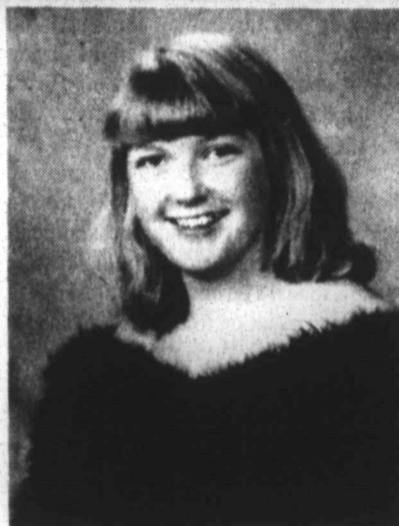

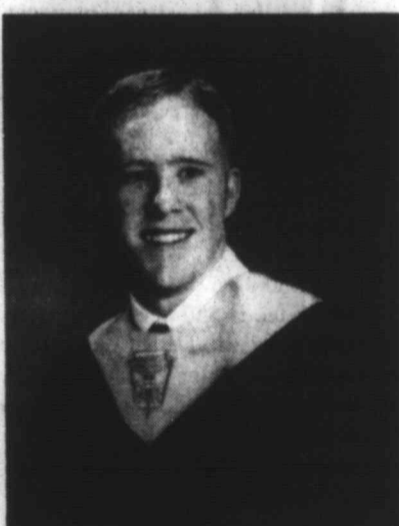

John Daly Wows Crowd At T-Bar

John Daly, one of the biggest names in professional golf, demonstrated his talents Tuesday at one of the smallest towns with a golf course, and the crowd at T-Bar Country Club in Tahoka loved it. About 200 people were on hand when Daly stepped up on the No. 4 tee box for a brief clinic just after noon, and he quickly won them over with some fluid demonstrations of golf shots, his joking with the crowd, and some serious comments about his bouts with alcoholism.

The winner of two major PGA tournaments easily won over the crowd, many of whom now will definitely be pulling for Daly when he appears in televised golf tournaments.

Daly was in Tahoka to show support for his friend, country singer Daron Norwood of Tahoka, who organized the event to raise money for charities. He had planned to promote a home for troubled youngsters, to be built in Tahoka, but after some discussion of that plan, he said Tuesday night that the money would go to established facilities for troubled youth, including Boys Ranch near Amarillo.

Norwood closed the day's activities with an open-air concert at the golf course. Another of Norwood's friends, eight times World Champion Calf Roper Roy Cooper of Childress, also was present to support the day's events.

"I think it's a good thing that Daron and John are doing, and I just wanted to be a part of it," Cooper said. Cooper said he goes to about 100 rodeos a year, and will be in competition this weekend in Fort Worth, and next Tuesday and Wednesday in Fort Smith, AR.

Daly's longest drive off the No. 4 box was about 350 yards into the wind. In an "Out-Drive John Daly" competition, Steve Alexander of Lamesa, reportedly the Texas longest-drive champion, hit one smash 374 yards, about two yards short of the 125-yard crossover on the 501-yard hole.

Prior to Daly's clinic, a new Big Bertha driver was auctioned off, with Darren Yates of Lubbock claiming it for \$2000. More items were auctioned off Tuesday night.

When someone asked Daly what was the longest drive he'd ever made, he gave an answer something like "Bangor, Maine to Dallas." Actually, he had told a *Lynn County News* representative earlier that his longest officially measured drive was 371 yards, but that his longest drive ever was 396 yards in a tournament at Boston last year.

"The hole was 377 yards away, and I hit it 19 yards past the green," he said.

Daly, who said he is now using HT Maxfli balls, said he prefers a 90 compression ball year round over the 100

compression ball used by many big hitters. Other comments he made during the clinic:

"I believe the golf shot is made with your left hand (if you're right-handed). As long as I keep it low and slow, I can do okay."

"With a 60-degree wedge I can hit the ball a maximum of about 105 yards—or 120 in West Texas" (because of the hard fairways).

And, in response to a question, he said "I usually can hit an 8-iron 162 or 163 yards."

Both Daly and Norwood said they are recovering alcoholics, and Daly drew applause with some personal comments about his battling back from alcoholism and now being reunited with his wife.

