

## Little League Signup Slated Here Saturday

Signup for all boys and girls interested in playing Little League baseball and softball is scheduled this Saturday, March 23, from 10 a.m. to 6 p.m. at the Tahoka Community Center, S. 1st and Ave. K.

The league, open to all residents of the county, requires a registration fee of \$10 per player, and youngsters should also bring a copy of their birth certificate, unless one has already been filed with the league.

Bob Lamp, league president, said there will be "T-Ball" for 6-7 year-old boys and girls, minor league for those 8 and 9, and major league for 10-12 year-olds. New additions to the program this year will be girls softball for ages 9-12 and senior league baseball for 13-15 year-olds. The league is open to boys and girls alike, except softball is restricted to girls only. The age for league play is whatever age the player will be on July 31.

## Kindergarten Pre-Registration Planned

Friday, March 29, Tahoka's Tubb Elementary School will have the annual kindergarten pre-registration program at 2:30 p.m. in the cafeteria. This program will be for the purpose of registering the kindergarten students for 1985-86 term.

The parents who come should bring a birth certificate and a record of the child's immunizations. With these items the child will actually be registered for school. To be given out at the program will be a list of

## No Water Rate Hike Planned

The Tahoka city council discussed water, sewer and sanitation pickup rates Monday night and decided that no increase in those fees would be needed at this time.

The discussion also involved the budget, with members looking at predicted expenditures and income. Although expenses of operating the water-sewer department have increased—and funding of those operations is supposed to come from revenues generated in the department—council members felt that the city could hold off on increasing the fees for at least several months.

Mayor Pro Tem Jim Solomon presided in the absence of Mayor Mel Leslie. All other councilmen except Dalton Wood were present.

City Manager Carl Reynolds advised the group that absentee balloting began Monday in the city election scheduled April 6.

## WOODWORK

BY DALTON



TO ACTUALLY TELL the truth, I am better at splitting infinitives than at splitting logs. I knew this all the time, but it was brought home to me with renewed emphasis when I tried to split some logs I had cut with my trusty little chain saw.

It only costs about twice as much for firewood when you cut your own as it does when you buy it off a truck, but that's another story. What I want to deal with here is the fact that when you cut down a tree, part of it usually is too large to get into the average fireplace, much less burn. So when you have it all sawed up into the proper lengths, you get two or three of these 3-pound wedges and an 8-pound maul (a sledgehammer with a pointy side) and if you drive all those wedges into the wood at the proper angle, and hit it enough times with the maul, the log splits down the grain and you have two pieces more manageable and burnable than the one you started with.

If you drop one of the wedges on your foot, it hurts like...it hurts a lot. If you miss the wedge with the maul and on your follow-through it glances off your ankle, it also

causes some re-evaluation of that day's priorities.

I have done both of those things. And even at best, when you place the wedges in the proper place and strike them squarely every time, it's hard work. It only takes me about 10 minutes to get through using a maul and wedges, even if there are 35 more logs waiting to be split.

I have heard of electric log-splitters and I have seen on the late show advertisements of splitters which simply and with almost no effort split the heaviest logs. I seriously doubt they would work that easily; but if they really do, I'm a good prospect for a sale. They probably cost about the same as a cord of wood.

The bride-elect is a graduate of Tahoka High School. The groom is a graduate of Plainview High School.

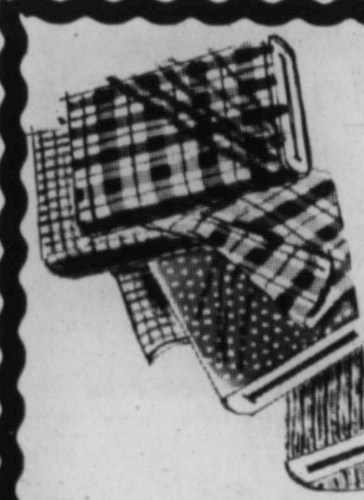
