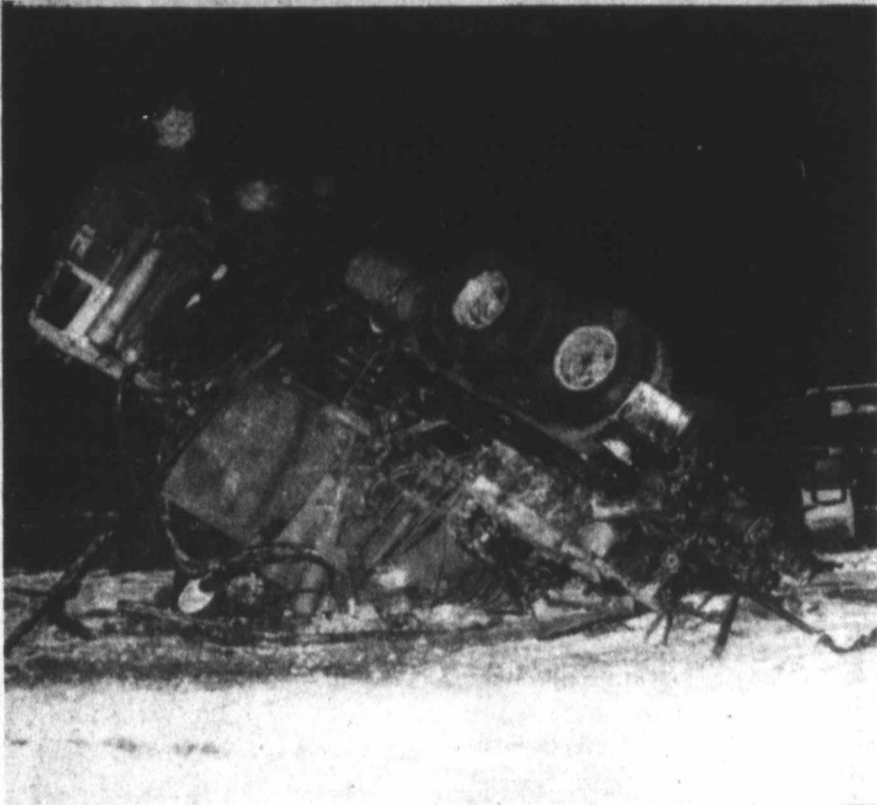

Wilson Girls Win, Advance To Playoffs

Wilson High School's varsity girls basketball team came back with a big fourth quarter surge to beat Meadow 64-62 in a district playoff game at Brownfield Tuesday night.

Lora Schneider scored 16 points to lead the Wilson girls, including two free throws with just 9 seconds left in the game.

Wilson and Meadow tied for the District 11-A title during the regular season. With the win, the girls raised their record to 23-4 for the year and now will play the District 12 runners-up in the first round of the state playoffs, while Meadow will play the winner of that district.

Meadow led 54-50 midway through the fourth quarter before Wilson rallied. For Wilson, Webb scored 12 points, Garcia 14, Bishop and Arrellano 11 each.

Burglaries In City, County Investigated

Crime Line, 998-5145, has offered a \$500 reward in the case.

Mike Heath of GTE in Tahoka reported to police on Feb. 3 that persons unknown had broken a window on the left side of his 1987 Dodge cargo van and had stolen a blue test set valued at \$300, with damage to the vent glass set at \$35. Investigation continues in this case.

Grand champion barrow was shown by Jay Forsythe of Tahoka, and the reserve grand champion was exhibited by Amos Barton of O'Donnell.