Prior to the clinic Daly sat in the clubhouse barefooted with his feet taped from blisters and soreness from walking in the Byron Nelson tournament last weekend. Noting that each round of golf involves about five miles of walking—mostly on uneven terrain—Daly said most golfers have more leg strength than even professional football players.

Daly said he played football in high school, and was a left-footed place kicker, although he plays golf right-handed.

While waiting for the clinic, he and Norwood played guitars and sang a duet. "Got It Made in the Shade If the Tree Don't Fall," and Cooper surprised his two friends by chiming in with a phrase.

Once during the clinic Daly was asked about the character of some of the other pro golfers, and he had high praise for Jack Nicklaus, Tiger Woods and Fred Couples. "They are gentlemen and great guys," he said.

A lot of folks around Tahoka were convinced Tuesday that Daly also is one of the really good guys.

Commencement exercises for 93 Lynn County seniors are scheduled this Friday evening, and Baccalaureate services for Tahoka, Wilson, and New Home seniors were held Sunday.

Tahoka High School has 42 seniors in the 1998 graduating class, with commencement exercises set for 8 p.m. Friday in the high school gymnasium. Baccalaureate services for THS seniors were held last Sunday at the Tahoka Church of Christ.

Valedictorian of the THS Class of 1998 is Abbie Gill, with a 96.42 grade point average (GPA). She is the daughter of Stan and Julia Gill of Tahoka. Earning a GPA of 95.71, Gary Gandy is the THS Salutatorian, and he is the son of Menford

and Sharon Gandy.

The other two high honor students graduating in the top ten percent of the THS class are April Braddock, daughter of Mike and Connie Braddock, and Krystin Kelln, daughter of Jay and Karen Kelln.

Wilson High School has nine seniors in the 1998 graduating class, and commencement exercises will be held at 7 p.m. Friday in the new high school gymnasium, with a reception to follow in the school cafeteria. Baccalaureate services were held in the high school auditorium Sunday.

Patricia Holder earned a 3.80 GPA to claim the honor of WHS Valedictorian. She is the daughter of Clifford and Carol Holder. Crystal Bolyard was a close second with a GPA of 3.78 as WHS Salutatorian. She is the daughter of Doug and Tami Bolyard.

Seventeen New Home High School seniors will graduate in commencement exercises at 8 p.m. Friday in the gymnasium, and they were honored at Baccalaureate services Sunday in the New Home Baptist Church.

Ricky Torres is the class Valedictorian, with a GPA of 3.67. He is the son of Jose Torres III and Janie Torres. Jody Clem, with a GPA of 3.64 is NHHS Salutatorian, and he is the son of Mark and Georgia Clem.

O'Donnell High School Commencement will be held for 25 seniors at 8 p.m. Friday in the Glenn and Donna Hopkins Memorial Auditorium.

Class Valedictorian is Eric Neil Gandy, son of Ricky and Teresa Gandy, who earned a numerical average of 93.416 and a weighted GPA of 3.321. Salutatorian is Keve Lee, daughter of Susan Lee and Doyle Lee, who will graduate with a 91.469 numerical average and a 3.213 weighted GPA.

Other OHS honor students include Ashli Farmer, daughter of Matt and Dianne Farmer; Rebecca Curtis, daughter of Carrie Line Curtis; and Amber Hancock, daughter of Bernie and Shonda Hancock.

Crime Line Pays \$500 Reward

Lynn County Crime Line paid a \$500 reward last week for information which led to the solving of two criminal mischief cases which occurred in mid-March in Tahoka.

According to Tahoka Police Department officials, information obtained through an anonymous call to Crime Line led police to investigate five juveniles and one adult, solving the case of an estimated \$7000 damage in broken windshields and windows on 17 vehicles parked next to Lyncco Automotive.

The suspects also were reportedly responsible for vandalism and arson at a former lumber yard building owned by Lynn Cook in the 1300-block of Ave. J, where a fire was started on the floor with a flammable substance, causing heavy damage after burning itself out.

The five juveniles were turned over to Juvenile Probation Department officials, where they reportedly paid \$2000 in restitution and were assessed six months probation and community service. Charges filed on the adult are pending grand jury indictments, officials said.

