Spraying Rig Stolen In 1990 Recovered

A spray rig stolen in August 1990 from farmer Adrian Cook east of Tahoka was recovered this week by sheriff's officers who were notified when the present owner of the spray rig brought it to Wildcat Mfg., who manufactured the equipment, for service.

Deputies said the Crosby County farmer told them he had bought it at a farm sale, and investigation was continuing to try to trace who had brought it to the sale. The Wildcat rig is valued at more than \$4,000.

Tahoka Police Dept. investigated a report that a fire hose house at West Texas Industries had been smashed up, apparently by someone repeatedly running a vehicle into it.

Police also investigated an incident involving three females in an altercation on a convenience store parking lot Sunday.

In jail during the week were four persons for driving while intoxicated, two for DWI subsequent offense, one for driving while license suspended, two for making alcoholic beverage available to a minor, and one person each for possession of marijuana under four ounces, minor in possession of alcohol and theft over \$250 and less than \$20,000.

Many local business will observe the Fourth of July holiday on Monday, July 5. Businesses which will be closed that day include the post office, bank, county offices, and the Lynn County News, as well as many other local businesses.

OISD Hires New Girls Basketball Head Coach

O'Donnell I.S.D. Board of Trustees last week hired Jack Knowles of Munday as head girls basketball coach and junior high history teacher. Knowles replaces Mike Read, who was interim girls basketball coach this year, and who will continue to coach track and football for OISD.

Also hired was Bianca "Binky" Woodell, who will fill the position vacated by the resignation of Carletta Fitz.

O'Donnell Superintendent Dale Read informed the board that Dawson ISD officials had contacted him about the possibility of sharing their wealth with O'Donnell students, fulfilling the school finance bill referendum.

"We (OISD and Welch) have two or three options," said Read. "We could join with them and Union by consolidating tax bases and still keep three separate campuses, administration, everything. Or Dawson could just write us a check to educate 'x' number of students to get their numbers straight. This would benefit them also since they are interested in our insurance plan and could undersign with us."

Dawson County, along with other property wealthy schools in the area, must decide by August 1 whether they want their money to go to Austin, Lubbock, or a nearby property-poor school, such as O'Donnell.

Festivities for the Wilson Annual Fourth of July Community Celebration will begin at about 6 p.m. this Sunday, July 4, in the Wilson City Park. Area residents are invited to attend the celebration which will include games, food booths, dominoes, horseshoes, washer pitching, a dunking booth and other types of entertainment.

Live music will be provided

throughout the evening, and at dark, a dance will be held on the tennis courts. Music for the dance will be provided by the "Western Swingers," a group made up of local people, some of whom were previously members of the group known as "Slomotion."

There will be a \$3 per person, or \$5 per couple, admission fee to the dance. Proceeds from the dance will be donated to the Wilson Fire Department for needed equipment.

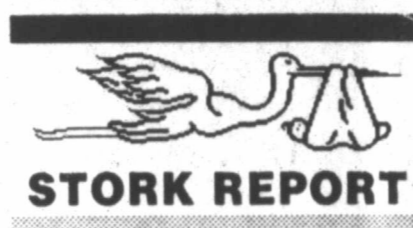

Wayne Huffaker Visits Legislators

Building relationships and discussing issues was the purpose of a trip to Washington, D.C. by two High Plains cotton producers according to Lubbock-based Plains Cotton Growers (PCG).

PCG President Wayne Huffaker, of Tahoka, and Secretary/Treasurer Jackie Burris, of Wellman, joined other members of the Texas cotton industry on the trip to Washington. Altogether Huffaker and Burris were able to participate in visits to 26 members of the Texas legislative delegation, including both Texas Senators. In addition they also found time to schedule meetings with Jesse Moore, Director of USDA's Agricultural Marketing Service Cotton Division, and Wayne Bjorlie, Head of USDA's Fiber and Rice Analysis Division.

Primary issues discussed with legislators included provisions of the just passed Senate budget reconciliation bill, Federal Crop Insurance, environmental legislation, disaster assistance for quality losses, plus the continuation of funding for

projects like boll weevil eradication and construction of the Plant Stress Lab on the Texas Tech University campus.

"Having the opportunity to sit down, face to face, with so many members of the Texas legislative delegation and discuss the issues important to cotton and agriculture as a whole made this week's trip a resounding success," states Huffaker. "Through this type of personal contact we can more effectively communicate the feelings of agriculture and the cotton industry to the people who vote on issues that affect us."

Burris agrees with Huffaker's assessment noting that the positive responses of the legislators carried over to the USDA personnel they also met with. Burris says the primary issues discussed with Mr. Moore and Mr. Bjorlie were related to the grading and classing of cotton and the process through which Commodity Credit Corporation Loan differentials will be computed in the future.

Both Huffaker and Burris are confident that the relationships built during the meetings, both new and old, will prove very beneficial to cotton producers on the High Plains and elsewhere in the future.

"There's just no substitute for a good one on one meeting to successfully get your point across," states Huffaker. "Each time we can sit down an talk with our Representatives and Senators we are cementing these relationships and that will help cotton producers down the road."

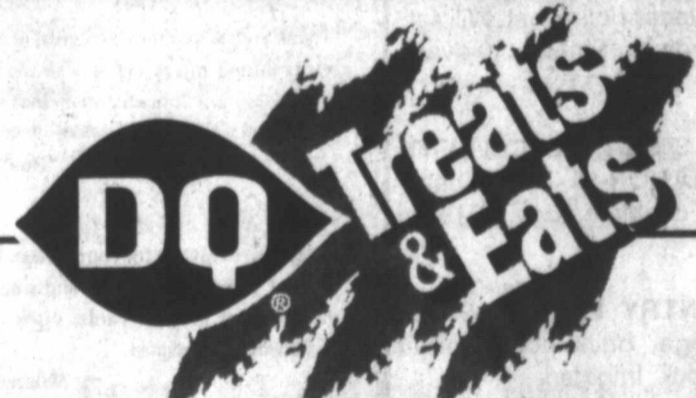
