

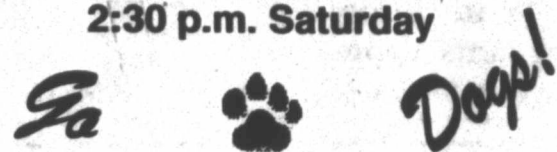

## Four Add Names To Candidate List For City, School Elections In County

Four more names have been added to the candidate list this week for city and school elections throughout Lynn County. Amy Preston filed for District 3 on the Tahoka City Council, Don Sharp filed for Mayor in New Home, Max Mendieta filed for re-election to the O'Donnell City Council, and David Gandy filed for a seat on the New Home School Board. Candidates have until March 19 to file for the election at respective city and school offices.

Elections for city, school, and hospital boards will be held May 3. Filing for Lynn County Hospital District Board of Directors will be conducted at a later date.

The following information was available on the Lynn County school and city elections as of late Tuesday afternoon:

### School Elections

**Tahoka I.S.D.:** Two at-large trustee seats (3-year terms). Terms expiring: Greg Henley, Rex Rash. Filing: Greg Henley, Ty Askew.

**New Home I.S.D.:** Two at-large trustee seats (3-year terms). Terms expiring: Stacy Gill, David Foerster. Filing: David Gandy.

**Wilson I.S.D.:** Two trustee seats (3-year terms). Wilson I.S.D. will implement the new cumulative voting method this year, in which each

voter gets two votes - both votes may be placed for one candidate, or a voter may place one vote for each of two candidates. Terms expiring: Dan Cook, Keith Wied. Filing: none.

**O'Donnell I.S.D.:** Two trustee seats (3-year terms). Cumulative voting. Terms expiring: Gonzalo Amaro, Bobby Joe Furlow. Filing: Renn Dorman.

### City Elections

**Tahoka:** Mayor, District 1 and District 3 council seats (all 2-year terms). Terms expiring: Mayor James A. Solomon, Dist. 1 councilman John Chapa Jr., Dist. 3 councilman Mike Mensch. Filing for Mayor: Mike Mensch. Filing for District 1: John Chapa Jr. Filing for District 3: Amy Preston.

## Wayne Huffaker Resigns As Boll Weevil Committee Chief

Wayne Huffaker of Tahoka has resigned as chairman of the Plains Cotton Growers Boll Weevil Steering Committee. Member Don Langston was appointed as new chairman.

"Wayne's decision to step down as chairman of the committee was accepted reluctantly," said PCG President Jackie Burris of Wellman. "But with a complete understanding of the tremendous personal strain his duties have imposed on him over the past two years."

"The dedication and leadership he has demonstrated since being appointed chairman in 1994 has not always been appreciated as it should," Burris said. "The fact remains that for the many long hours he has devoted to serving in this capacity we owe him a heartfelt

Langston said he would be hard pressed to fill the leadership role as Huffaker has done. "I will do my best to carry on the legacy that Wayne has left me. I can only hope that through my efforts I can complete the task of eliminating the boll weevil as an economically damaging pest on the high plains."

Huffaker took the role of chairman in 1994, shortly before he was hospitalized for six months prior to receiving a heart transplant in July of 1994. He will remain on the committee. "My hope is that during the next few months High Plains cotton producers can come together and develop common ground on which to solve the tremendous challenges which face us," he said.

## Blood Drive To Honor Memory Of Henry

The Texas Blood Institute, sole provider of blood to 21 hospitals in a 16-county area, will be holding a community wide blood drive in memory of Jacky Henry. The drive will be on Thursday, March 13, from 2 p.m. to 7 p.m. at the First United Methodist Church in Tahoka.

Everyday, at least 150 blood donors are needed to meet the needs of the hospitals in Lubbock and the surrounding communities. Statistics show that 6 out of 10 people will need blood components at some time in their lives.

Blood donors should be aware that one single donation can help as many as four patients. Blood donations can be separated into four components, in-

cluding red blood cells, plasma, platelets, and cryoprecipitate. These products are needed by cancer and leukemia patients, surgery and transplant patients, premature babies, burn victims, and patients with certain blood disorders.

Carrie Elaine Taylor, Donor Recruiter, hopes to see at least 50 people donate at the drive.

"Sometimes I think we take life for granted. Every three seconds someone needs blood. You never know when that someone could be you or a loved one," said Ms. Taylor.

## Fire Department Chili Cookoff Fundraiser To Be Rescheduled

A chili cookoff designed to fill up every possible consumer in Lynn County while raising funds for fire departments in all four towns, will be held at a later date. It had been scheduled for this Saturday in Tahoka.

Reason for the change in plans is that many Tahoka residents will be in Austin, where the Tahoka varsity boys basketball team will be playing for the state championship this weekend.

"We'll have a lot more customers for eating chili some other Saturday," said a spokesman for the departments from Wilson, New Home, O'Donnell and Tahoka.

