ABOUT A MONTH AGO, State Comptroller Bob Bullock estimated that another $\$ 210$ million would be available fo state funding needs in the 1990-91 budget because he had underestimated the economic recovery of the state and there would be that much more in sales taxes than originally estimated.
He further confused the issue by saying such things as there now will be 3.8 billion more funds available thanthere were for the $88-89$ budget. and that the additional $\$ 2.2$ billion available as compared to earlier estimates was partly due to "legislative action" and partly due in reduction of reserves (by $\$ 416$ million) for lawsuits
In other words, the state is not figuring on losing too much in judgments on lawsuits. The $\$ 1.54$ billion resulting from "legislative action" probably means they sent all the legislators out one Saturday night to steal all the hubcaps, VCRs and firearms they could locate in Travis County.
(Actually he said later that "legislative action" referred to transfers of special funds into the general fund and "various bookkeeping procedures."
Personally I have a hard time understanding millions of dollars, much less billions. I can comprehend about how much money a thousand dollars is, and even have a pretty good idea of what it takes to make $\$ 10,000$. Probably about a trillion zillion dollars.
