Mrs. Green's Installation Set Friday

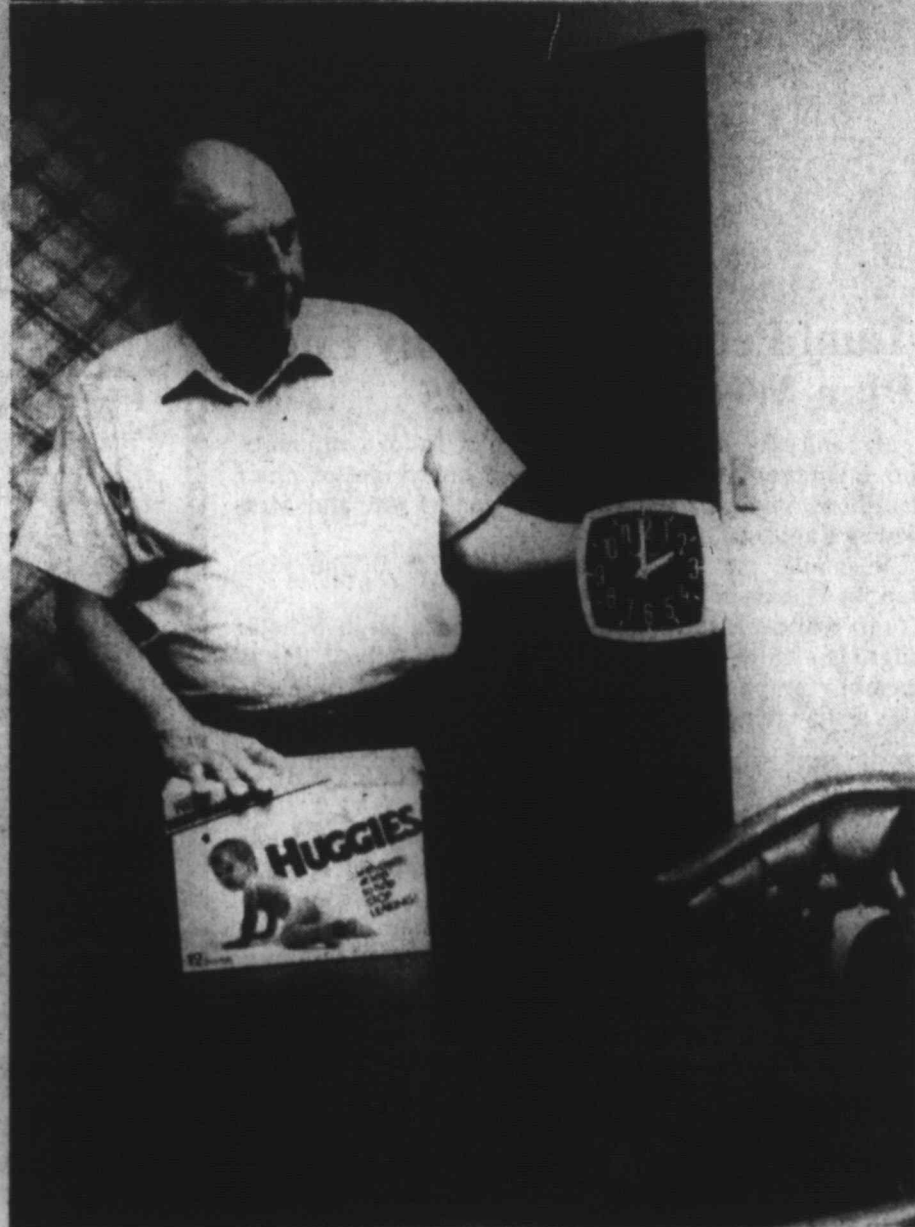
Mrs. Harold (Betty) Green of Tahoka will be installed as president of the Texas Federation of Women's Clubs in ceremonies at the Holiday Inn Civic Center in Lubbock Friday evening.

The installation will be part of a four-day convention program for the state organization. Mrs. Wendell Winger of Springville, Utah, president elect of the General Federation of Women's Clubs, will install the 1984-86 state officers, beginning at 7 p.m. Mrs. Green will speak on "Seek, Share and Serve."

The reception following the installation will honor both Mrs. Green and Mrs. Winger, with the Phebe K. Warner Club in Tahoka as one of the hostesses. Mrs. Grace Prohl of Tahoka is chairperson.

Mrs. Green, a former music teacher, graduate of Baylor University and currently a member of the Tahoka school board, has been active in women's clubs since 1952 when she became a member of the Phebe K. Warner Club. She has been a member of the Texas Federation of Women's Clubs state board since 1970.

The Soundstorm, a band including two members from Tahoka, will play for the reception Friday evening.

School Board Accepts Coulston Resignation

Resignation of Supt. Jim Coulston was accepted in a unanimous vote by the board of trustees of Tahoka Independent School District in a called meeting at noon last Thursday.

