Over \$6,000 Raised At Fun-Food Fest

The seventh annual Fun and Food Festival, sponsored by the Lynn County Hospital Auxiliary, raised about \$6,700 in funds for the hospital this year. Proceeds from the food and auction sales at last Saturday's event will go towards the purchase of a fetal heart monitor, which the Auxiliary has priced at about \$9,500. Last year the Festival raised about \$7,500 for hospital projects.

"Although funds raised were not enough to purchase the monitor, we were pleased with the amounts donated, especially in the hard times so many are experiencing now," said an Auxiliary representative. The group plans to raise more funds from other sources in order to acquire the monitor.

A blood drive which was planned, but canceled, at the Festival will be held in the near future, according to the Hospital Auxiliary.

All area citizens with an interest in air transportation and airport development are invited to attend.

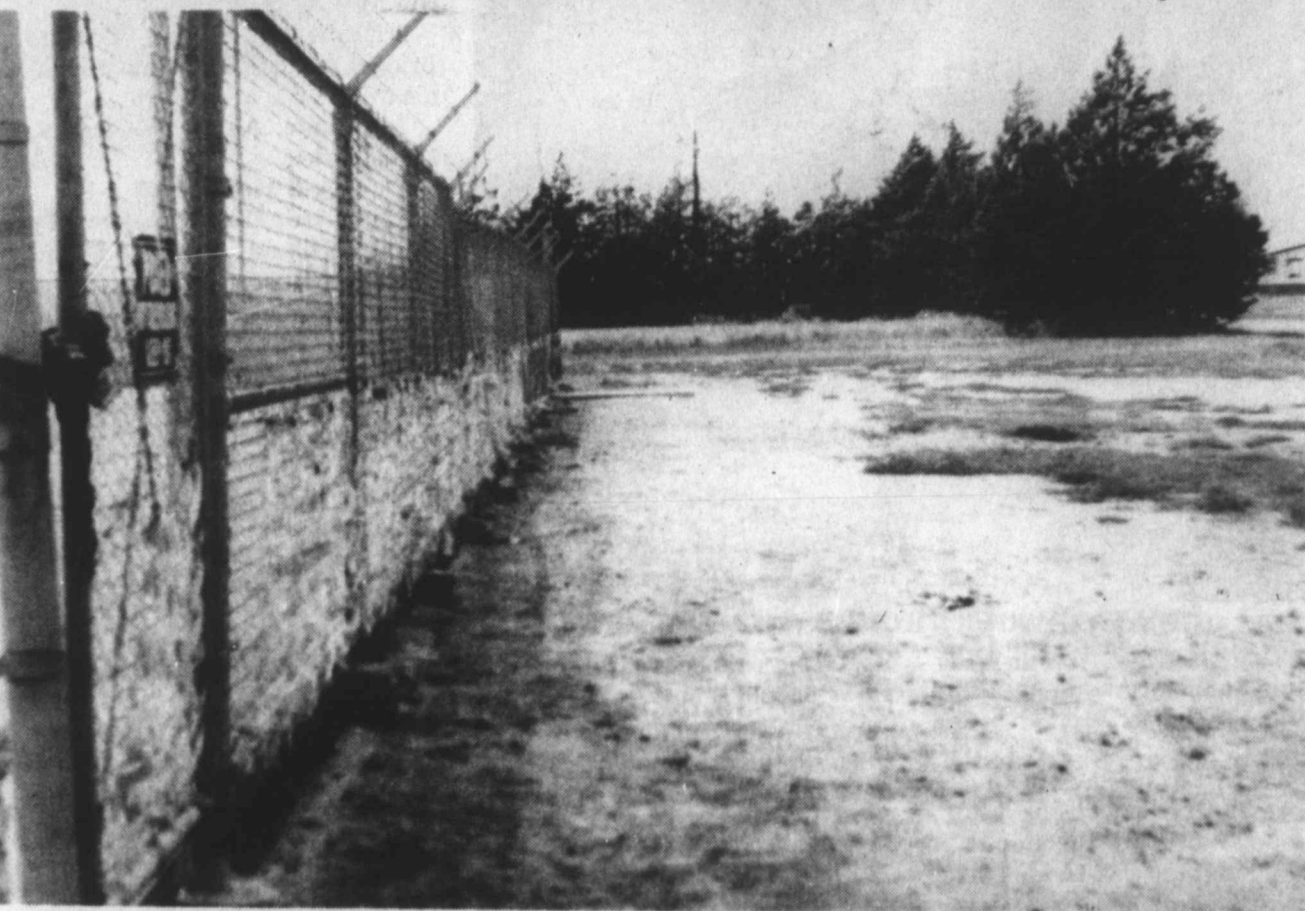
WOODWORK BY DALTON

Paving Around Ball Park Planned By City

The City of Tahoka will pave streets adjacent to the Little League ball park in the south part of town and also will do some paving on the parking lot of the city swimming pool, it was announced this week.

The projects will be paid for by government grant money left over from a Community Development Block Grant which was used to pave many streets in the south and east parts of the city. About \$80,000 was left over after all the approved projects were finished, and usually a left-over portion is returned to the state, according to city

officials. Tahoka applied to use the money in the south city park area and were advised last week that the city can do this.

