Commencement Exercises Set For 103 County Seniors

Lynn County seniors are scheduled this week, with Tahoka, Wilson, New Home and O'Donnell graduation ceremonies all set this Friday night.

Tahoka High School commencement exercises for 46 seniors will be held at 8 p.m. in the high school gym. Seniors are taking final exams this week, with a valedictorian and salutatorian not determined as of press

Wilson High School's 12 seniors will graduate in ceremonies at 7 p.m. in the school auditorium. Cindy Ramirez, daughter of Janie and Mike Ramirez, is valedictorian with a grade point average (GPA) of 96.00. Kathy Trevino Guzman, daughter of Angie Valdez and Bonifac Trevino, is salutatorian with a GPA of 92.27.

Commencement exercises for 103 nies will be held at 8 p.m. in the high school gym for 13 seniors. Valedictorian is Kara Lenn Askew, daughter of Eddie and Carolyn Askew, with a GPA of 94.6. Shannon Lane Zant, son of Leland and Susan Zant, is the salutatorian with a GPA of 87.8.

O'Donnell High School commencement exercises will be held at 8 p.m. in the school auditorium for 32 seniors. The top two students in the 1994 graduating class are sisters, Luz and Teresa Contreras, daughters of Salvador and Maria Contreras.

Luz Contreras is the valedictorian and has a weighted grade point average of 3.46 on a four point system. Her numerical average is 96.12. The salutatorian is Teresa Contreras who graduates with the same 3.46 weighted grade point average and a numerical average of 96.02.

New THS Principal

Bill Alcorn, Jr., 39, was named Tahoka High School Principal for the 1994-95 school year by Tahoka Independent School District Board of Trustees Monday morning. Alcorn, high school principal of Eula I.S.D. in Clyde, was offered a two-year contract and a 226-day annual salary of \$46,500 in a unanimous 7-0 decision by trustees. The contract begins July

Trustees interviewed Alcorn last week and called a special meeting at 7:45 a.m. Monday to act on the principal position. Incoming Superintendent David Hutton recommended Alcorn for the position, and met with trustees in the interview process last week.

Alcorn has been principal of grades 7-12 at Eula I.S.D. since 1991, was principal for grades K-8 at Peaster I.S.D. for four years, and was a teacher and coach at Lipan I.S.D. He received his B.S. from Tarleton State University in 1978, and his Masters Degree in Education Administration in 1985 from Tarleton. He completed his Mid-Management Certification in 1989.

A graduate of Graford High School, Alcorn is married and the couple have three children. His wife, Vicki, is a Home Health Care nurse. Their oldest daughter, Michelle, is 21, and Kimberly, 12, and Jennifer, 10, will attend school here.

Alcorn was recommended by Hutton to trustees as a strong disciplinarian with high moral standards and a "down-to-earth" attitude.

"I feel very strong about student discipline, staff development, school pride and spirit, communication, and teaching students good sound moral characteristics," Alcorn said. "I am very supportive of athletic and vocational programs because I feel these programs teach students characteristics needed for life such as responsibility, dedication, motivation, and

pride," he explained. He was recognized by the Texas Education Agency in 1992 and 1993 with a Texas Successful Schools Award for Eula I.S.D.

Alcorn lists his hobbies as horses, woodwork, dirt track racing, and computers. He and his family will be moving to Tahoka in June.

Burglaries, Wreck, **Fights Investigated**

Burglaries in the county and in Tahoka, several fights involving juvenile girls, thefts and one traffic accident in Tahoka were investigated by city and county peace officers during the last week.

Involved in the collision at Main and Lockwood last Wednesday were a 1989 Oldsmobile driven by Dianna C. Silvas, 22, of Tahoka, and a 1986 Ford Taurus driven by Susanna Ruiz Tello, 31, also of Tahoka. One possible injury to a passenger in the Tello vehicle was listed, but the passenger refused treatment.

Several wrenches and other tools were reported stolen from a Case 2590 tractor owned by Weldon Seay of Lamesa May 20 or 21 when the tractor was located on a county dirt road east of New Moore.