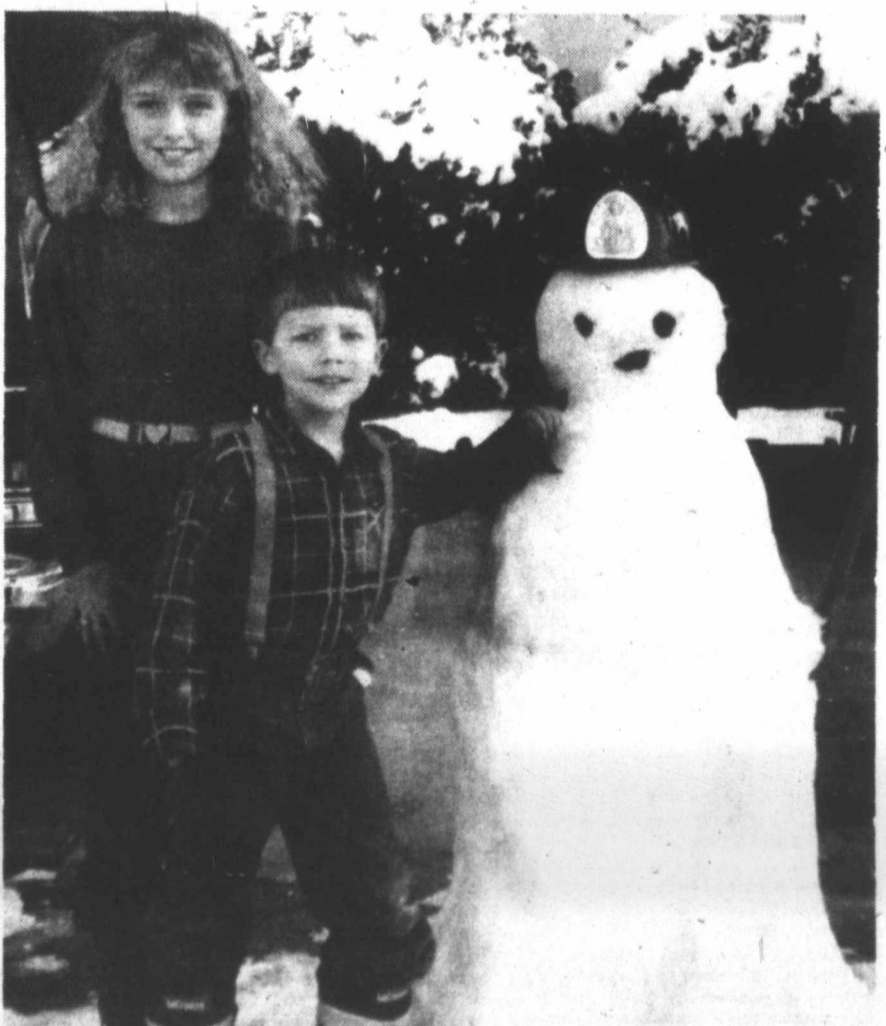
In the baked goods division, Kris Belew had the grand champion with yeast bread, and Misty Nance of Tahoka had the reserve grand champion with a cake.

Low Averages Again Cost Bulldog Boys

The Tahoka Bulldogs shot just 31 percent from the field against Crosbyton Tuesday night and went down 59-46 in the district game, their 20th loss of the year against 3 wins.

Coach Ron Yancy said the team is playing pretty well defensively, but lamented the poor shooting, mentioning something about the board side of a barn. Ramiro Rodriguez scored 16 points and Chuck Cate 14 against the Chieftains.

Also last week, Tahoka lost to Spur 51-41 as Jim Patterson led Bulldog scoring with 10 points and the team shot 21 per cent from the field. Jody Woodard had 10 rebounds in the game.

Tahoka varsity girls continued a pattern of leading for awhile and then losing the game by a

small margin in the last half. They led Crosbyton 39-37 at halftime, but went down 69-64 for 10th loss of the year as opposed to 14 wins. This was despite 37 points by Shannon Lawson and 21 by Tesha Hood.

