have no control over what kind of fuel mileage the counties vehicle gets and $I$ am sure your figure of $\$ 3900$ previously reported and now $\$ 4224.74$ included fuel, oil, oil changes, vehicle repairs and upkeep on a vehicle that has approximately
129,000 miles on it and a lot of me129,000 miles on it and a lot of me-
chanical problems. A new motor was put in at 90,000 miles, however the rest of the vehicle is "Flat Worn Out" Maintenance and upkeep on the ve hicle are not travel expenses and should not have been reported as travel. If my fuel, oil and travel reim-
bursements don't add up to $\$ 4224.74$ then extension funds are not being spent in the correct manner. Actually people were flat-out lied to when you printed the fact that the budget only had "approximately $\$ 600$ left in it".
