Burglaries Investigated By Officers

Burglary of a residence north of New Home and a break-in at a Tahoka business were reported to law enforcement officers during the last week.

The most recent burglary reported was at Lynco Automotive Tuesday night, with few details available early Wednesday as investigation had just started.

The Herchel Upchurch residence a mile north of New Home was burglarized Saturday, Oct. 10, between 7:30 and 9:30 p.m. when entry was gained by prying open a back door. Missing were a Philco VCR, two portable radio-stereo players and "a pillow case with a lion on it." Total value of the stolen articles was listed at \$610.

Crime Line, 998-5145, is offering a \$500 reward in the Upchurch burglary case, and a \$300 reward for information on a purse reported missing from the clubhouse at T-Bar Country Club. The purse owned by Kathy Welch of Amarillo reportedly contained credit cards and a diamond ring, boosting the estimated total loss to \$900. She said she left the purse in the clubhouse on Friday, Oct. 2.

Tahoka Police Dept. also investigated reports of forgeries of checks and a prescription.

Bulldogs Win, Now Face Tough Horses

The Tahoka Bulldogs used a good defense and touchdowns by Fullback Rusty Jennings and running back John Aldous to blank Ralls 14-0 Friday night and evening their season record at 3-3 and boosting the district mark to 3-0.

The Dogs have little time to celebrate, however, as the potent Shallowater Mustangs are headed for Tahoka this

Friday night. Shallowater, New Deal and Tahoka are at the top of the district standings with equal 3-0 marks. Last week, Shallowater blasted previously unbeaten Spur 44-13 and the week before that Spur had beaten Ralls 13-0.

For the year, Shallowater is 5-1, while New Deal is 6-0, most recently having beaten Morton 54-0.

Shallowater has one of the area's top running backs in Johnny Revilla.

Tahoka got on the scoreboard in the first period at Ralls when Jennings ran 25 yards for a touchdown and Tackle George Morin kicked the point to make it 7-0. For the night, Jennings gained 103 yards in just 12 attempts.

Although Tahoka missed several good chances to score, they were unable to push it across any more until the third quarter. But the defense, led by Jennings, Shannon Clift, Bobby Gonzales, Jim Patterson and James Antu, kept Ralls in check.

In the third period, Aldous took a nice pass from Ramiro Rodriguez 35 yards for another Tahoka TD, with Morin again adding the extra point.

Rodriguez completed 5 of 12 passes for 132 yards, with the biggest one a 57-yarder to End Kurt Bryan in the fourth period. Bryan was caught from behind and Tahoka could not score on that chance, either.

Sheriff Laws Endorses Associate Member Program

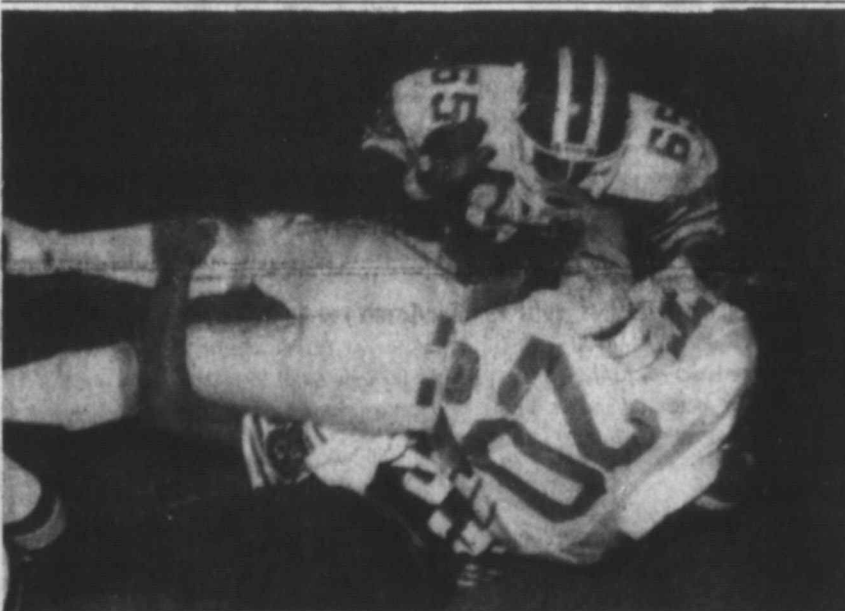

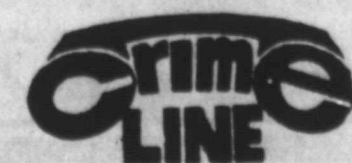

New Home Routs Eagles, 53-6

The New Home Leopards had an easy time Friday night as their defense swarmed all over the Three Way Eagles for a 53-6 District 1-A win at Leopard Stadium. The game was called on the second play of the third quarter due to the six-man 45 point rule as New Home defensive back John Lott intercepted an Eagle pass and ran 20 yards for a touchdown. The win gives New Home a 6-0 mark overall and a 4-0 district record.

New Home Head Coach George Deck indicated that it was the Leopard defense that dictated the outcome by using a two and three-man rush limiting Three Way's total offense to 25 yards on 26 plays.

"We kind of put something special in for this game," Deck said. "A lot of teams are scared to rush more than one person at the spread (offense).

"But we felt the key to beating Three Way was beating their best athlete, (quarterback) Saul Guillen. We wanted to contain him, make him throw the ball sooner than he wanted to and make him scramble the way we wanted him to go, not the way he wanted to go."

After a 20-0 lead at the end of the first quarter, New Home added 27 points before the half including scoring a 34-yard pass from Lloyd Caballero to Leo Torres, a 12-yard Darrell Paul run for TD, a 14-yard pass from Caballero to Gaylon Paul and another 36-yard run by Paul for TD.

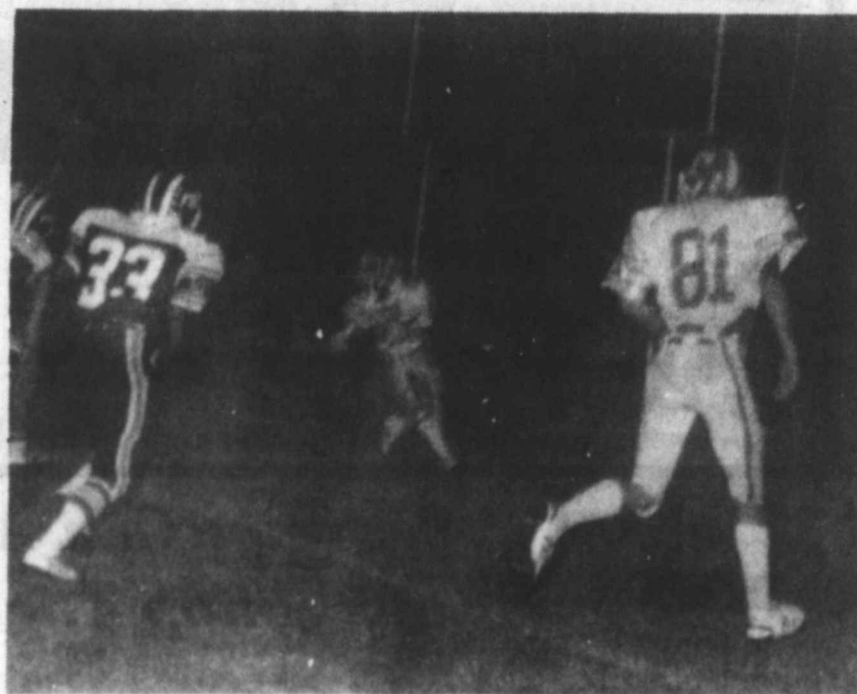