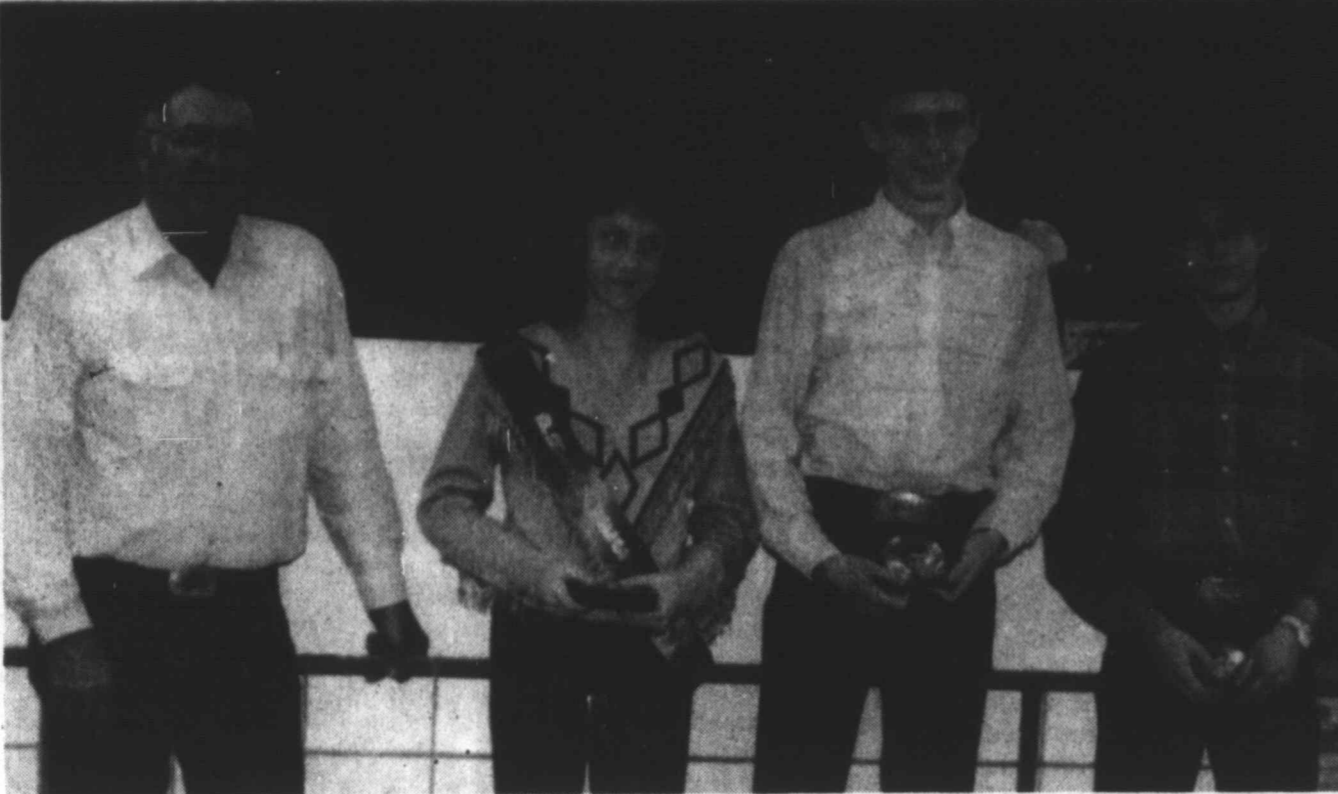

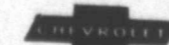

Isn't it a pleasure to spend \$100 and have to borrow \$149.47 to do so? Oh, yes--there will also be \$5.93 interest on the \$49.47, making a grand total of \$155.40.

ORDINANCE NO. 85

An ordinance providing for the abatement and removal of junk vehicles, or parts of junk vehicles as public nuisance from property, both private and public, or public rights-of-way by providing for notice, public hearings and removal; repealing ordinances in conflict therewith and providing for severability, providing publication, and providing an effective date.

WHEREAS, Article 4477-9(a) now defines junk motor vehicles and declare such to be public nuisances, and

WHEREAS, Section 5109 of such article permits a city to adopt procedures for the abatement and removal of a junk vehicle or part thereof as a public nuisance, now therefore be it ordained by the City Commission of the City of Wilson, Texas:

Section 1. **Notice for nuisance on private property:** Whenever a junk motor vehicle is located upon private premises, a notice to abate, stating the nature of the nuisance, shall be served upon the registered owner of the vehicle, the occupant of the premises where upon such public nuisance exists, and any lienholder, by certified mail with a five (5) day return receipt request attached thereto. If the notice is returned undelivered by the United States Post Office, official action to abate such nuisance shall be continued to a date not less than ten (10) days from the return of such notice.