At the regular meeting of the board April 17 Coulston had submitted his resignation and the board had voted 4-3 not to accept his resignation.

The board also voted approval of a request by elementary principal Clifton Gardner to be relieved of any responsibility related to Tubb elementary. Gardner will return to his former position as principal of North Elementary only this fall. Tom Cooper has been reinstated as principal of Tubb.

The board decided to accept applications for superintendent through June 1, with the new superintendent to assume his or her duties on July 1.

Motorcycle Wreck Kills Tahoka Man

Jose Gilbert Resendez, 34, of Tahoka, died Saturday as a result of injuries suffered in a motorcycle accident just north of Tahoka about 5:45 p.m.

Resendez was a passenger on his own 1977 Honda 1000 driven by John William Underwood, 21, also of Tahoka, who suffered head and ankle injuries.

The investigating officer for the Department of Public Safety said both men were thrown from the cycle when it went out of control while headed south coming into town on U.S. 87 just south of the FM 400 overpass. Both were taken to Lubbock General Hospital by Lynn County EMS ambulance, and

Resendez was pronounced dead at 6:54 p.m. by Lubbock Justice of the Peace L.J. Blalack.

Services for Resendez were conducted Tuesday afternoon in St. Jude Catholic Church with the Rev. Patrick Hoffman officiating.

Burial was in Tahoka Cemetery under direction of White Funeral Home.

He was born Dec. 15, 1949, in Mexico. The family moved to Lynn County in 1954 from Lovington, N.M. He attended school in Tahoka. He married Romelia Antu June 22, 1974, in Tahoka. He was a ginner, and worked for the Farmers Coop Gin in Tahoka. He was a member of St. Jude Catholic Church.

Survivors include his wife; a daughter, Melissa Ann of the home; a son, Joe Gilbert Jr. of the home; his parents, Mr. and Mrs. Guadalupe Resendez of Tahoka; four sisters, Elvia Aguilar, Adelina Resendez, Alicia Resendez and Minerva DeLeon, all of Tahoka; seven brothers, Eusevio, Juan and Lupe, all of Big Lake, and Marcelo, Rafael, Ramiro and Jesse, all of Tahoka.

Pallbearers were Jose Garcia, Tino DeLeon, Nick Aguirre, Tommy Lawson, Alfred Gonzalez and Woven-celado Tijerina.

O'Donnell Bank, Post Office, City Hall Robbed

A burglar or burglars broke into the First National Bank of O'Donnell during the night Sunday and also probably the same persons broke into the U.S. Post Office and city hall at O'Donnell.

The Post Office burglary is a federal offense, and Postal Inspec-

tor J.B. McCoy of Dallas was working with Lynn County Sheriff's Dept. in the investigation of that break-in and destruction of some mail.

The federal government also has a standing \$5,000 reward for arrest and conviction of persons on

burglary of a post office.

About \$30 in cash was stolen from pouches in lockers at the post office, and there was an unsuccessful attempt made to get into a safe. Some mail was destroyed and other mail opened, with one thing known to have been taken from a package being 40 rolls of photographic film.

Nothing was stolen at the bank, although there was damage to a window broken by a rock or brick, the same method used to get into the post office. A calculator also was damaged at the bank.

Entry to city hall was gained by forcing open a window, officers said. A filing cabinet was pried open, and a bank bag containing some checks and \$187.48 in cash was stolen.

Lynn County Crime Line also is offering a \$500 reward for information leading to the clearing of any of the three burglaries, which apparently occurred between 2 a.m. and 6 a.m. Monday.

A New Home school official and city marshal were credited with solving a case of theft of gasoline from school buses there. Supt. Hiram Sharp and Marshal Don Sharp had a suspect in custody and handcuffed when sheriff's officers arrive Saturday night. The man was questioned and officers Monday arrested two more suspects. All three men are from Slaton; they are scheduled to plead in justice of the peace court Friday.

In jail during the week were two persons from public intoxication, the three men on the gasoline theft charges, and one person each for driving while license suspended, capias pro fine, traffic warrants and DWI second offense.

Luis and Patty Rangel of 1820 N. 5th reported to Tahoka police that someone had entered their house while they were gone between the hours of 10 p.m. and midnight last Wednesday. Items reported missing included one Sanyo AM-FM radio and cassette player and one box of jewelry.

Police received a call last Thursday from a resident who reported someone had kicked in a back door, but nothing was reported missing.

Police received more disturbance calls during the past week that included a complaint from a resident saying someone on a motorcycle was going up and down their alley keeping them from resting and another resident reported that some kids on Main St. were making a lot of noise late at night.

Tickets issued during the past week include one each for no proof of liability insurance, failure to yield right of way, and one for driving at an unsafe speed.

UNLOCKING SECRETS OF ALZHEIMER'S DISEASE

Scientists may be a step closer to understanding a baffling and devastating brain disorder that afflicts about 2 million elderly Americans.