"Come out and bring your lawn chairs and blankets and enjoy a fun-filled day at the ballpark, while supporting these great youth organizations," said one sponsor of the event.

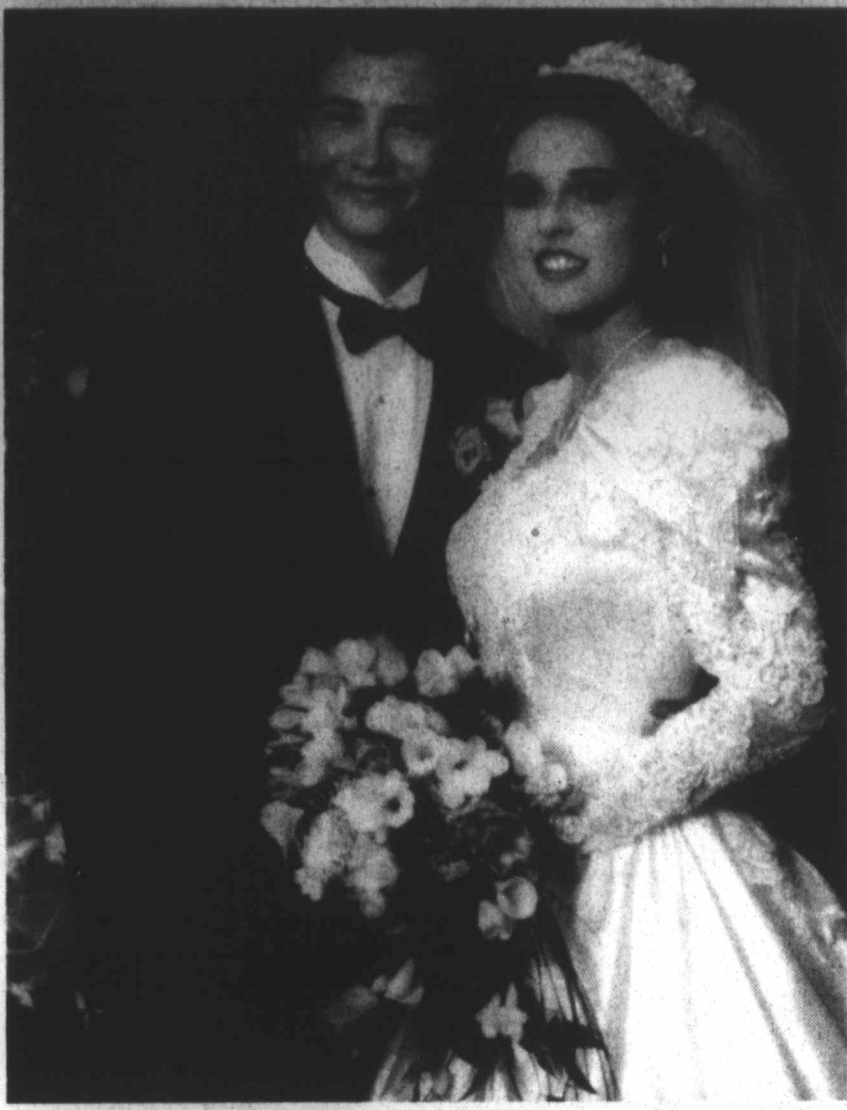

Three Teachers Resigning; New Trustees Sworn In

One teacher resignation was noted at Thursday night's Tahoka Independent School District board meeting, and two more teachers submitted resignations Friday here. Three trustees were administered the oath of office, budget amendments and student transfers approved, and other routine business was conducted during the 3-1/2 hour meeting following a dinner for the board (both incoming and outgoing trustees) and their spouses, and administrative staff.

Superintendent David Hutton informed trustees of the resignation of sixth grade teacher Bruce Lehman at the board meeting, and on Friday resignations were submitted from Tahoka High School teacher/coach Darren Haseloff and his wife, sixth grade teacher Lorre Haseloff. With the resignation of Lehman and Mrs. Haseloff this week, and the earlier resignation of Mrs. Cindy Talbot, three of the four sixth grade teaching positions will need to be filled for the next school year.

