## County Approves Budget, Holds Line On Tax Rate

Lynn County Commissioners Monday approved a budget for 1986 calling for expenditures less than the amount being spent this year, but set the same tax rate as the present, just under 27 cents per \$100 valuation.

The budget calls for spending \$1,230,437 in 1986, compared to \$1,315,783 in 1985, but the 1985 expenditures include a capital outlay of \$179,224, compared to a projected \$53,771 capital outlay for 1986.

Anticipated revenue for 1986 has been projected at \$1,235,529 with \$615,912 expected from tax collections based on 90 per cent of taxes billed.

Tax rate is 26.63 cents per \$100 valuation.

Before the budget was approved unanimously by the commissioners, the annual amount provided to the Soil Conservation Service was increased to \$1500 from \$1000. Representatives of the SCS had appeared before the group earlier in the day.

Also appearing to request a budget increase was Sheriff Stanley Krause, who said more money would be needed for salaries because of a new law which requires weekly overtime pay for law enforcement officers. Commissioners took no action on that request.

After approving payment of bills and reports of county officials, the group voted to accept a bid of \$8750 by McCord Motor Co. for a new pickup for Precinct 1. Commissioners then approved purchase of new radar equipment by use by Dept. of Public Safety officers in Lynn County, a move which will cost \$2,995 difference after two older pieces of equipment are traded in.

Treasurer Cindy Bryan discussed a new state law regarding fund deposits, and the commissioners then voted to require department heads to

make daily deposits of funds. Commissioners authorized County Judge J.F. Brandon to negotiate for a new lawn mower.

The Lubbock architects' firm of McLarty, Smith and Meyer was retained for planning on re-

novation and installation of an elevator in the courthouse. It has been estimated that project will be finished in the summer of 1986.

Present were commissioners Bart Anderson, J.T. Miller, Boyd Barnes and Eldon Gattis.

## Hensley Retires As Head Of Lyntegar Board Here

G.Q. Hensley retired as a board member and as president of the board of Lyntegar Electric Cooperative, Inc. at the Aug. 13 board meeting which was also the date of the 47th Annual Membership Meeting. This year marks 42 years of service for Hensley as a member of the Board of Directors. He served as Secretary-Treasurer for 31 years and as President for the past 11 years. He was appointed to the board on Sept. 13, 1943 and elected to serve as secretary-treasurer at that time. He held that office until he was elected president of the board on Sept. 10, 1974 and had served in that capacity until his retirement.

Hensley is a longtime resident of Lynn County. He and his wife, Virginia, live on their farm north of Draw where they farmed for several years.

"Directors, management and employees will all miss the wise judgment G.Q. has shared with us these past 42 years. We all extend our congratulations and appreciation to Mr. Hensley for his years of service," a Lyntegar spokesman said.

Lyntegar sponsored its annual barbecue and meeting of shareholders at the Tahoka High School football field Tuesday evening, with the usual large crowd attending.

Earl Brown was re-elected for

another term on the board of directors and Marlin Hawthorne was elected to succeed Hensley on the board.

It was reported that approximately \$620,000 was paid in dividends this year to members of the cooperative.

## Chase, Altercation Lead To Arrests

Tahoka police arrested five persons during the early morning hours on Friday for assorted charges that include one charge each for evading arrest, public intoxication, assault on a police officer, loud and profane and hindering arrest.

The incident started on east Lockwood as patrolmen noticed two cars drag racing into town. Police pursued one vehicle which tried to elude them by running several stop signs and finally stopped at a residence. At this point, only the driver of the vehicle would cooperate with police instructions but the two passengers would not. Three bystanders also were arrested including one woman. Approximately 30 people were "standing around" and would do little to aid the police, although two officers were struck, according to the police report. All five suspects were booked and transported to Lynn County jail.

Jerry and Janie Isbell of 2023 N. 7th reported to police on Saturday that someone had stolen a 16-inch chain saw and assorted lariat ropes and luggage

from their garage.

On Monday, Marty and Mitchell Hammons reported to police that while they were at football practice, articles were stolen from their Chevrolet pickup, which was parked at the high school parking lot. Reported missing were one checkbook, one Igloo armrest cooler, assorted pens, a fishing knife, keys to a co-op gas pump and 15-20 cassette tapes.

An accident was investigated on Saturday at the 1700 block of Ave. N that involved a 1978 Oldsmobile driven by Sotero (Jack) Benevides, Jr. of Tahoka and a parked 1985 Chevrolet owned by Jessie N. Wheeler of Slaton. No injuries were reported.

Tickets issued during the past week include one each for negligent collision and leaving scene of an accident, running red light, exhibition of acceleration, failure to yield right of way, negligent collision and failure to stop and leave information, negligent collision and no liability insurance, and one ticket for racing and speeding.

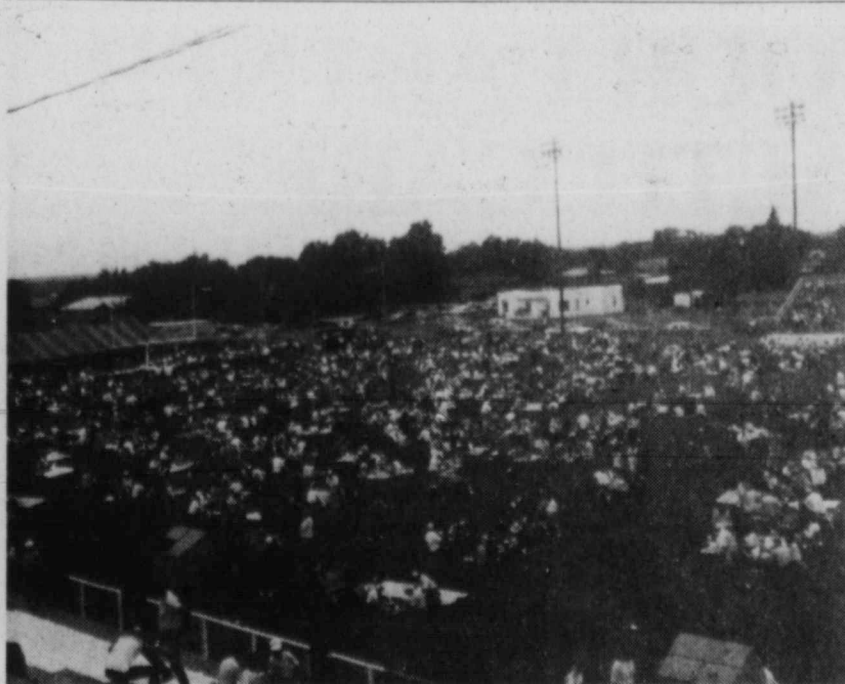