More road construction signs and a flashing light were reported stolen from construction sites between Tahoka and O'Donnell on U.S. 87, it was reported by Barricades Unlimited, owner of the signs. An orange 4foot-square sign "Road Construction Ahead" and another reading "End of Construction" were stolen. The items were valued at \$163.


Steve Pain of Rt. 2, O'Donnell,

reported that his barn located on FM 213 west of Wells Gin had been burglarized Sunday or Monday and a Regency channel scanner valued at \$400 stolen from a tractor near the

A scanner and jewelry valued at a total of \$1455 was reported stolen in a burglary of the home of Oscar Gutierrez on N. 6th St. in Tahoka May 17, but some of the items later were found outside the home by the victims of the burglary. Still missing were a ring, ear rings, and a diamond horseshoe necklace.

Tahoka Police Dept. answered four calls to fights involving juvenile Hispanic girls on Saturday and Sunday, including two calls to the softball field Sunday and one call each Saturday and Sunday to the school, with one fight reported outside the cafeteria where a dance was held Saturday night.

In jail during the last week were six persons, one for terroristic threat, and the others all on charges related to first offense driving while intoxicated, including judgement and sentencing, two applications to revoke probation, and failure to appear

THIS IS THE WEEK that most of the county's seniors graduate. Once they have their diplomas in hand, do you suppose they run out looking for work or for some college to attend, so they can delay going to work for four years?

Well, maybe some of them will do those things later (a few will get married), but I was really wondering what most of them would do that night after the graduation exercises.

Some probably will go drink all the beer they can find, but most of this county's graduates, I believe, are better citizens than that and it's these responsible young persons I was wondering about. How will they carry out their well-earned celebration?

I asked one young woman who graduated here just two years ago, and she said she just went home-and started to college just five days later.

Usually there is some kind of school-sponsored function for seniors and their dates, but these have not been attended as well as some private parties, which usually go all night or far into

That sounds more like what we did when we graduated, both from high school and college.

I remember that several guys (most of us would be called "nerds" these days, because we were all pretty good students) stayed up all night after graduating from high school. We spent most of the night in an all-night cafe, playing the juke box (songs by the King Cole Trio and tunes like "There Ain't Nobody Here But Us Chickens" by Louis Jordan, a black saxophonist-vocalist who later was stabbed by his girl friend) and eating hamburger steaks and french fries. There were no girls in the group; we heard later that some of the girls who graduated had slumber parties. And although we were 17 years old, girls were still pretty much strange and mysterious, but very desirable creatures to

Anyway, we talked about the mysteries of life, our hopes and ambitions, and ate a lot of stuff so we could stay in that restaurant all night. Finally, bloated and sleepy, we all went home about dawn. Somebody in the group must have had a car, but I don't remember who. I know it wasn't me; my first car was bought for \$300 the day after I graduated from college.

I don't remember celebrating at all when I got my degree (major in journalism and minor in pin-ball machine operation). I probably was just tired of the grind and ready to find a job.

I did, too. It paid me \$15 less a week than the job I had guit four years earlier so I could go to college and get smart and make a lot of money.



Three directors took the oath of office at the Lynn County Hospital Directors meeting last Thursday. Newly elected directors Virginia Griffing, Boyd Barnes and incumbent Billy Tomlinson were sworn in,

followed by an election of officers for the new board.

The current slate of officers was re-elected for the year, with Leland White serving as president, Billy Tomlinson as vice president, and Hospital Administrator Louise Landers as secretary.

Directors approved paying thly bills, and discussion held on several items, including legal correspondence and a physician recruitment update.

The board was slated to interview a physician candidate for the hospital last week, but the interview was cancelled. Two candidate interviews are scheduled within the next two weeks, according to Mrs. Landers. Directors were to interview Dr. Armando Moreno today (Thursday) at 1:30 p.m.

The next monthly meeting will be held June 23, a change from the second Thursday of the month, due to the hospital's involvement in appealing a Texas Employment Commission ruling on unemployment pay for a former employee.



So, plan your futures with serious attention, grads ... then, lighten up, roll with the punches and surprises life gives you, and enjoy life. It's a kick.