Each fire department plans to offer its own special recipe for chili at the event, which will raise funds for the departments.

## Theft, Assault Cases Reported

Tahoka Police Dept. this week was investigating a report that two young girls have been the victims of ongoing sexual abuse. No charges or arrests have been made in the case, and investigation was continuing.

Police also had a report from Tahoka High School that a large plate glass window in front of the building had been shot by a pellet gun Monday or Tuesday.

A Tahoka man told police another Tahoka man threatened him with a baseball bat in connection with a dispute over a football pot in which a van had been offered as a prize.

About \$15 in cash was reported stolen from the wallet of a 16-year-old O'Donnell student at the boys dressing room in the school. Two suspects, age 18, ran from the locker room when the youth entered last Thursday, and he later discovered the money missing.

In jail during the week were two persons for theft by check and one each for the following: Possession of marijuana under two ounces plus possession of narcotics paraphernalia, driving while license suspended plus bad check (for Lubbock County), public

intoxication, parole violation, application to revoke probation on charges of burglary, and driving while intoxicated, first offense.

The Tahoka Rotary Club met Thursday at noon at the First United Methodist Church. Program chairman H.B. McCord introduced the speaker, Mayor of Tahoka, Jim Solomon, who reported to the Rotarians on the state of the city.

Solomon has been mayor for the past 10 years, and a city councilman for 10 years prior to that. This is his last year in office, as he has decided not to seek reelection.

The mayor praised the efforts of many who help make our community a great place to live and work. He mentioned how fortunate we are to have an elite volunteer fire department with modern facilities and equipment for them to use. The city has recently replaced all of the street signs, through a grant from SPAG and 911. The old signs were over 30 years old. The city has been sealing about 1/5 of the paved streets in Tahoka each year, to protect this valuable investment.

Solomon brought the club up to date on the progress of the new Life Enrichment Center, and told how grant writer Reith Pittman had been able to secure major contributions for the building. He praised the efforts of the townspeople, children, and civic clubs for raising over \$50,000 in voluntary contributions.

"Tahoka has an advantage over many West Texas towns, in that city leaders 30 years ago made the decisions and planning to secure an adequate water supply from the Canadian River Authority for the community, from which we will benefit for many years to come," said the mayor.

Solomon praised the new police chief, Steve Chance, and spoke on how

qualified he was for the position, and the leadership he would bring to the job. Jim took time to thank his fellow Rotarians for being in the forefront of community activities and projects, and taking place in the leadership of the town over the years. Following his address, he was given a standing ovation, in gratitude for his unselfish years of service and administration to the community.

President Haney Wells introduced the newest member of the club, Steve Chance. Steve assumed his duties as police chief this month, and will be joined in Tahoka this summer by his wife Seleta and four year old daughter Brooke Alise. Other members of his family are Michelle from Lawrenceville, Georgia; Marian of Carrollton; and Bryan, who is finishing up as a senior at Pampa High School.

REGIONAL CHAMPS - STATE CONTENDERS

Tahoka Bulldogs To Vie For State Championship Trophy

For the first time in history, Tahoka is one of four contenders for a Class 2A State Basketball Championship Trophy. The 1996-97 Tahoka Varsity Boys Basketball Team (now 29-6) qualified for the State Tournament last weekend with back to back wins over Idalou (57-43) and Shallowater (65-55) to claim the Region 1-2A Championship Trophy.

Excited Tahoka fans were scrambling this week to make arrangements to follow their team to Austin for the State Tournament, where the Bulldogs are scheduled to play Vanderbilt Industrial (32-4) in the state semi-finals at 9:30 a.m. Friday in "The Drum" - the Frank Erwin Special Events Center - on the University of Texas campus. Tickets for Tahoka's game were being sold Tuesday and Wednesday at Tahoka High School, but some tickets may be available at the door. Ticket holders for Tahoka's game may stay for the other 2A semi-final game at 11 o'clock between Woden (34-2) and Italy (25-4).

The winners of those games will advance to the Class 2A State Finals, slated for 2:30 p.m. Saturday. Tickets for the championship game will be sold after the semi-final game on Friday, for \$6 each, at a designated Erwin Center box office. Anyone purchasing tickets for the championship game must present a drivers license for proof of residence, as tickets are sold first to the fans of the two schools advancing to the final. Should Tahoka not make it to the finals, it is possible that tickets may not be available for Tahoka fans, according to information from tournament representatives.

Coach Toby Villa, new to Tahoka this year, and in his first year as a head varsity coach, gave his team credit for working hard this season to achieve a goal which no other Tahoka basketball team has ever reached: Regional Champions. He is hopeful that this weekend Tahoka can claim another first: State Champions.

If the Bulldogs play like they are capable of doing, that goal may be attainable.