Incumbent trustees Joe Calvillo and Carmen Chapa (declared elected without an election because of running unopposed) and newly-elected trustee Leighton Knox Jr. were sworn in, and election of officers was conducted. Greg Henley will serve another term as Board President, as will Brad Hammonds as Vice-President, and Joe Calvillo as Secretary, all elected unanimously.

Ken Eudy, business manager trainee, gave a financial report, noting an account balance in all funds of \$1,931,268.14. He also said that the 1997 tax collection had reached \$967,240.78 which was 94.54% complete. Monthly bills were approved as presented.

Two student transfers from Post were approved unanimously, as was a motion to allow GM-Southwest Insurance Company to offer student and athlete insurance for the 1998-99 school year. Supt. Hutton was appointed to serve as the district's representative on the Region 17 Education Service Center Advisory Committee.

Trustees authorized the superintendent to sell surplus district property, consisting of two AC welders, assorted boxes of tile, and a wheelchair, and budget amendments were approved as presented.

THS senior Abbie Gill presented her state championship BPA presentation to the board, entitled "Double Your Pleasure; Double Your Fun," and she also thanked the board for their financial support of the BPA program.

Counselor Sherri McCord presented the results of the 1998-99 Exit Level TAAS test for the sophomore class, with 100% of students passing the Reading test, 98% passing Math, 98% passing Writing, and 96% passing all tests taken. These impressive TAAS results placed Tahoka ISD in the top 5% of the state, she said.

Administrative reports were presented by principals Jimmy Parker, Glo Hays and Ronald Roberts, Athletic Director Troy Hinds, Supt. Hutton, and District Officer Larry Dodd. Good results were noted in Accelerated Reading programs in both the middle school and elementary, and end-of-year activities were outlined for the board. Hinds reported that the THS baseball team will be playing for bi-district at Monahans against Tornillo tonight (Thursday) at 7:30 p.m.

Supt. Hutton compared tax rate information with a number of districts in this area and throughout the state, and also briefed the board on their upcoming Superintendent's Academy and Board Conference in San Antonio the first week of June.

Prior to the 7:30 p.m. meeting, a dinner was held in honor of the board and their spouses, and a plaque of appreciation was presented to outgoing trustee Juanell Jones. The board also presented a gift of appreciation to Business Manager Loretta Tekell, who is retiring in June.

Present at the meeting, which included an hour in executive session, were six of seven trustees (Brad Hammonds was absent), Supt. Hutton, school attorney Cal Huffaker, district administrators and other staff. The next board meeting was scheduled for June 15.

Rep. Counts Visits Here:

Good Crowd Views New Center During Open House Ceremonies

An estimated crowd of over 300 well-wishers attended open house ceremonies last Thursday at The Center for Housing and Community Development, the Tahoka Housing Authority's new office/community center complex at South 3rd and Ave. K. Several dignitaries were on hand as well to speak to the crowd, including State Representative David Counts, Donald Bethel, the new Chairman of the Board of the Texas Department of Housing and Community Affairs, and Roman Palomares, Deputy Director of Housing and Urban Development (HUD), Ft. Worth office.

"This facility is good - as good as you will use it," Rep. Counts told the group. "This could be the meeting center of the South Plains, and maybe stimulate the economy some," he added. He also said that the flag which was flown over the capitol in Austin that day (May 14) would be presented to the Tahoka Housing Authority in honor of the occasion.

Palomares praised Executive Director Bill Miller and the local Housing Authority Board for their vision and determination in completing the project, and for wise use of the funding in not only the new construction but also in renovating the 50 housing units.

A sizeable grant in the amount of \$831,997 was obtained through HUD in September 1996, and these funds were used primarily to renovate and upgrade the 50 housing units in Tahoka, from new roofs to exterior and interior painting, new central heat and air units, new flooring and appliances, and handicap access renovations. After renovations were completed the remainder of the funds were used in the new construction project, including office and boardroom facilities, large banquet room/kitchen, a smaller meeting room and a computer training classroom.

Palomares was so impressed with the new facilities, he said that HUD is

considering making the Tahoka complex a regional training center for HUD, which would entail about six meetings annually for HUD officials.

Donald Bethel, who resides in Lamesa, also praised the local board for their vision, offering his congratulations on the completion of the facility.

