I have a world map on the wall of my office, and certainly need it, because all too frequently new trouble spots are making the news and usually I have only a hazy idea of where all this mess is taking place.

And I suspect that most people are just as geographically ignorant as I am.

The last time I studied geography was in the fourth grade, when Turkey was called Babylon and New Deal was called Monroe, or something like that. And I don't think geography was one of my strong subjects.

Before last August, I thought Iraq was some kind of Chevrolet sports car. And during this last week, I had to locate Ethiopia, which sounds like an eye disease. After several minutes of searching, I finally located it just east of Sudan (Africa, not Lamb County).

Although I am not good at geography, or (sometimes) even which way is north, it never seems to be a problem for me when I'm driving, or even if I'm not, because there always seems to be someone around who's ready to tell me where to go.