"We have to use the money exactly as approved; we can't just use it for anything," said Mayor Jim Solomon. "But it certainly will improve the area around the ball parks and the swimming pool, and it won't cost the city or the taxpayers anything."

City officials Tuesday looked over the areas where the bids will be sought, conferring with consulting engineer A.C. Bowden on the projects.

Suspect In Wilson Area Burglary Is Charged

A suspect was arrested and charged in the burglary of a barn 3 miles southeast of Wilson during the last week, and most of the \$25,000 worth of tools stolen at the farm were recovered.

The farm is owned by Bruce Hewlett of Slaton. Arrested by sheriff's deputies in Wilson after a tip and charged with burglary of a building was Domingo Rios, 20, of Wilson. He was jailed in lieu of \$25,000 bond set by Justice of the Peace H.W. Edwards.

Crime Line, 998-5145, is offering two new rewards this week. One is for \$300 for information leading to clearing of burglaries at T-Bar Country Club and T-Bar airport on the night of May 6, and a subsequent theft of gasoline at the airport Sunday night. City police who investigated the airport break-ins and county officers who are working on the country club

break-in believe they are related.

At the country club's clubhouse Thursday night intruders took a portable television set, two cartons of cigarettes, about \$2 in change from a vending machine and one box of butterfly golf balls.

A reward of \$200 is offered in the theft of two air conditioners, one evaporative and one refrigerated, from a house 7 miles northeast of New Home, owned by Ophelia Davis of Lubbock.

Police investigated the theft at the T-Bar Airport on Sunday night where approximately 30 gallons of fuel had been stolen. Two locks had been reportedly broken on the pump switches.

Police reported that someone had run over a gas meter at Neely Brooks Trucking located at North 7th and Main Street in Tahoka.

Police also had two DWI arrests during the past week and a Tahoka man was arrested on a warrant for a firearms violation during the past week.

Police investigated two separate cases of criminal mischief reported by Venture Foods during the past week including one case of shoplifting and another case of failure to pay for gasoline. Both incidents have been cleared by police suspects responsible have agreed to restitution.

Also jailed during the week were one person each for burglary of a building, speeding and failure to appear, and possession of an unlawful weapon, reportedly a sawed-off shotgun.

The sheriff's office reported they have been contacted by the National Weather Service in Lubbock regarding a public program the NWS plans to present in Tahoka on June 8 at 7 p.m. on storms and tornado alerts and procedures. Place of the meeting will be announced later, but Sheriff Clifford Laws said he wanted the public to be advised, since the meeting is for everyone.

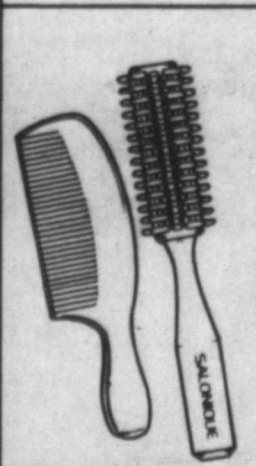

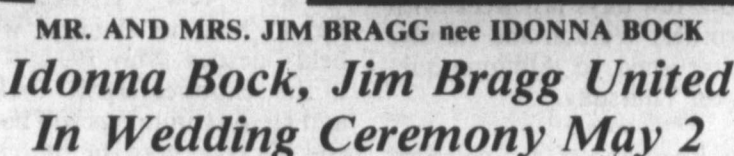

A Visit With Your County Agent

PRODUCERS INVITED TO INSECT SCOUTING WORKSHOP

Cotton, corn and sorghum producers in the Panhandle and South Plains are again receiving a special invitation to take part in the annual High Plains Insect Scout Training Workshop to increase the effectiveness of their pest management programs.

The first of two workshop sessions will focus on early and mid-season pests and will be held Tuesday, June 2, at the Hale County Agricultural Center in Plainview. The center is on U.S. 87 Business Route south of the city.

The second workshop is scheduled July 7 in Plainview and will cover mid to late-season crop pests.

The workshop conducted by the Texas Agricultural Extension Service, was first held in 1973 to train scouts in the pest management programs conducted by Extension, part of the Texas A&M University System.

In subsequent years, it has expanded to include scouts employed by consultants, aerial applicators and others, as well as producers who want to learn how to scout their own fields for insects. The workshop focuses on perfecting skills in identifying crop pests and making timely pest management decisions which can protect investments and yield, and hold down production costs.

The workshop will begin at 8:30 a.m. with Dr. James Leser, Extension entomologist, outlining the scope of the training. General concepts of pest management and sampling will be discussed by Dr. William P. Mor-

rison, Extension entomologist. Aspects of pesticide safety will also be presented.

Leser will open the cotton pest section with information on thrips and the growth and development of cotton plants. Cotton fleahoppers will be discussed by Mark Brown, Extension Agent-Entomology headquartered at Crosbyton.

Greg Cronholm and Allen Knutson, Extension Agents-Entomology in Plainview and Dimmitt, will provide information on early and mid-season pests of sorghum and corn.

The workshop will conclude at noon with a hands-on session in which participants will learn how to determine the percent square set on potted cotton plants and will identify insect specimens. Handouts will be available.
