## City Council Tables Cable Television Issue

Tahoka City Council Monday was informed that the city's cable television franchise company, Telemedia, is selling to new owners and that Telemedia wants the city to approve a resolution reassigning the franchise to the new owners, Time-Warner/Fanch.

City Administrator Jerry Webster told *The News* that council members discussed the issue with Rick Elmore, district manager with Telemedia, during the "citizens to be heard" portion of the meeting, and that no action was taken because it was not an agenda item. However, Mayor Jim Solomon and council members agreed that city attorney Cal Huffaker should look into the matter and the council wanted to meet with a representative of the new owners before taking any action. There are several years left on the franchise agreement with Telemedia, according to Webster.

"The cable television franchise will probably be addressed at the May council meeting," said Webster.

In other business, councilmen approved ordinances approving a lift station project for the city sewer sys-

tem, and an ordinance approving closure of the 1600 block of Kington Street. Repair work on the city swimming pool was also approved, at a total cost of \$6000, including a new drain estimated at \$5200 and contracting to have the building repainted at approximately \$800.

John Williams with the Canadian River Municipal Water Authority met with council members to discuss a new contract with the city for an alternative water supply, but councilmen tabled any action, pending some anticipated changes in the contract. The council also discussed the city's retirement plan, considering changing the current 65-plus plan to a straight 20-year plan, but this item was also tabled until other options could be considered.

Police Chief Randy Smith reported on the police department's activities for the month, and monthly bills were approved as presented.

Present at the meeting were councilmen Jay Dee House, Todd Henry, Ray Box and John Chapa, as well as Webster, Solomon, Smith and Huffaker. Councilman Mike Mensch was absent.

THOSE OF US who have trouble chewing gum and walking at the same time (actually I have trouble walking even when I'm not chewing gum) have problems with changing the clock twice a year as Daylight Savings Time comes and goes, as it is about to do Sunday.

There are neat little phrases which are supposed to help us know which way to go with the clock, things like "Spring forward and fall back," or is it "Fall forward and Spring back"? How about "run up the clock and when the Spring breaks, fall down"? Remember the mouse ran up the clock (it must have been the first Sunday in April, because only a rat would run up the clock in the fall).

Anyway, I have a plan which would eliminate all the confusion of clock changing. Some people don't like Daylight time; others do. I like it, but I'm willing to compromise, and although I've suggested this plan before, I'm having trouble getting widespread support, so maybe I need to offer more details. Here's the deal:

Stay up until 2 a.m. Sunday morning, then set your clock at 2:30. And never change it again. That way, if enough people would do it, we'd all be on the same time all year and not have to figure out which way to go twice a year. It would be the perfect compromise between those who would like to see Daylight time all year and those who would like to have Standard time all year.

Consider all that while I leave just now to go to lunch, as my watch indicates it is lunch time. I think.

## Extended Calls To Lubbock Due By June 30

Extended calling to and from Tahoka and Lubbock and four other area cities is to be in effect no later than June 30, city officials said this week.

Tahoka phone users voted for the toll-free calling between Tahoka and Lubbock, Post, Brownfield, Lamesa and O'Donnell a few months ago, and General Telephone (GTE Southwest Inc.) recently set a date of Aug. 31 for implementation of the service. The city of Tahoka had its attorney contact the Public Utilities Commission protesting the delay and the PUC has ruled that the service should be operating no later than June 30.

Phone subscribers in Wilson also voted recently for toll-free calls to and from Wilson with Lubbock and Slaton. Mayor Jackie Bishop said this week that the Wilson connections are to be implemented by Aug. 31.

## Thefts Of Fuel, Ceramic Pigs, CDs Reported

Theft of gasoline from an overhead tank near O'Donnell, three ceramic pigs stolen at New Home, compact discs stolen from a pickup in Tahoka and a Wilson area man found shot to death were among items investigated by Lynn County sheriff's officers and Tahoka Police Dept. during the last week.

Crime Line, 998-5145, is offering a reward of \$100 for information leading to the clearing of the theft of about 15 CDs from a 1981 Ford pickup owned by Manuel Hernandez and parked on Ave. C over the weekend. The stereo had been removed from the vehicle but left on the seat, Hernandez told police.

Randy Brewer of O'Donnell reported that someone had stolen an unknown quantity of gasoline from his overhead fuel tank about 4.5 miles east of O'Donnell Friday night.

