
Historian, the third honor student, is Tania Lopez with a GPA of 93.03. She is the daughter of Hortencia

Accused Rapist Caught After Jail Escape Here

Lynn County law enforcement officers Monday recaptured accused rapist Raymond Joe Page Jr. of Lubbock after he escaped the Lynn County jail early that morning.

Page was captured by authorities about 11 miles north of Tahoka about 2:40 p.m. Monday behind Poka-Lambro Telephone Co-Op after he

had assaulted an unarmed female guard about 4 a.m. that day with a sharpened toothbrush, according to Lynn County Sheriff Jake Diggs.

Diggs said Page, 24, apparently had fled east from the jail and walked through fields to the Tahoka Lake area northeast of town, then across U.S. 87 to Poka Lambro. He had shed his jail uniform near FM 211 and U.S. 87 intersection, then made his way to Poka-Lambro where he was spotted by a Lynn County resident who called the sheriff's office.

When officers arrested Page, he was wearing a T-shirt and shorts.

The search involved officers of the sheriff's department, police officers from Lubbock, Texas Rangers and the Dept. of Public Safety.

Page was arrested in Lubbock following the April 13 abduction and rape of a 13-year-old Hutchinson Junior High School girl who had been walking to school. He later was linked to several other attacks on women which occurred in 1994 and earlier


He has been charged with aggravated kidnapping, aggravated sexual assault and attempted kidnapping, with bond set at \$50,000 on each charge, and had been held in a Lubbock jail until about two weeks ago.

He was brought to Lynn County for a hearing scheduled Wednesday to revoke his probation on a felony theft charge; however, the hearing has been postponed. Diggs said Page had been convicted in Lynn County of theft of aluminum pipe in 1989 and had been given a 10-year probated sentence. He also said Page now has been charged with jail escape and bond on that charge has been set at

Page's cell apparently had been unlocked so he could use the telephone. He then threatened the female guard with the toothbrush, which he had apparently melted down to a point. Diggs said inmates are allowed to smoke in their cells, although he was not sure if Page still would be allowed that privilege. He added that the jail would add at least one more iailer to night duty.

After assaulting the guard, Page ran from a hallway outside his cell, broke the lock on a wooden door and escaped through unlocked glass double doors, Diggs said.

Sheriff Diggs apologized to the family of a Tahoka man whose name was brought up in the investigation after Page escaped. "Paul Henderson's name was brought up in the initial investigation, but he is in

New Home Man Killed In Collision

A 63-year-old New Home man was killed about 2:45 p.m. Tuesday when his 1990 Chevrolet pickup struck a tool bar on a tractor on FM 211 a mile west of New Home during a brief rain and windstorm which

no way connected to any criminal activity of Raymond Joe Page Jr., " Diggs said. "I apologize for any embarrassment to Henderson and his family which may have resulted from this incident."

No other major crimes were investigated by law enforcement officers in the county during the week, although Tahoka Police Dept. did check on an alleged attempted suicide and also a report of a burglary of a residence on Ave. E in the city obscured the vision of both vehicle Tahoka. operators, according to the investi-

gating state trooper. Lloyd George Huddleston was pronounced dead at the scene by Justice of the Peace H.W. Edwards of

Saturday. A woman reported that a kitchen table, two wall plaques, a tool box and a box of tattoo equipment had been taken from the house.

In jail during the week were one person for driving while intoxicated, third offense or more, and one for theft over \$200 and under \$750, for Deaf Smith County.

Officers also joined firemen at the scene of a large fire on CRP land about 10 miles northwest of Tahoka Tuesday afternoon.

Driver of the 1980 John Deere tractor involved was Ronald Case, 37, of Wolfforth, who was treated at the scene by Lynn County EMS personnel for a head injury. Case was driving east and Huddleston west. Case told officers he had pulled off the roadway to allow a vehicle behind to pass, and then pulled back on the highway and never saw the Huddleston vehicle before the impact. .

Services for Huddleston were pending Wednesday morning with White Funeral Home in Tahoka. Among the survivors known at that time are Huddleston's wife, Linda, and a daughter, Rhonda McNeely of

County To Purchase Compressor For **Fire Departments**

Lynn County Commissioners voted Monday to purchase a compressor to fill air pack bottles for the fire departments in Lynn County, at a cost of \$4800. The compressor will be housed in Tahoka for use by all four fire departments in the county.

Several representatives from area fire departments' were present at the meeting to present the request, telling commissioners that currently the air pack bottles must be taken to Lubbock or Lamesa and filled at a cost of about \$50 per bottle. All four commissioners voted unanimously to approve the purchase.

Hospital Board Changes Meeting Time, Approves Water Well For Grounds

Two new members were sworn in to the Lynn County Hospital Board of Directors last Thursday morning, and the full slate of directors voted unanimously to change the monthly morning meetings to 8 p.m. on the third Thursday of each month. The board also elected a new slate of officers, approved a computer system upgrade, approved digging a water well for hospital grounds, and other routine business.

Outgoing director and president Leland White conducted the meeting until the new directors took the oath of office, including incumbents Harold Barrett and Norman Ledbetter and newcomers Mike Rivas and Jimmy Dorman. The new board then elected Virginia Griffing as president, Norman Ledbetter as vice president, Hospital Administrator Louise Landers as secretary, and Boyd Barnes as treasurer.

A computer system upgrade, at a cost of approximately \$54,770, was unanimously approved by directors' after some discussion. "The current system, purchased five years ago, is not large enough anymore. We are totally overloaded and almost at a for the two-hour meeting.

standstill," Mrs. Landers told the board. Following a directive from the board at last month's regular meeting, Mrs. Landers had researched options available to the district concerning the system upgrade, and directors approved the upgrade estimate from Dairyland.

Directors also approved drilling a water well for hospital grounds, which would also be an emergency backup water source for the hospital building. The board's Grounds Committee had researched cost estimates, and directors approved drilling for the well at a total cost estimate of \$2500.

Mrs. Landers reported there was no new information on the voting rights suit against the hospital and that the demographic maps of the district had not yet been received.

Board members signed new signature cards for the bank depository, and the financial statement and monthly bills were unanimously ap-





Too many will violate the freedom of others, causing needless death and injury on highways and streets this holiday weekend.

Troop E. Biaza, Public Information Officer for the Texas Department of Public Safety advises that the Department of Public Safety Troopers and officers of area agencies will be on alert for hazardous violations, such as following too closely, cutting in too close after passing, passing in a no pass zone, speeding and others. They will also be watching for drivers not using their safety belts, especially children_riding unsecured as well as other passengers.

Baiza urges motorists to buckle up, drive with headlights on day or night, and drive alert. "As you drive, study your changing scenery for defensive options, should you come upon an errant driver," he said.

Baiza states,"If you are going to drink alcoholic beverages, be sure to have a designated driver who will not be consuming alcoholic beverages." The Texas Department of Public Safety and area agencies ask all motorists to drive safely so this Memorial Day weekend will be one with pleasant memories.


