Burglary, Gasoline Thefts Investigated

Burglary of a residence in the east part of the county, theft of gasoline from some key pumps in O'Donnell and theft of a billfold at New Home were among items investigated by Lynn County sheriff's office during the last week.

Rewards for information on all three cases were posted by Lynn County Crime Line, 998-5145.

Selma Klesel, Rt. 2, Post, reported burglary of a home 2 miles north and slightly west of Hackberry between 10 a.m. and 4 p.m. Sunday, with items totaling more than \$800 stolen, including two television sets, a stereo system and set of silverware.

Gasoline was stolen from key pumps owned by Lamesa Butane and located just outside the city

limits of O'Donnell on N. Loop 76 on successive nights, Dec. 3 and Dec. 4. A total of 100 gallons of gasoline was stolen, and the key pump locks damaged.

Jess Faubian of New Home had a billfold stolen from the dash of his pickup while it was parked at his residence in New Home. Missing were about \$5 in cash and several credit cards.

In jail during the week were one person each for theft of stolen property and driving while intoxicated.

Tahoka police received complaints of obscene and prank telephone calls, two reports of family disturbances, and issued two tickets for no liability insurance and one for illegal backing and parking during the week.

Jaime Newsom Fund Raiser Set Saturday

Tahoka Mayor Mel Leslie has proclaimed Saturday as "Jaime Newsom Day" in Tahoka as a Baby Pageant, auction, entertainment and bake sale will all be part of events scheduled to begin at 3 p.m. in the Tahoka High School auditorium.

There will be no admission charge for attendance at the events, but everyone attending will be given opportunity to make a donation as they enter.

Local merchants have donated items to be auctioned off, and some of the Baby Pageant participants will offer talent at the event. In addition, the O'Donnell chapter of Young Homemakers will have a bake sale at the door. Anyone with items to donate for the bake sale is asked to call Jerri Beth McKibben at 998-5023.

All proceeds from the activities will go to the family of 22-month-old Jaime Newsom, who has a critical liver ailment and whose parents are desperately seeking a donor for a liver transplant. Medical expenses for the child have been very high.

Bond Vote Set Jan. 12 On Two City Projects

Voters in the City of Tahoka will have opportunity Jan. 12 to say whether they want a new fire station and a new public meeting room and other remodeling at city hall.

The Jan. 12 date was set by the city council Monday night as members voted unanimously to have a \$150,000 bond election which would result in a raise of 8.5 cents per \$100 valuation in city taxes, which are now 49 cents per \$100 valuation. It would cost the average taxpayer in the city about \$20 more per year in taxes.

The bonds would be paid out over a 10-year period, and Mayor Meldon Leslie said Monday night that he already has had an inquiry from a possible source of financing.

Two propositions will be listed on the ballot. One is for \$100,000 for demolishing the present Scout Hut on city property just east of city hall and then building a modern adequate fire station to accommodate the equipment and other needs of the Tahoka Volunteer Fire Dept.

The second proposition is for \$50,000 for remodeling city hall, primarily the part now used to house the fire equipment. That portion would be remodeled into a public meeting room which could accommodate up to 126 persons in banquet style, and would convert a present recreation room into a meeting room for city council larger than the present meeting room, which has almost no space for visitors to council meetings.

If the propositions are approved by the voters, the city plans to let the scouts have the present community center for a meeting place.

The council also authorized city manager Carl Reynolds to institute a charge of \$10 for any bad checks received by the city. Reynolds said he had received a

couple of insufficient checks recently on water bills.

All council members, W.O. Wharton, Jim Solomon, Richard White, Tom Cooper and Dalton Wood, were present, as were Mayor Leslie and Reynolds, and Joe Smith, representing First Southwest Company, which has been engaged to handle the bond issue details.

The loans, totaling \$101,000,000 were made under programs to assist families who are without safe, decent and sanitary housing and who need credit but cannot obtain it from private lenders.

Futch said that during the 12 months ending Sept. 30, FmHA provided 1600 single family home loans totaling \$55,000,000, and 52 rental housing loans totaling \$46,000,000 which provided for 3300 loans totaling \$2.8 billion in all rural housing assistance.

