

High Plains Pavers of Plainview was low bidder on sealcoat work for repair of the runway at T-Bar Airport, and Tahoka city council voted Monday night in special session to accept the bid of \$15,400 for the project.

A Texas Aeronautics Commission representative was present when bids were opened. The TEC will make funds available for 75 per cent of the cost, with the city to pay for the other 25 per cent, plus fees for the engineer.

Also approved at Monday night's meeting was a call for bids for paving an estimated 19 blocks in the south, southeast and northeast sections of the city under the last phase of a three-year program funded by the federal government in form of a community development block grant. Bids on the paving will be opened June 11.