Section 2. **Notice to abate on public property:** Whenever a junk vehicle is located upon public property, a notice to abate stating the nature of the nuisance, shall be served upon the registered owner, any lienholder, and the owner or occupant of the public premises or the owner or occupant of the premises adjacent to the public right-of-way upon which the public nuisance exists, by certified mail with a five (5) day return receipt request attached thereto. If the notice is returned undelivered by the United States Post Office, official action to abate such nuisance shall be continued to a date not less than ten (10) days from the return of such notice.

Section 3. **Request for hearing:** The notice of either public or private property shall notify the recipient of the notice of a public hearing before the City Judge upon request made to the Judge within ten (10) days after service of notice to abate the nuisance. Any order entered by the Judge requiring the removal of a vehicle or vehicle parts must include a description of the vehicle and the correct ID Number and license number of the vehicle if the information is available at the site. If removal is ordered by the City Judge, the order shall contain a directive to a regularly salaried full time employee of the City to secure the removal of the vehicle and to dispose of it pursuant to Article 4477-9(a) of the Texas Civil Statutes, except that the actual removal may be by any person duly authorized by such City employee.

Section 4. **Notice to State Dept. of Highways and Public Transportation:** Not later than the fifth day after the date of removal such city employee shall give notice to the State Department of Highways and Public Transportation of such removal for the purposes of cancellation of the Certificate of Title.

Section 5. In addition to those exceptions provided by state law, this ordinance shall not apply to a vehicle or portion thereof that is:

- a. Lawfully situated within a building; or solid fence.
- b. Situated on private property as inventory of a vehicle dealer or automobile wrecking yard.

Section 6. **Severability:** Should any section, phrase, or word of this Ordinance be declared to be unconstitutional or invalid, such shall not affect the remaining portions of this Ordinance which shall continue in full force and effect. All other ordinances in conflict herewith are repealed inclusive of the entire terms of any Ordinances passed before.

Section 7. **Publication:** The City Secretary is hereby directed to publish this Ordinance by publication one (1) time in a newspaper of general circulation.

According to the American Cancer Society, one out of ten women in the United States will develop breast cancer sometime in her lifetime. It is currently estimated that over 37,000 women die each year as the result of breast cancer.

Ninety percent of breast cancers are diagnosed by women or their physicians finding a lump in the breast. Women who are diagnosed with a lump large enough to feel have a 50 percent five year survival rate. A woman who is diagnosed as having breast cancer by mammography, before a lump can be felt, has a 97% five year survival rate and a 90% 10-year survival rate.

A mammogram can detect a cancer this small, even before it can be felt.

Appointments can be made by calling 998-4533. The Mobile Breast Cancer Detection Unit will be in Tahoka on Monday, March 7, 1988.

The American Cancer Society has established guidelines for mammography in asymptomatic women. (Women who have no symptoms of disease). Those guidelines have been adopted by the American Academy of Family Physicians, American College of Obstetricians and Gynecologists, and The American College of Radiology. Those guidelines are:

- I. 35-40 years of age - One baseline mammogram.
- II. 40-50 years of age - A mammogram every 1-2 years depending on breast type and risk factor.
- III. 50 years of age and over - An annual physical examination and annual mammogram.
- IV. Asymptomatic women under 50 years of age with significant high risk factors should be examined at appropriate intervals. These risk factors include previous breast cancer and family history of cancer.

V. A symptomatic woman should have a mammogram at any age when she experiences a mass, nipple discharge, skin changes or unexplained breast pain.

A screening mammogram is an x-ray of the breast using extremely low dosages of radiation (usually comparable to dental x-rays) and is designed to find very early cancers.

A female technologist who is highly trained in mammography will perform the examination.

The charge for the screening mammogram is \$50.00. The Unit accepts cash, check, Visa, MasterCard and American Express.