I am writing to you in regards to the articles that have appeared in the May 12 and May 19 editions of the Lynn County News concerning "County Agent Shackelford Relieved of Duties Here" and "Expense Account for County Agent Discussed

First I would like to clear up some inaccuracies stated in both articles. I have received \$2780.73 in travel reimbursements to date. There was also \$214.99 taken from my 1994 budget that was from December 1993. Therefore, since January, I have spent \$2565.74 in actual TRAVEL expenditures. I have spent 36 days out of the county at stockshows with Lynn County 4-Her's and adults since January, with a total expenditures of \$2118,19. This makes an average of \$58.838 spent each day for meals and motels. If you have ever spent that many days away from home in cities such as Odessa, Ft. Worth, San Antonio, Houston and San Angelo then the actual travel figures should speak for themselves.

I have received, \$78.27 was for fuel I was out of the county and needed gas and there was no Texaco station around (A Texaco credit card is provided by the county). Other misc. expenses are as follows: \$65.00 Texas County Agents Association Annual Dues, \$113.00 for motel deposits, \$17.00 for stockshow parking, \$5.00 for stockshow grounds addmission cause this is when all the stockshows

and \$7.54 for airport parking (transporting county clientel to and from airports at stockshows). If you are following along with your mathematics, we now have a total of \$375.88 unaccounted for. Since January, I have spent 28 days and 8 nights out of the county at district extension meetings (in which I am required to attend) and searching for cattle and swine projects for the 1994/95 show season for Lynn County 4-H members. I have driven approximately 10,730 miles searching for projects, only 6280 miles were in the county vehicle since January !, 1994. I have had at least one and sometimes as many as ten adult leaders with me at all times on these project searches and I have had a valid receipt for every penny that I have spent in the combined 64 days that I have been outside the county. Yes, I'm sure the bulk of any agent's travel is spent in January-March and in October be-

Mr. Editor, in regards to this segment of your article, it sounds like I have been on vacation at the "Beverly Hills Polo Club" in which I have not. I feel that it is my responsibility to the youth of this county to hustle my tail off to find them the very best projects that their funds will allow them to buy. I also, at the same time, try to travel as cheap as possible and yet still eat and stay at the same motels and restaurants that the majority of my 4-H families do. I'm sorry, I personally see these things as my job and find nothing wrong with that!

Secondly, I was not informed of last weeks court meeting in which my travel was again discussed. Furthermore, I was never asked by anyone to relinquish my duties as County Agent on May 10, 1994. The real story is tat during the entire court meeting I was in my office working. At 2:30 p.m. I received a phone call while I was out checking swine projects and was informed that as of 5:00 p.m. that day I was relieved of my duties in Lynn County. I do realize however that this topic was on the commissioners court agenda for that meeting but I had no other notification. Always before when I have been on the court agenda, I have been asked 2 or 3 days prior to that meeting to please be in attendance.

Third, I am allocated \$4500.00 per year for out of County travel and \$1500.00 per year for fuel and oil for a total "Travel" budget of \$6000.00 per year not \$4500.00 which was previously printed. In my last years budget I was allocated \$5800.00 in travel expense. This year both agents travel allocations were increased \$200.00. I, in no way asked for a \$1500.00 per year vehicle maintenance fund. When I left my offices budget hearing for the 1994 physical year with the County Commissioners Court, it was understood that \$4500 would be used for travel only and \$1500 would be used for gas and oil. Any vehicle maintenance expenses would come from other lin items. I have no control over what kind of fuel mileage the counties vehicle gets and I am sure your figure of \$3900 previously reported and now \$4224.74 included fuel, oil, oil changes, vehicle repairs and upkeep on a vehicle that has approximately 129,000 miles on it and a lot of mechanical problems. In fact, the only thing that is totally true and correct in your articles is the fact that I have resigned my position as County Extension Agent in Lynn County effective June 1, 1994. I realize that in today's society false rumors, false accusations and down right trash sell and make the media money, but I would hope that your paper would always want to print the truth. 


SPS employees serve only as a contact for help. They radio the dispatcher to notify the proper authorities, and they stay at the site with the child until help arrives.