The victory over Shallowater at the regional finals in Abilene Saturday was sweet indeed for Tahoka fans, who have twice watched the Bulldogs lose to their district co-champions, including the district playoff game to determine seeding for bi-

district pairings. The Dogs, however, did beat Shallowater in a home court advantage during regular season play, so they knew it could be done.

And "do it" they did, with a consistent high energy defensive attack (which the Dogs are gaining a reputation for) and a dogged offensive game plan in which no one player hit the boards for an astronomically high individual game, but rather a well-rounded team effort in which four-count 'em, 4 - Tahoka players scored in double figures in the 10-point victory.

Adrian Graves, a 6'1" junior, led scoring for Tahoka with 15 points and 9 rebounds, followed closely by 6'1" junior Rocky Moore with 13 points,

5'7" senior Randy Burleson with 12, and 6'4" senior Lee Rash with 11 points. Senior Monty Hale tossed in another 8, senior Aaron Long contributed 4, and senior Brad Long added 2 more points for the win.

Tahoka fans had watched Shallowater earn the regional final playoff berth in a semi-final win over Stratford, rallying from a 15-point deficit at halftime to win 74-62, and also knew from personal experience that Shallowater's Mustangs had a philosophy of "it ain't over til it's over". The Bulldogs, however, have proved their "we can do it" attitude and came home with the regional trophy.

The Bulldogs had four fouls in the first quarter which allowed Shallowater to score 5 points at the free throw line, but the Dogs still had a marginal lead at the end of the period, 10-9. The Mustangs came out gunning in the second quarter, taking a 15-10 lead before the Dogs could score, and it was 4 minutes before the half when Tahoka finally took the lead again at 19-17, thanks in part to a 3-pointer from Burleson. At two minutes til the halftime buzzer the score was tied again at 21-21, but another 3-pointer (this time by Moore) and two baskets by Hale gave the

Dogs a 28-24 lead at halftime.

The third quarter belonged to the Dogs, who gained a 9 point advantage by the fourth period, 40-31. In fact, Tahoka led during the entire second half, although fans collectively held their breath when Shallowater's Josh McMenemy sank a 3-pointer with just 51 seconds left in the game to get within four points of Tahoka, at 57-53. However, Shallowater missed three other 3-point attempts and the Bulldogs were dead accurate at the free throw line, hitting 8 of 10 free throws in the final 50 seconds to claim the victory.

Shallowater's star player, 6'6" senior Cole Roberts, who led the Mustangs with 19 points and 15 rebounds, finally fouled out of the game with only 30 seconds left, and the Mustang's feisty ball handler, freshman D. Hudson, fouled out with 1:44 remaining in the game.

When the buzzer sounded, Tahoka fans erupted into a screaming, cheering mass, but more than a few emotional tears were shed when the players began the traditional ceremony of cutting down the net after the trophy presentation, and a large number of euphoric Tahoka fans mingled on the court congratulating the team for almost an hour afterwards.

Dogs Beat Idalou 57-43 In Semi-Final

The Idalou victory in the regional semi-final match on Friday was exciting too, with the Bulldogs taking the initiative right off the bat with a 10-6 lead at the end of the first period.

The Dogs extended their advantage with a 7 point lead at the half, scoring 14 points to Idalou's 11 for a 24-17 halftime score, and in fact after the first period the Dogs led the rest of the game. Once again, Tahoka's defensive game was a big factor in keeping the Wildcats from catching up to the Dogs.

Lee Rash poured in another 12

points for the Dogs in the third quarter, and with 5 points from Moore and a free throw by Graves, the Dogs led 42-29 leading into the final period. Rash added another 7 points, and Moore tossed in 6, with a 2-point basket made by freshman Brad Pebsworth for the final 15 points of the game. Idalou added 14 points in the fourth but couldn't make up the deficit, and Tahoka won the game 57-43.

Rash was top Bulldog scorer with 23 points, and Moore scored in double figures with 19 points. Hale added 6 points, followed by Burleson with 4, Graves 3, and Pebsworth 2.

Statistical Comparison Of Starters For Tahoka, Industrial Teams

The Industrial High School Cobras, from Vanderbilt, 10 miles out of Victoria, are led in scoring and rebounds by a big senior forward, Ashley Jalufka. He wears No. 33 and has averaged 22.9 points per game, plus 15.9 rebounds per game. At 6-7, he also averages 3.5 steals, 3.2 assists and a whopping 7.2 blocks per game.

Tahoka's tallest player is Lee Rash, 6-4 senior who averages 16.7 points per game, and Rocky Moore is averaging 16.9 points per game. Randy Burleson is averaging 11.5 and Monty Hale 9.3 points per game.

Tahoka is averaging 71.2 points per game to 55 for opponents. Industrial is averaging 64.5 points per game to 44.3 for opponents. The Cobras went to state last year and lost in the first round to East Chambers. Some statistics for the starters on each team:
