RC&D To Seek New Pagers For EMS, Fire Department

A grant search will be conducted by members of the Lynn County Committee of the Wes-Tex Resource **Conservation and Development** (RC&D) council for funds to buy 40 new pagers for use by Lynn County EMS personnel and Tahoka Volun-

teer Fire Department members.

In a meeting last Thursday morning, Jonama Allen and Steve Sanders, representing the EMS and fire department, presented a proposal to the RC&D members, asking for 40 two-tone voice pagers with alert monitor switches. "The pagers we have now are not dependable," said Mrs. Allen, speaking about the pagers currently used by EMS personnel. "Sometimes they work, and sometimes they don't ... they're about ten years old. People here need to know that we can be contacted in an emergency," she explained.

She said that the Lynn County EMS group had met with members of the local volunteer fire department in a joint effort to provide pagers for both groups, and determining which kind of pagers would work best for the emergency response teams. Currently, volunteer firemen are alerted by the fire whistle in town, and do not have pagers of any kind. "There are several areas in town where you can't hear the whistle, and we have several farmers on the fire department who are out in their fields, miles from town, and they can't hear the whistle either," explained Sanders. "Plus, when the whistle blows we have no idea if it's a wreck or a fire we are responding to, and how many people we'll need ... we just see who shows up. If we had voice pagers, we would be instantly aware of what type of emergency it is, and how many firemen were responding to the call," he added. Members of the RC&D voted unanimously to begin a grant search for funds for the pagers, estimated to cost approximately \$17,120. The grant search is conducted through RC&D channels, which operates under the auspices of the U.S. Soil Conservation Service. In other reports during the monthly RC&D meeting, Carolyn Klaus of Wilson reported that a grant sought for pagers for the Wilson Fire Department had been turned down by one corporation, but that the grant search would continue for funds. Other projects still pending in the grant search process include several projects for O'Donnell, including a new fire truck, swimming pool and community center renovation, and museum renovation. A project involving a retirement village in conjunction with Lynn County Hospital is still in the planning stages.

The annual meeting of the Wes-Tex RC&D will be hosted by Poka-Lambro Telephone Communications, Inc. on Thursday, April 28.

Anyone interested in economic development or other projects improving the standard of living for the good of Lynn County is invited to join the county RC&D group, with annual dues of \$25.

TO THE TAXPAYERS OF LYNN COUNTY HOSPITAL DISTRICT:

The Board of Directors of Lynn County Hospital District lends no credence to the letter circulated by the anonymous "Committee of Concerned Citizens". But, due to the fact that the misinformation has been so widely distributed recently by U.S. Mail, personal handouts, and personal telephone contacts, the Board is responding.

If the "Committee of Concerned Citizens" had wished to check the minutes of the board meetings, as allowed by the Texas Open Meetings Act, it would have saved a lot of hassle, bad feelings, damaged reputations, and cost of rebuttal, which is an added cost to the taxpayers.

HERE ARE THE FACTS:

The following are quotes from the minutes of the board meeting September 28, 1993:

"On September 28, 1993, the Board of Directors of Lynn County Hospital District met for a regular meeting at 12:00 noon in the Hospital Meeting Room of the hospital. Present for the meeting were Leland White, Bettye Green, Harold Barrett, Billy Tomlinson, and Louise Landers. Absent members were Jackie Stidham, Peggy Morton, and Norman Ledbetter."

"Leland called for an executive session of the board and asked Louise to leave the room. After discussion the board then returned to regular session. A motion was made by Billy with a second by Bettye that at the beginning of the new year, October first, the administrator's salary be increased by \$2,500.00 per year. Motion carried. Louise then rejoined the meeting."

A quorum was present, and the decision was unanimous. The Hospital District Enabling Act states: "The administrator or manager and assistant administrator or assistant manager, if any, shall serve at the will of the board and shall receive compensation as may be fixed by the board".

The increase in salary for Louise Landers brings her salary to \$46,500.00 per year. According to Larry Anderson, CPA with Mason Warner Company, an accounting firm which represents approximately 25 rural hospitals, the average salary for an experienced administrator of a comparable size hospital is \$55,000.00 to \$65,000.00.

In September 1988 the hospital had a current note at First National Bank of Tahoka for \$100,000.00 to finance only Operating Expense of the hospital. Also payable was a refund of approximately \$25,000.00 to Medicare for overpayment. This indebtedness was repaid in the first year that Louise Landers was here and there have been no loans for operating expenses since. Payment of this note is recorded at the First National Bank of Tahoka.

Those of you who are aware of the critical need for another family practice physician know that physicians will not come to a facility that is run down and has obsolete equipment. Not only has the hospital recovered from a financially unstable position during the last few years, but listed below are some of the improvements made which are necessary to keep the facility in good operating condition, as well as provide quality care and encourage the recruitment of another physician:

HOSPITAL IMPROVEMENTS:

- Facility Heating & Air Conditioning System reduced operating cost by 45%
- Ice Machines for Dietary and Nursing
- Mednet Satellite System connected to TT Health Sciences Services for inservice
- **Nurse Call System**
- **Carport for pickup**
- Heating and Air-Conditioners for patient rooms
- **Entrance enclosure**
- **Oxygen storage provisions**
- Helicopter pad
- Sign for grounds (Hospital Auxiliary)

Lynn County Hospital operates more than just a hospital. Also in operation is the ambulance service (which most hospitals do not operate), the Home Health Agency, and the Rural Health Clinic in O'Donnell. The Custodial Care Program which Louise Landers implemented shortly after coming here is a private pay program and brought in \$56.320.60 CASH last fiscal year. Since this is a private pay program there is no insurance to be filed and no delay in cash flow while waiting for medical records to be completed in order to file insurance claims.

Louise Landers worked for South Plains Hospital-Clinic in Amherst, a non-profit corporation with no tax support, from the first week in April 1965 through April 6, 1988 - a total of 23 years. At the time she left, there were still three doctors practicing in Amherst.

In September 1988, Louise Landers started to work for Lynn County Hospital District. According to the Texas Hospital Association News, South Plains Hospital-Clinic closed July 14, 1989, along with 15 other hospitals in Texas. This was over fifteen months after Louise Landers left.

Neither the agenda for March 16, 1994, nor the agenda for any other meeting included discussion for purchase of any property.

Louise Landers and Eddie Landers did not appear before the board on March 16, 1994 or any other date requesting that the hospital district purchase a house for the administrator. The only time Eddie Landers has ever been in the hospital meeting room was to help mop up water in the middle of the night when a water pipe burst and other times to unload the supplies left from the Fun/Food Festivals.

You are entitled to attend the board meetings, as stated in the Texas Open Meetings Act. You can also read the minutes. In the last four years, only two people have come to the monthly board meetings - one who requested to be on the agenda, and one who was not on the agenda but was representing another party.

Any person who is a qualified voter and resides in Lynn County is eligible to serve on the board.

A clean, stable, well-equipped facility, a competent, caring staff, and a supportive community not only benefit the patients and the citizens of Lynn County, but is an enticement in the recruitment of another family practice physician. We are proud of the hospital and want the citizens of Lynn County to be informed, to be proud of and to support the Lynn **County Hospital District.**
