

30,129,964 barrels of condensate from wells in 214 of Texas' 254 counties. Crude oil and condensate production last year was 26.8 million-barrels below the 1981 figure, a drop of 2.9 percent. This compares with a 3.3 percent drop in 1981 production from the year previous, Rush said. Lynn County, which has had recorded production

since 1950, last year produced 386,642 barrels of crude oil and condensate at the rate of 1,059 barrels per day. Production in 1982 boosted Lynn County's production total through the end of the year to 10,617,550 barrels.

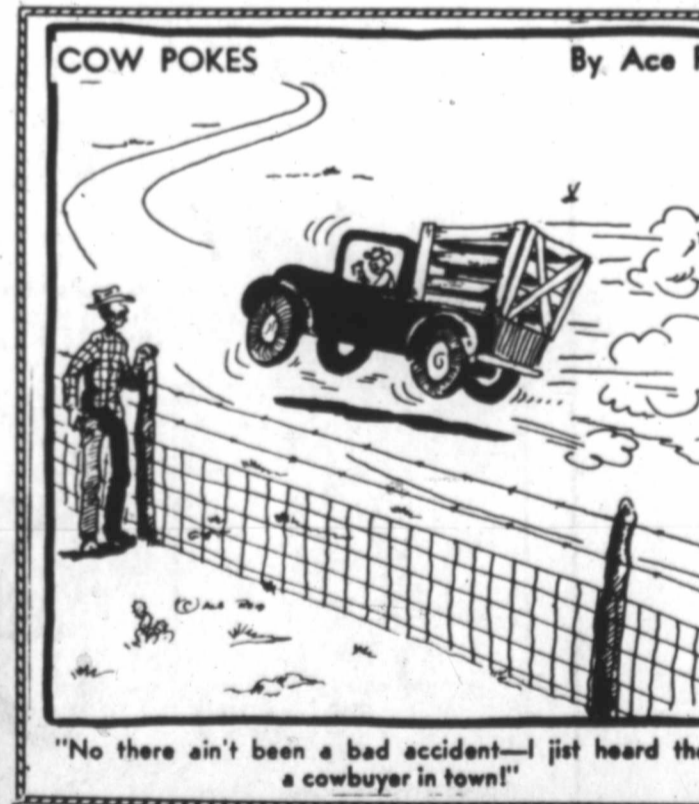

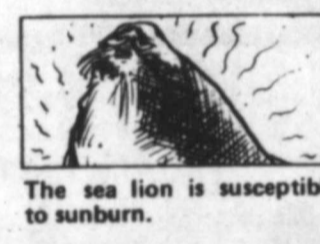

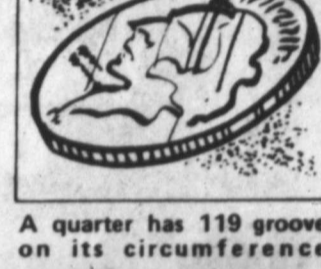