Dr. Stanley B. Prusiner, a researcher at the University of California, recently discovered an infectious agent which may be linked to Alzheimer's disease. Victims of Alzheimer's disease suffer first from forgetfulness, and ultimately from total disorientation.

Prusiner's work has received principal corporate support from R.J. Reynolds Industries, Inc., which provided \$3 million to the research effort over the past three years. Another \$1.5 million is committed for the next two years as part of RJR's support of basic biomedical research. ▲

Fulltime Juvenile Officer Employed

Lynn County Commissioners Monday approved the employment of a fulltime juvenile probation officer, providing office space for Sammie Krause to operate in the former location of the county attorney's office in the courthouse.

Mrs. Krause was appointed as an assistant juvenile probation officer to the supervising office in Lamesa, and will be attending school to get full certification for the position.

The wife of Sheriff Stanley Krause, she also is the daughter of the late Weir Clem, longtime sheriff of Hockley County. She has 11 years of law enforcement experience in Dawson, Garza and Lubbock counties and was appointed by the state and the Lynn County Juvenile Board. Her salary is paid by the state, and the county's only obligation is to provide office space and a phone.

Phone number of the new juvenile probation office is 998-4920.

Commissioners also talked with Reed Smith of Southwest

Microfilm, who advised that he should finish filming records in the county clerk's office in about three weeks.

Payment of Lynn County's first quarter share of the district attorney's office expenses was approved, in the amount of \$552.

Wilson Sets Pre-School Day, May 2

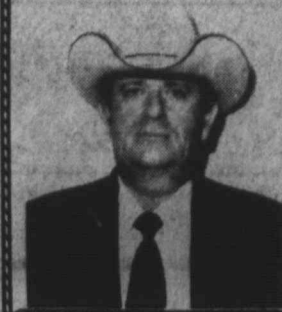

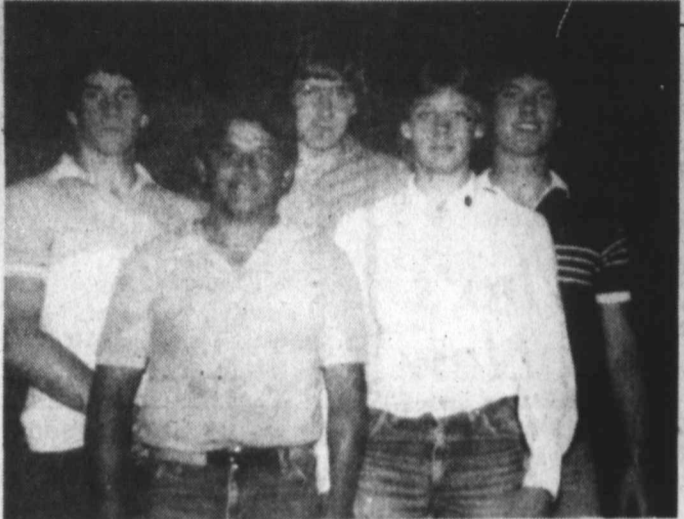

WATER MANAGEMENT—The high cost of irrigation, especially the cost of pumping water, "makes it imperative that we do everything possible to manage the water properly once we have spent the money for pumping," representatives of the Lynn County SWCD said this week. There are a number of good management practices and tools which are relatively inexpensive to buy or install and can save money. One good management tool is the use of moisturemeters and gypsum blocks to tell when more water is needed by crops. Most farmers use an educated guess which, in many cases, is pretty close. But at the end of the season the decision to water or not is often difficult to make and many water when it isn't necessary. The use of gypsum blocks and moisture meters could give that information. At this time there is no dealer for these meters and blocks in this area, so the Lynn County SWCD in cooperation with the High Plains Underground Water Conservation District has purchased the meters and blocks and they are available at the SCS office in Tahoka. Farmers are urged to go by for a quick demonstration and installation instructions. The moisture meter sells for \$160 and is good for several years. The gypsum blocks sell for \$3 and are good for one season. The SCS Office has the equipment to tell how many GPM a well is producing, the pump efficiency, and to evaluate center pivot systems. They also have a surge system which they can loan out for demonstration purposes. All these services are available to help irrigators to do a better job. The annual seminar provides 20 hours of study for county treasurers as required by House Bill 570 passed by the 68th Texas Legislature.

Mrs. Bryan was presented a special certificate for successfully completing the program.

"Both of my opponents are totally out of step with the state of Texas on the issue of gay rights," Hance said. Krueger and Doggett have expressed their support for the federal gay rights bill. Hance argues the measure goes too far.

Hance also took issue with his opponents for their support of amnesty for illegal aliens. The Lubbock Democrat is against proposals which would allow illegal aliens already living in the country to stay. "Amnesty would take away a lot of American jobs, and encourage more illegal aliens to enter the country," Hance warned.
