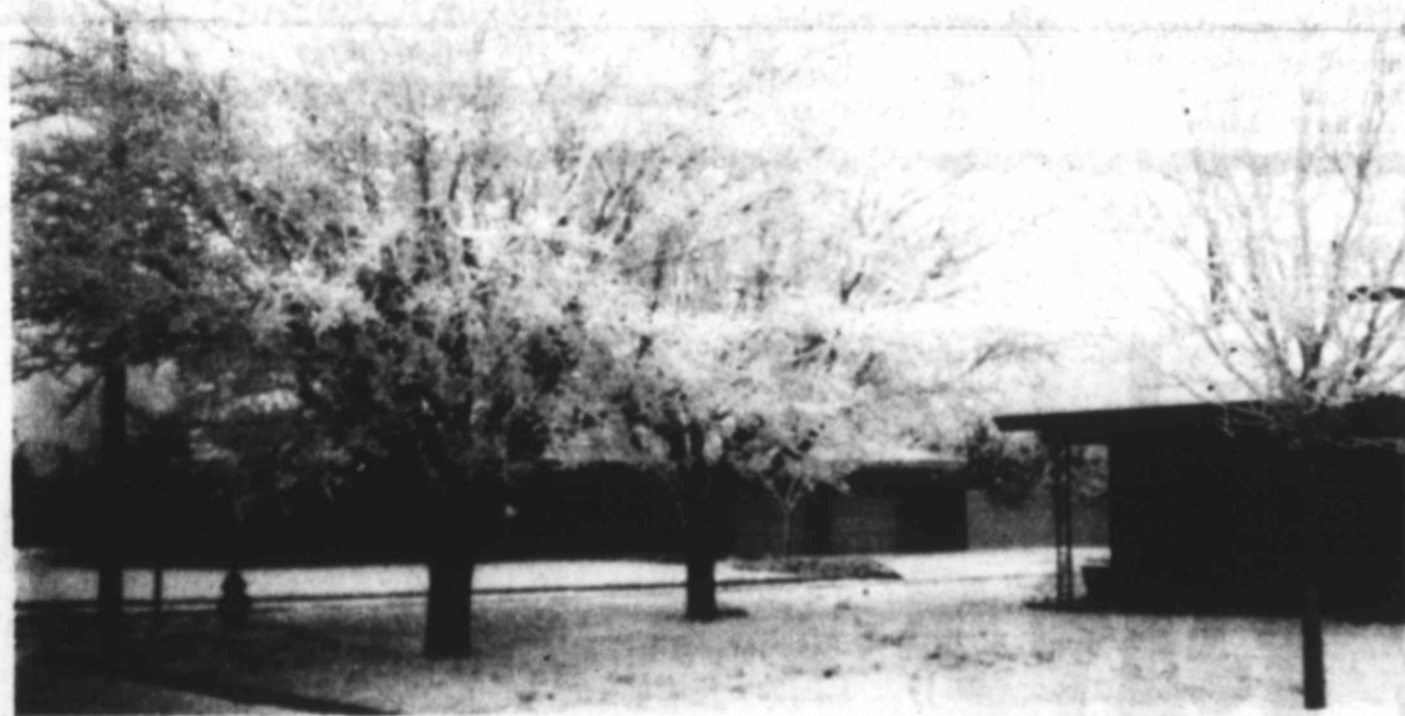

Residents Have Water Problems

More than a dozen local residents have experienced frozen or broken water lines that have needed attention from City maintenance crews during the past week. This is due to the "dramatic changes in temperature and prolonged cold weather," said city manager Carl Reynolds. No main lines in the city have broken yet, however.

Energas Announces Trading of Company Stock

Energas Company announced this week that trading of the company's common stock will begin Wednesday, Dec. 28 on the National Association of Securities Dealers Automated Quotations (NASDAQ) system, under the symbol "EGAS."

Energas, a natural gas utility serving 30,000 square miles of West Texas, was established as an independent company Oct. 18, 1983, by the spin-off of the gas distribution division of Pioneer Corporation.

Lynn County officials investigated several wrecks on highways and farm roads during the past week due to ice road conditions. No one was reported seriously injured in mishaps that have occurred.