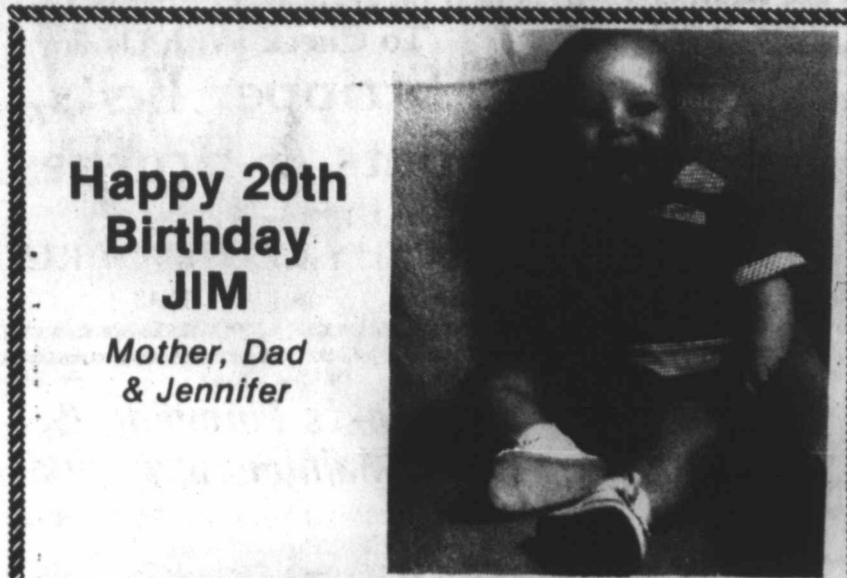
PRODUCTION COSTS AID PLANNING—To help make sound marketing decisions, farmers must know production costs and commodity prices, says an economist. Knowing production costs can help a farmer evaluate these marketing alternatives: selling at harvest, storing and selling later, forward contracting for delivery at harvest or later, hedging in the futures market, or using agricultural commodity options. A RESOLUTION AND ORDER by the City Council of the City of Tahoka, Texas, calling a bond election to be held within said City, making provision for the conduct of the election and other provisions incident and related to the purpose of this resolution and order.

WHEREAS, the City Council of Tahoka, Texas, has determined that an election should be held to ascertain whether said governing body shall be authorized to issue bonds of said City in the amounts and for the purposes hereinafter mentioned; therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED AND ORDERED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF TAHOKA, TEXAS:

SECTION 1: That an election be held on the 12th day of January, 1985, which date is not less than fifteen (15) nor more than ninety (90) days from the date of the adoption hereof, at which election the following propositions shall be submitted:

PROPOSITION NUMBER 1
 "SHALL the City Council of the City of Tahoka, Texas, be authorized to issue bonds of said City in the principal amount of \$100,000 for the purpose of constructing permanent improvements, to wit: construct and equip a fire station; such bonds to mature serially or otherwise over a period not to exceed FORTY (40) years from their date, to be issued in such installments, sold at any price or prices and to bear interest at any rate or rates as shall be determined within the discretion of the City Council at the time of issuance; and whether ad valorem taxes shall be levied upon all taxable property in the City sufficient to pay the annual interest and provide a sinking fund to pay the bonds at maturity?"

PROPOSITION NUMBER 2
 "SHALL the City Council of the City of Tahoka, Texas, be authorized to issue bonds of said City in the principal amount of \$50,000 for the purpose of constructing permanent improvements, to wit: remodel and renovate existing city hall facilities; such bonds to mature serially or otherwise over a period not to exceed FORTY (40) years from their date, to be issued in such installments, sold at any price or prices and to bear interest at any rate or rates as shall be determined within the discretion of the City Council at the time of issuance; and whether ad valorem taxes shall be levied upon all taxable property in the City sufficient to pay the annual interest and provide a sinking fund to pay the bonds at maturity?"

SECTION 2: That paper ballots shall be used for said election, which ballots shall be prepared in accordance with the V.A.T.S. Election Code so as to permit the electors to vote "FOR" or "AGAINST" the aforesaid proposition which shall appear on the ballot substantially as follows:

PROPOSITION NUMBER 1
 THE ISSUANCE OF \$100,000 GENERAL OBLIGATION BONDS FOR A FIRE STATION

PROPOSITION NUMBER 2
 THE ISSUANCE OF \$50,000 GENERAL OBLIGATION BONDS FOR REMODELING CITY HALL FACILITIES

SECTION 3: That the entire City of Tahoka, Texas, shall constitute one election precinct for this election and the Tahoka High School Cafeteria in said City is hereby designated as the polling place.

On election day, the polls shall be open from 7:00 A.M. to 7:00 P.M.

SECTION 4: That the following named persons are hereby appointed officers of the election:

MAURICE HUFFAKER PRESIDING JUDGE
 MRS. DEAN BARTLEY ALTERNATE PRESIDING JUDGE

The Presiding Judge shall appoint not less than two (2) nor more than three (3) qualified clerks to serve and assist in holding said election; provided that if the Presiding Judge herein appointed actually serves, the Alternate Presiding Judge shall be one of the clerks.

Absentee voting shall be conducted at the City Secretary's office in the City Hall, in accordance with the provisions of V.A.T.S. Election Code, Chapter 5.

SECTION 5: That all resident qualified electors of the City shall be permitted to vote at said election. This election shall be held and conducted in accordance with the Texas Election Code except as modified by Chapter 1 of Title 2, V.A.T.S., and as may be required by law, all election materials and proceedings shall be printed in both English and Spanish.

SECTION 6: That a substantial copy of this resolution and order shall serve as proper notice of said election.
