

## **County Approves Budget**, **Holds Line On Tax Rate**

Lynn County Commissioners Monday approved a budget for 1986 calling for expenditures less than the amount being spent this year, but set the same tax rate as the present, just under 27 cents per \$100 valuation.

The budget calls for spending \$1,230,437 in 1986, compared to \$1,315,783 in 1985, but the 1985 expenditures include a capital outlay of \$179,224, compared to a projected \$53,771 capital outlay for 1986.

Anticipated revenue for 1986 has been projected at \$1,235,529 with \$615,912 expected from tax collections based on 90 per cent of taxes billed.

Tax rate is 26.63 cents per \$100 valuation.

Before the budget was approved unanimously by the commissioners, the annual amount provided to the Soil conservation Service was increased to \$1500 from \$1000. Representatives of the SCS had appeared before the group earlier in the day.
