


Wilson Girls Win, Advance To Playoffs

Lora Schneider scored 16 points to lead the Wilson girls, including two free throws with just 9 seconds left in the game.

Wilson and Meadow tied for the District 11-A title during the regular season. With the win, the girls raised their record to 23-4 for the year and now will play the District 12 runners-up in the first round of the state playoffs, while Meadow will play the winner of that district.



Low Averages **Again Cost Bulldog Boys**

The Tahoka Bulldogs shot just 31 percent from the field against Crosbyton Tuesday night and went down 59-46 in the district game, their 20th loss of the year against 3 wins.

Coach Ron Yancy said the team is playing pretty well defensively, but lamented the poor shooting, mentioning something about the board side of a barn. Ramiro Rodriguez scored 16 points and Chuck Cate 14 against the Chieftains.

Also last week, Tahoka lost to Spur 51-41 as Jim Patterson led Bulldog scoring with 10 points and the team shot 21 per cent from the field. Jody Woodard had 10 rebounds in the game.

Tahoka varsity girls continued a pattern of leading for awhile and then losing the game by a

small margin in the last half. They led Crosbyton 39-37 at halftime, but went down 69-64 for 10th loss of the year as opposed to 14 wins. This was despite 37 points by Shannon Lawson and 21 by Tesha Hood.

We now have 16 volunteers willing to serve the area. Each







According to the American Cancer Society, one out of ten women in the United States will develop breast cancer sometime in her lifetime. It is currently estimated that over 37,000 women die each year as the result of breast cancer.

Ninety percent of breast cancers are diagnosed by women or their physicians finding a lump in the breast. Wornen who are diagnosed with a lump large enough to feel have a 50 percent five year survival rate. A woman who is diagnosed as having breast cancer by mammography, before a lump can be felt, has a 97% five year survival rate and a 90% 10 year survival

A mammogram can detect a cancer this small, even before it can be felt.

The American Cancer Society has established guidelines for mammography in asymptomatic women. (Women who have no symptoms of disease). Those guidelines have been adopted by the American Academy of Family Physicians, American College of Obstetricians and Gynecologists, and The American College of

Radiology. Those guidelines åre: 1. 35-40 years of age - One baseline mammogram.

II. 40-50 years of age - A mammogram every 1-2 years depending on breast type and risk factor.

III. 50 years of age and over An annual physical examination and annual mammogram.

IV. Asymptomatic women under 50 years of age with significant high risk factors should be examined at appropriate intervals. These risk factors include previous breast cancer and family history of

V. A symptomatic woman should have a mammogram at any age when she experiences a mass, nipple discharge, skin changes or unexplained breast pain.

A screening mammogram is an x-ray of the breast using extremely low dosages of radiation (usually comparable to dental x-rays) and is designed to find very early cancers.

A female technologist who is highly trained in mammography will perform the examination.

The charge for the screening mammogram is \$50.00. The Unit accepts cash, check, Visa, Mastercard and American Express.




