New Coach Hired At Tahoka ISD

Randal Brent John, 30, who has four years coaching experience, was hired by Tahoka Independent School District Board of Trustees last Wednesday. John will come to Tahoka from Anton, where he coached the last two years, to be assistant football and head baseball coach here.

In other business, Superintendent David Hutton informed trustees of the resignation of Coach Jimmy Burleson, and of the retirement of long-time employee Minnie Lou Ash. Board President Greg Henley expressed the board's appreciation for Mrs. Ash's 33 years of service to the school district as a teacher and in an administrative capacity during recent years.

Trustees authorized Supt. Hutton to attend an auction with an option to purchase a double portable classroom for use at the elementary for special education classrooms, which would allow the music program to have a classroom in the elementary building.

Present at the meeting were six of seven trustees, including Greg Henley, Rex Rash, Joe Calvillo, Carmen Chapa, Ginger Henry and Brad Hammonds, as well as Supt. Hutton and several other district personnel. Trustee Juanell Jones was absent.

Pct. 3 Truck Bid Accepted

Lynn County Commissioners Thursday opened bids for a truck for use in Precinct 3, accepting the only bid submitted from South Plains National Trucks, Inc. for an international truck and dump bed from American Equipment & Trailers. Total cost of the truck was \$54,507.

In other business, commissioners approved monthly bills and approved an agreement with Compliance Plus for a program to put the county in compliance for persons who drive vehicles weighing over 26,000 pounds. A yearly fee will be paid in addition to per person coverage for the program.

Present at the meeting were commissioners Sandy Cox and J.T. Miller, and County Judge J.F. Brandon presiding. Absent were commissioners Jacky Henry and Margaret Stone.

Deputies Find 55 Pounds Of Marijuana In Vehicle

Sheriff's deputies made the largest marijuana bust in recent history in Lynn County last Friday as they discovered 55 pounds of pot hidden under the false bottom of a car's trunk after the vehicle was stopped for a routine traffic violation on U.S. 87 a mile north of Tahoka.

Deputies Charlie Smith and James Hill seized the drug after pulling over the 1986 Honda about 3:20 p.m. The 32 bundles would have a street value in this area of about \$40,000, according to Smith, who noted that it would be worth more further north. Around here it would sell for \$500 to \$900 a pound, and up north the street price per pound could be as high as \$2000, he said.

Jailed and charged with aggravated possession of marijuana was Dianne Weaver, 45, of LaFeria, TX. A 16-year-old boy also was arrested and was sent to the Lubbock County Youth Detention Center. The car was impounded.

José Oscar Herrera, 28, of Tahoka suffered apparently minor injuries Saturday morning as pickup he was driving overturned on FM 212 north of US 380.

Tahoka Police are continuing investigation of a report that \$20 had been stolen from a woman's purse at her home here Friday.

A 35-year-old Tahoka man was arrested Friday after a fight on the east side of town and officers found a small quantity of what is believed to

be cocaine. No drug charges were filed pending analysis of the substance.

Police also arrested a 16-year-old Big Spring girl after a small quantity of what appeared to be marijuana was found in her purse in a car Sunday.

In jail during the week were five new prisoners, on these charges: aggravated possession of marijuana, no liability insurance (second offense) plus no drivers license, failure to report an accident with injury at once plus public intoxication plus ride not secured by seat belt, disorderly conduct plus profane language, and public intoxication.

'Free' Phone Calls Between Lubbock, Tahoka Start June 12

Toll-free phone service to and from Tahoka and Lubbock, O'Donnell, Brownfield and Lamesa will begin next Wednesday, June 12. General Telephone has announced. Calls to those cities from Tahoka will no longer require area code and "1-plus" dialing. Customers need only to dial the local seven-digit number in those towns.

The local calling extension will apply to Tahoka and Post starting on June 26.

Rather than pay long-distance charges, Tahoka customers of GTE will pay an additional \$3.50 a month, with businesses paying \$7 more.



NOTICE OF PROPOSED GAS RATE CHANGE

On May 31, 1996, Energas Company filed Statements of Intent to change its gas rates with each incorporated city listed below. The proposed changes will take effect no sooner than 35 days after filing. Each city may suspend the proposed effective date for an additional 90 days. The company proposes to increase rates to General Service (residential and commercial), Small Industrial Service, Large Gas Air Conditioning and/or Electric Generating Gas Service, and the Air Conditioning Rate Rider. Additionally, the company is proposing to offer a new service, General Service-State Institutions, to state agencies. The company may implement a different rate design than proposed provided the increased revenue does not exceed that specified herein. The proposed changes are expected to increase the company's annual revenues by approximately 7.6 percent or \$7.7 million. The proposed changes could affect approximately 200,000 gas consumers in the following communities:

From Lynn County Farm Service Agency

New CRP Grazing/Haying Provisions: Emergency grazing of CRP acreage is allowed under new provisions. These provisions allow grazing thru September 30, 1996. Haying is allowed beginning July 1, 1996 and continuing thru September 30, 1996. The same acreage cannot be hayed and grazed. The cost to graze is 5% of the per acre annual CRP rental rate per month or any part of a month. Haying has a 25% per acre cost. This rate applies to producers that are grazing CRP now. Contact the Lynn County FSA for additional items that apply to this program.

Options: Participants in the CRP program with acreage that has been under CRP contract for at least 5 years may request an early out of the contract without penalty or repayment of funds. All requests must be made before May 31, 1996 if the farm will be enrolled in the 1996 Production Flexibility Contract (PFC). All requests after this date will be allowed to enroll in the Farm Program with a beginning year of 1997. All early outs must meet minimum requirements of NRCS.