Cotton Prices Decline Sharply

High Plains cotton farmers saw prices tumble this week, according to Mack Bennett, Area Director for USDA's Marketing Services office at Lubbock.

Prices weakened about Dec. 15 when mixed lots of mostly grades 52 and 53, staples 31-33, mike 35-49 were trading at about 1975 to 2275 points over commodity Credit loan rates. Similar lots brought about 1725 to 1975 over loan on Dec. 22, Bennett said.

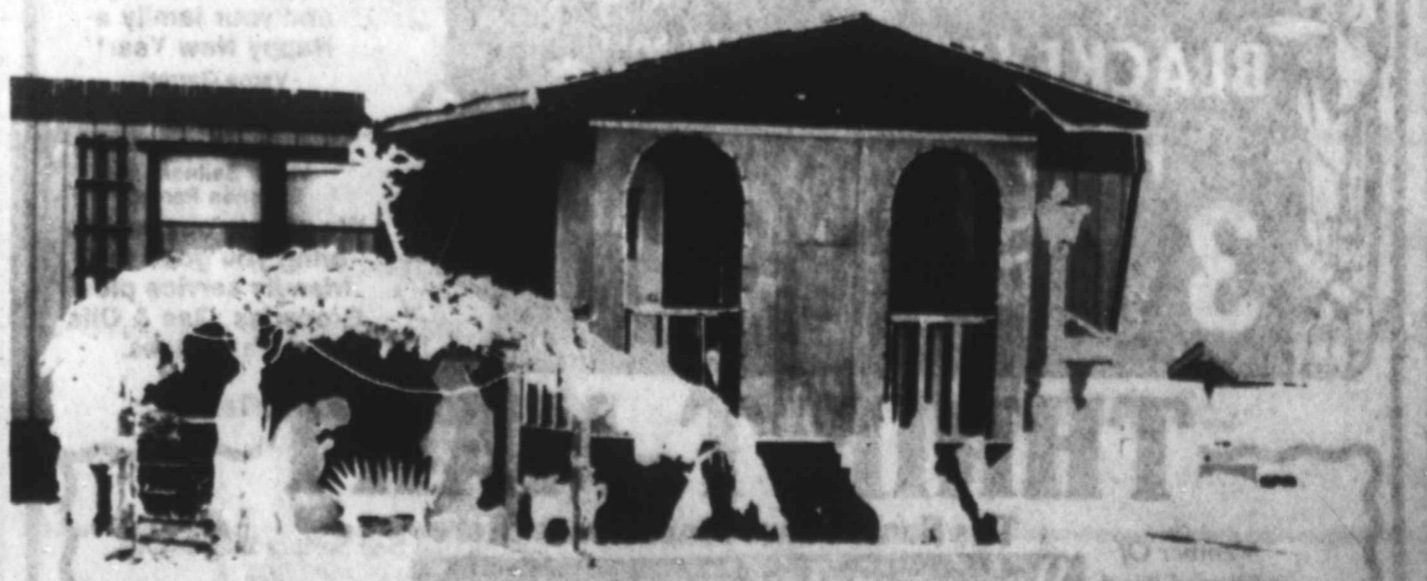
Don't Put Ashes In Dumpsters

Ag Chemicals Topic of Meeting Here

Fertilizer usage, soil testing and crop herbicide usage will be the topics of concern at a breakfast meeting on Wednesday, Jan. 4, 1984. The meeting will be held in the meeting room of the Paris Cafeteria in downtown Tahoka.

Dr. Dale Pennington, Extension soil chemist, will discuss the importance of soil testing and application of proper types of fertilizers as well as timing of application.

Special address will be made in placing the PIK acres back into production.

Dr. James Supak, cotton specialist, will cover cotton weed identification and control. Also, he will address the use of the new over the top cotton herbicides.

Wrapping up the program will be Dr. Kirby Huffman who will address the needs to weed control in sorghum, soybeans and other crops.

All concerned individuals are invited to attend, enjoy breakfast and gain new knowledge on fertilizers and herbicides. The meeting is sponsored

by the Lynn County Crops Committee and the Lynn County Extension Service.

Educational programs conducted by the Texas Agricultural Extension Service serve people of all ages regardless of social-economic level, race, color, sex, religion, handicap or national origin.
