Over \$6,000 Raised At **Fun-Food Fest**

The seventh annual Fun and Food Festival, sponsored by the Lynn County Hospital Auxiliary, raised about \$6,700 in funds for the hospital this year. Proceeds from the food and auction sales at last Saturday's event will go towards the purchase of a fetal heart monitor, which the Auxiliary has priced at about \$9,500. Last year the Festival raised about \$7,500 for hospital proiects.

"Although funds raised were not enough to purchase the monitor, we were pleased with the amounts donated, especially in the hard times so many are experiencing now," said an Auxiliary representative. The group plans to raise more funds from other sources in order to acquire the monitor.

A blood drive which was planned, but canceled, at the Festival will be held in the near future, according to the Hospital Auxiliary.

Paving Around Ball Park Planned By City

The City of Tahoka will pave streets adjacent to the Little League ball park in the south part of town and also will do some paving on the parking lot of the city swimming pool, it was announced this week.

The projects will be paid for by government grant money left over from a Community Development Block Grant which was used to pave many streets in the south and east parts of the city. About \$80,000 was left over after all the approved projects were finished, and usually a left-over portion is returned to the state, according to city

officials. Tahoka applied to use the money in the south city park area and were advised last week that the city can do this.

"We have to use the money exactly as approved; we can't just use it for anything," said Mayor Jim Solomon. "But it certainly will improve the area around the ball parks and the swimming pool, and it won't cost the city or the taxpayers anything.'

City officials Tuesday looked over the areas where the bids will be sought, conferring with consulting engineer A.C. Bowden on the projects.



ONE OF THE REASONS I don't ordinarily look up things that happened years ago in our newspaper files is because when I do, I usually get sidetracked by things I see in the old papers, because reading old newspapers (from 20 years or more ago) is fascinating to most folks.

First of all, the advertisements are really different, especially the prices (like new cars in 1935 for about \$795, or new shirts for 39 cents).

Then there are the stories of things like "Ludie Jones carried her mother to Lubbock last Friday." Stout girl, Ludie.

The late Frank Hill, longtime publisher of the Lynn County News and a history buff, left us a file of his notes and clippings on Lynn County football teams, mainly Wilson and Tahoka. Among the items is a photograph of someone who was a member of the first football team ever in Tahoka, in 1923, according to Frank's notes. It also notes on the back of the picture that this is either Sam Floyd or Robert Noble. Whoever it was, he looks like a tough customer in the

really strange uniform of that day, big thigh pads, tiny shoulder pads and thin helmet. He also looks about 30 years old.

A 1927 issue of the Lynn County News notes that 1,526 airplanes had been built in the U.S. in the first 11 months of that year and says "the time may come when every enterprising family will own an airplane. It seems to be the only possible rival in sight to the automobile." In that same issue, someone from Wilson was wanting to sell a 1926 Ford touring car, and was willing to take a mule as part payment, ready, no doubt, to get back to basic transportation.

Just for curiosity, I looked in our files to see if my birthday in 1928 in Denton County was properly reported in Tahoka, and sure enough, it wasn't. The closest issue to my birthday on file noted that Tahoka was suffering from a flu epidemic, and that the newspaper's foreman, the same Frank Hill mentioned above, "is in bed with the malady. Not only is he sick, but his wife and baby are sick."