Robert Warren of New Home said three ceramic pigs, each about 2 feet long, had been stolen from the front yard of his home recently. They were valued at a total of \$100.

On Monday deputies were called to a home about six miles east of Wilson where the body of Jerry Dan Swope, 55, was found. Apparently he was killed by a single shot from a .308 caliber rifle found at the scene. County Judge J.F. Brandon pronounced the victim dead at the scene, but has made no ruling on the cause of death pending results of an autopsy. Reports by deputies indicated that the shooting may have been accidental.

Police processed several incidents of domestic disturbance, harassment, illegal dumping, trespassing and public intoxication.

In jail during the week were two persons for driving while intoxicated, second offense, and one each for DWI first offense, public intoxication plus application to revoke probation on a forgery conviction, and public intoxication plus prohibited substance in a correctional facility.

## Speaker To Address Love, Sex, And Dating In School Seminars

How do teenagers deal with love, sexuality, and dating in a world where "Just Say No" is a great slogan but fails to answer the question of how to go about maintaining wholesome relationships? Ed Ainsworth, founder of Whiteheart Communications, will address these issues in three days of seminars scheduled for Tahoka Independent School District students in grades 5-12.

The seminars will be held next Tuesday, Wednesday, and Thursday, April 9-11, in the Tahoka High School auditorium, and interested parents are also invited to attend any of the sessions.

Ainsworth is the father of three children, ages 11, 13 and 16, and has been married to his wife for 17 years. He is a camp director and conference speaker, and in 1994 he says he began Whiteheart Communications in response to a desperate cry from teenagers, parents, and all those who work with teenagers, to present "abstinence only" messages on teenage sexuality.

He calls for chastity, purity,

healthy and wholesome relationships, self-respect and an honest look at sexuality in his seminars, and challenges students to remain virgins, along with some practical reasons for how and why to do so. He also offers hope to those who may already be sexually active, challenging them to "secondary virginity", explaining what it is and how to get there.

He uses creative and interactive teaching methods in his abstinence-only message that involve the students in the learning process. His goal is for the students to listen and remember, so he uses videos, role-play, visuals, music and educational games in the sessions, geared to appropriate age groups.

He will address fifth and sixth graders together, middle-school students in their own session, freshmen and sophomores, and junior and seniors in separate sessions. He also plans to lunch with students each day, and says he encourages any student with questions to seek him out during that time or after school.

"I'm very excited to have Mr. Ainsworth come to our school," said TISD trustee Juanell Jones, a member of the Health Advisory Committee for the district. "I heard him give a presentation similar to what he will be telling students last year at the Education Service Center, and was very impressed with his message. He is informative, approachable and entertaining and I believe he will relate very well to the students - he won't 'preach' at them, but at the same time he effectively gives an 'abstinence only' message with practical ways for teenagers to lead sexually pure lives," she added.

Rev. Marvin Gregory, pastor of First United Methodist Church of Tahoka, also is a member of the Health Advisory Committee and he believes Ainsworth has a positive message for teenagers. "It's a good message to 'just say no' but it's even better to tell teenagers how to do that, and I believe Ed does that," he said.

The possibility of a youth rally one evening following the seminars is being considered, and information on the date and place will be available next week.

Ainsworth has spoken to more than 16,000 students in junior high, high school and college with his "abstinence only" message. Whiteheart Communications is based in Lubbock, at 2122 56th Street, phone 763-5017.

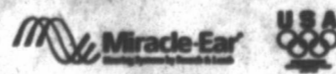

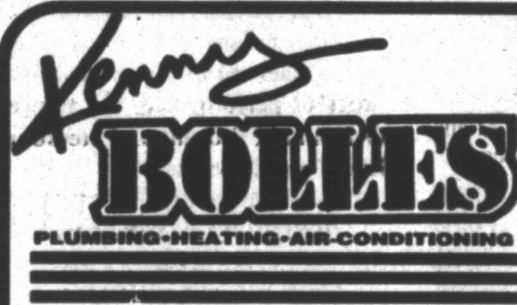

Juanell Jones, co-owner and editor of The Lynn County News, was presented with a Conservation News Media Award for her support of conservation activities by publishing over 30 news and feature articles promoting RC&D (Resource Conservation and Development) projects, wind-break tree programs, awards banquets and other soil and water conservation activities in both the Soil and Water Conservation Division and Natural Resources Conservation Service (NRCS).
