Cable Company Asks \$1.50 Rate Hike

Signet Cablevision, operator of the cable television system in Tahoka, formally requested Tahoka City Council's permission Monday to increase basic rates by \$1.50 per month, coupled with plans to add four more channels here.

Jim Strange, manager of Signet, told the council members the company plans to add the four channels in a range above

the present group, which all are in the low bands from channel 2 through 13. This means all owners of TV sets which do not have the higher-channel numbers without switching over to UHF, will need converter boxes. These boxes will be supplied free of charge to customers here, Strange said.

at optional extra cost to subscribers two more pay-TV channels, probably the Disney Channel and either Showtime or the Movie Channel. Currently Home Box Office (HBO) is available for \$11 per month.

He said that customers who have the newer "cable-ready" sets would not need converter boxes.

Currently the rate for cable TV in Tahoka is \$10.50 per month, plus \$2 for each extra connection. The \$2 charge for additional TV sets on the cable will remain the same, Strange said.

Strange said that if the proposed rate increase is approved, Signet plans to add Cable New Network (CNN), which gives news 24 hours a day; Nashville network, with all its programming either country-western music or programs about C-W personalities and events; Spanish International Network (SIN) with all programs in Spanish; and MTV, a channel which offers 24 hours a day of rock music video.

In other discussion of Signet's operations here, Strange said the company recently lost WGN-Chicago because that station "did not move to another satellite when all the others did." He said Signet still plans to get WGN back on the cable instead of WOR-New York, which has been on cable channel 3 for several weeks until equipment to recapture WGN is installed.

Council members noted that according to the franchise agreement between the city and Signet, a public hearing should be held on proposed increases. The public hearing is scheduled for Monday, Feb. 18, at 7 p.m. in the city hall, at which time members of the public are invited to be present to comment on Signet's plans.

Questioned by a council member as to whether the proposed changes would "mess up everybody's remote control devices like the Lubbock system has done," Strange said the TV remote controls would not work for the channels above 13.

Strange also said that if the new cable channels are added, the company plans to make available

Council members also voted unanimously Monday night to reject the latest proposal by First National Bank of Tahoka for a settlement of 1984 taxes at a figure less than had been paid under protest on that year's assessment.

School To Drop Tax On Vehicles

Tahoka School Board members, in a move they said is intended to provide a bit of tax relief in troubled economic times, voted last Wednesday to do away with the personal property tax in 1985. The tax is levied by the school district mostly on vehicles; the county and city do not tax autos and trucks.

The purpose of evaluating the performance of the superintendent (as school rules require each January), the board voted 5-1 to rehire Supt. Dale Summitt, who has been superintendent for just half a year, extending his contract for one year, through 1986-87.

A stock show policy which says that all students who attend stock shows must be passing all subjects and that their attendance may not violate the 10-days-absences rule was approved unanimously by the board.

Business manager Loretta Tekell reported a balance in tax collections on Jan. 30 were 69.9 per cent complete and totaled \$566,214.

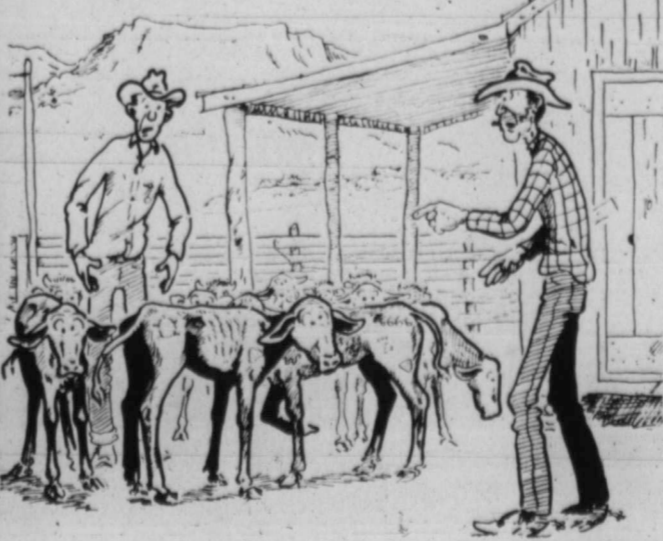

Tahoka Junior High basketball boys teams have closed out their season, with the seventh grade team winding up with 5-3 mark and the eighth grade 3-5.

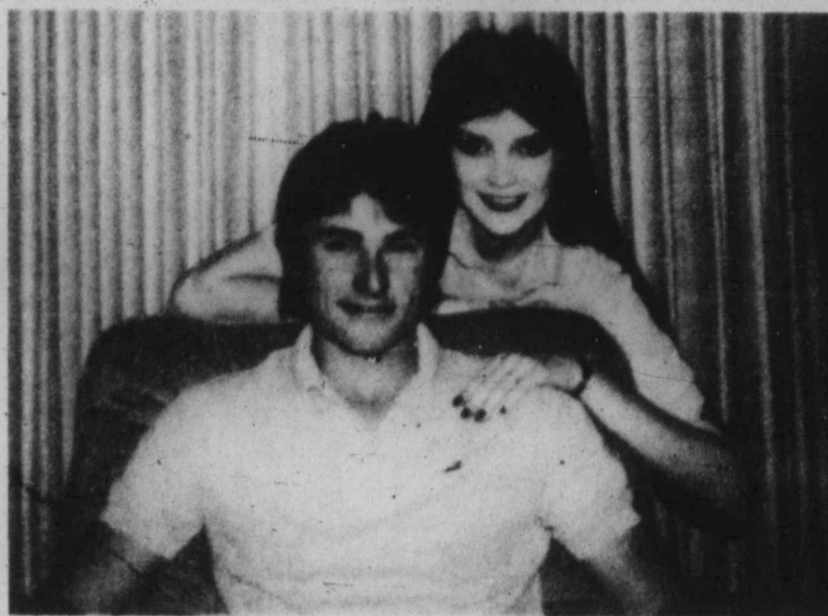

Work On Highway South Of Tahoka Set

Work is to begin this month on raising the surface of a section of U.S. Highway 87 six miles south of Tahoka. Brownfield Resident Engineer Herschel "Doc" Brown of the State Department of Highways and Public Transportation will supervise the work which will be done by Thornburg Inc. of Amarillo.

The half mile section of the highway will be raised to deal with flooding problems. "The roadway has flooded two or three times in the last four years", said Brown. "That's a problem because U.S. 87 is one of the most heavily traveled roads in our 17-county Lubbock District. What the contractor for the project will do is raise the surface of the roadway about

two-and-a-half feet." Once work is underway, traffic will be detoured through the construction area. The contractor will work on one side of the divided highway at a time. The contractor has 90-working days to complete the work. Total cost of the project will be \$488,185.

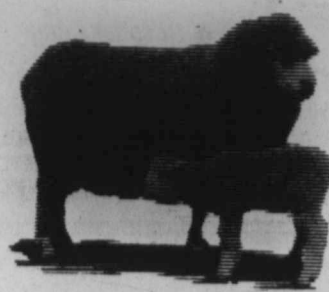

Powder burns on the left hand verified the above fact, according to the officers. Patterson carried a gun with him in his duties as a Lubbock County Sheriff's department jail officer and registered nurse.

Patterson was staying at his parents' home in Tahoka while he was recuperating from a lengthy illness and surgery.
