"If I've told you once, l've told you a million times not to exaggerate!"
Exaggeration, or overstatement, is the American form of humor, as opposed to the British style of understatement ("I say, we folks here on the Titanic may be in for a bit of trouble since we struck that iceberg.")

Still, I continue to marvel at the way most people report the weather. Anytime there is a cloud, some people see a funnel. Anytime there is hail, somebody claims it was a lot worse than it was ("The hail beat my car all to pieces. No, just happened to pick up this little hammer; I didn't really use it.")

Last week a relative in Lubbock called after he heard on TV that Tahoka had "baseball-size" hail. We assured him that all we saw was pea-size or marble-size. Itold him Ihad some tennis balls, however, that are as big as hailstones.
