County Receives State Road Funds

Lynn County has received \$27,117.67 from State Treasurer Ann Richards for county road construction and maintenance.

The Treasurer each year disburses money appropriated by the Legislature for the Lateral Road Program. The grants may be used by counties for the purchase of right-of-way and for construction and maintenance of lateral roads, farm-to-market roads or state highways.

The money is allocated to each county under a formula based on the county's area, rural population and lateral road mileage.

State Insurance Team Checking Buildings Here

A complete reinspection of Tahoka, which will last approximately four to six weeks, was begun last Thursday with the arrival of the rate crew from the State Board of Insurance based in Austin.

The five-man crew, Joe Yarbro II, Daniel Hughes, James Hoskins, Craig LaDew, and Mike Johnson, will be inspecting every commercial building, school, church, and public building to update the fire insurance and coverage rates on the buildings and their contents.

Since the last inspection in 1953, many additions and improvements have been made. One of the biggest problems this inspection will solve is matching the correct addresses with each

business.

Types of construction of a building, whether it is frame, masonry or steel, types of walls, ceilings, floors and roofs, what kind of occupancy, what kind of exposures to other buildings and whether they share any walls or roofs and if each occupant has fire extinguishers and when last serviced, are items that will be checked.

"This is not a safety inspection, but rather confirmation of information already on file at the State Board of Insurance," one member of the team said. "An inspection of property does not mean that insurance rates or premiums will increase. Quite often it benefits the policy-holder by reducing rates, especially if there have been significant improvements to water systems or fire department facilities."

Tahoka is under the jurisdiction of the Lubbock territory. Richard Baker and Ronnie Roach are the territory inspectors who usually check on new building and make appropriate changes in existing buildings as they are reported by local insurance agents.

Each inspector possesses identification from the State Board of Insurance. He will usually contact either the owner or occupant

of the building, identify himself and state the purpose of his visit. "The rate crew appreciates the help and cooperation we have received and special thanks to the City of Tahoka and City Manager Carl Reynolds for providing office space," the spokesman said.

Three burglaries of places along the south side of U.S. 380 just inside the Tahoka city limits were reported Wednesday morning, and police and sheriff's officers were still checking out the Tuesday night break-ins. Burglarized were Bob Haney Gin, and two barns, owned by

Gerald Huffaker and Harvey Craig. It was not immediately known what was missing, except for a welder from the gin.

Tahoka police also investigated one accident and thefts of tools and a stereo from two vehicles during the past week.

Police investigated an accident on Friday at 1600 Ave. H. that involved a 1978 Ford pickup driven by Jody W. Woodard of Tahoka and a parked 1976 Chevrolet van owned by Juan R. Corona of Tahoka. No injuries were reported.

Cecil Dorman of 1900 N. 4th reported to police on Sunday that someone had stolen a tool box out of the back of his pickup parked at his residence on Saturday night. Various tools and wrenches missing were estimated at \$400.

Kevin Pettit of 2124 Lockwood reported to police that his 1983 Toyota pickup, was broken into and the door was forced open. Reported missing was a Sherwood car stereo and speakers. The car was parked at Lynco Automotive on Sunday.

Police also arrested a man on Saturday at a Tahoka residence for disorderly conduct.

Tickets issued during the past week included two for running a red light, two for exhibition of acceleration, one for excessive noise and no driver's license and one for unsafe backing.

In jail during the week were one person each for assault causing bodily injury, transporting liquor in a dry area, driving while intoxicated, disorderly conduct and issuing a bad check.

Weekly **Health Tip**

DAYTON PARKER
LUMPS IN THE BREAST
 About 20% of American women have 'fibrocystic disease', in which small tender lumps can be felt within the breasts. The condition portends a somewhat increased risk of cancer. Caffeine and related 'xanthine' substances in coffee, tea, chocolate, cola, some medicines, and tobacco smoke are partly responsible, reports the Journal of AMA. Fibrocystic lumps disappeared from the breasts of 37 out of 45 women who eliminated their intake of xanthines. The Journal also reported that fibrocystic lumps disappeared or decreased in 22 of 26 women who took vitamin E, 600 units daily, for 12 weeks.

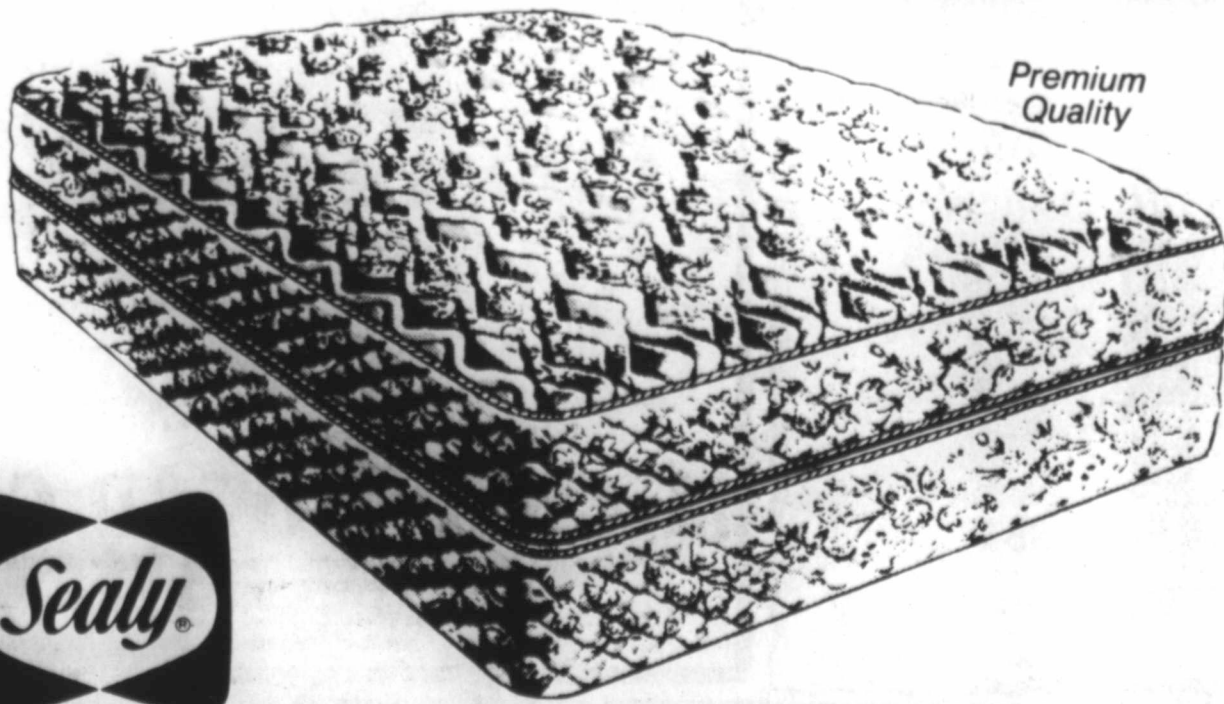

Dogs Suffer Reruns

The Tahoka Bulldogs did it again last Friday night at homecoming: they played well in spurts and then made periodic mistakes that allowed long plays to do them in. And they lost for the fifth straight time this season, to Roscoe 36-7.

The Dogs, who have won just one game in the last three years, this week host powerful Seagraves in the opening game of district play.

If there were any bright spots in last Friday's loss to Roscoe,

they were the running of Daron Norwood and the limited return to action of Quarterback Trey Teaff, who has been sidelined since breaking a wrist in pre-season scrimmage against Slaton.

Teaff, Norwood and Randy Taylor all took their turns at quarterback and all threw some passes, but only two were completed. The running game was a little better, with Fullback Johnny Morin getting 93 yards in 19 carries and Norwood gaining 125 yards in 10 carries, mostly on

a 55-yard touchdown run near the end of the game.

Roscoe's first TD came after a surprise 4th and 6 pass gained 53 yards to the Tahoka 9. A couple of plays later QB Matt Denman ran 11 yards for the first score of the game, with less than 5 minutes played in the contest. Tackle Nathan Richburg kicked the point, mauling the ball with his 260 pounds.

Early in the second quarter, and still just a touchdown behind, Tahoka missed two good chances to score. Norwood ran 24 yards to the Roscoe 32, but his pass after that was intercepted at the 17. Tahoka got the ball back and drove to the Roscoe 15, where on fourth and 2, the snap from center was fumbled.

Kevin Reed promptly ran 82 yards for another Plowboy touchdown, and shortly before the half Denman passed 50 yards to Reed for another, to make it 22-0 at halftime.

In the third, Denman ran 37 yards for a TD.

Early in the fourth Roscoe had a first and goal at the Tahoka 5, but the Dogs held on downs, twice stopping Roscoe from the 1, once on a tackle of Denman by Kevin Bailey and Richard Calvillo and the last time on an incomplete pass.

Jerry Alvarado intercepted two of Denman's passes in the fourth quarter, returning one of them 38 yards to the Roscoe 28, but

Roscoe held on downs at the 22.

Later in the fourth quarter, Denman passed to End Lee McFaul 15 yards for a TD, then a 2-point pass made it 36-0.

Morin returned the ensuing kickoff all the way to the Tahoka 45, and then Norwood broke free and outran everybody 55 yards for a touchdown, the brightest moment of the game for Tahoka. Morin kicked the point.

Bailey, Morin and Doug Lawson did good work on defense.
