

## Tahoka Still Looking For First Real Win

By DALTON WOOD The Tahoka Bulldogs continued o play pretty well especilly ond fense, but couldn't get cnough good things to happen to beat Whiteface last week, going down $20-0$, thanks mainly totwolong touchdown bombs by the Antelopes, who were playing

Tahoka did win a game last weck, hough, bringing their season record to 1-4, as Coahoma notified Tahoka
that they had usedan ineligible player against Tahokaand therefore forfecited the game, which now goes into the record book as a $1-0$ victory instead of a 55-2 loss.
Whiteface scored first when QB Cedric Chambers threw a long pass Oran Peden kicked the extra point. This score at $4: 46$ left in the first period was one of only two passes completed by the Antelopes in the game. The second one was almost an Roger Chavez for 53 yards in the
third quarter.
Tahoka threatened to score several times, and made some good defensive stands, but for the most part, the Bulldogs couldn't generate much
offense, having just six first downs in offense, having just six first downs in
the game. Twice in the game Tahoka at-

running try gained 6, but was fourth and 12 at Tahoka's own 43 in the
third quarter. Tahoka was down 13 at halftime and $20-0$ at the end of three.