Jay Dee House, Mayor Pro-Tem for the City of Tahoka, read a proclamation by the mayor designating May 14, 1998 as "The Center" Day in Tahoka. Former mayor Jim Solomon also extended his congratulations during the ceremonies, and Rev. Andrew Nance opened the formal ceremonies with a prayer dedicating the building to God's glory.

Residents of the Tahoka Housing Authority provided refreshments for the occasion.

Miller told The News that the facilities are now available for use by the community, and may be reserved (no more than three months in advance) by calling the Tahoka Housing Authority at 998-4716. The big banquet room/kitchen rents for \$50 per day, with a \$100 deposit, and the smaller meeting room rents for \$20 per day, with a \$50 deposit. He hopes to have computer training classes scheduled by late summer.

John Krey, chairman of the local board, announced during his remarks that the Tahoka Housing Authority is purchasing the 24 apartments on North 7th Street from the Tahoka Industrial Housing Board (not affiliated with the Housing Authority) and has acquired a \$360,000 loan from the Texas Department of Housing and Community Affairs to completely renovate those housing units, for a total of 74 housing units here.

Project SMART Program offered For Migrants Here

Tahoka ISD will offer a program for migrant students named, "Project SMART," this summer. This will be the second summer that the program has been offered here. Migrant students are children of families that move into or out of school districts because farm related work. Project SMART, a national distance learning program for migrant students, represents a collaborative effort between the Division of Migrant Education and the Texas Education Agency to increase the educational opportunities for migrant students utilizing distance learning technology. The project is completely funded by TEA.

Project SMART is a blend of television technology and innovative instructional design that helps two groups of students. First, migrant students who remain in Texas during the summer are taught in their homes, at school sites, or in community centers via televised classes with additional instructional support from locally employed teachers. The second group consists of Texas students living temporarily out of state and participating in established summer educational programs for migrant students.

This summer, Tahoka ISD's Project SMART will provide inter-

active televised instruction for migrant students from June 1 through Aug. 8. Texas EMS Week - May 17-23 Volunteer EMS Personnel Provide Vital Link For Emergency Care

Texas EMS Week is May 17-23. This year's theme, *The Vital Link*, celebrates the contributions of EMS providers throughout the country, reaching out to potential recruits and stressing the importance of strong public support for the EMS system. EMS care began 40 years ago, when situations such as the following were typical:

Imagine this: One morning on the way to work, you get caught in a traffic jam caused by a major two-vehicle crash. A hearse pulls up to the crash scene, one person jumps out and runs to check the injuries of the three victims. The lone attendant pulls a stretcher from the hearse, loads one deceased victim onto the stretcher and then into the hearse. The rescuer returns for a victim with crushed chest injuries and carries the man to the hearse, lying him on the floor beside the stretcher. Next, he drags a 70-year-old woman with broken legs to the front seat of the hearse. Carefully placing her in the passenger seat, the attendant tries not to cause more injury to the woman's legs. The attendant drives the hearse first to a local hospital emergency department, which may or may not have doctors on duty, and then on to the funeral.

"Emergency medical response all across Texas has improved dramatically since the day of that crash some 40 years ago," said Gene Weatherall, chief of Texas Department of Health's Bureau of Emergency Management. Today, ambulances staffed with at least two trained and certified medics respond to medical assistance calls and at least one medic provides care to the patients during transport. Some ambulances are as well-equipped as hospital intensive care units. And 9-1-1 emergency calls can be made in every county in Texas.

Lynn County Hospital District EMS and TDH remind you and your family that emergency response teams provide a lifesaving link between ill or injured individuals and medical care.

"Nearly 50,000 trained and certified emergency personnel are part of Texas EMS," Weatherall said. "They respond to people in need and give the best emergency medical care possible. These highly trained medics are an integral part of our system of care for victims of sudden and serious illness and injury."

In Texas, this system begins with an informed public able to recognize a medical emergency and make the call for help, and includes a network of trauma centers that provide highly specialized care for the most seriously ill or injured.

Lynn County Hospital District EMS is staffed 24-hours a day, 7 days a week by 15 volunteers. They are called out by a paging system located at the hospital. These individuals are made up of businessmen and women, farmers, plumbers, secretaries, mothers and fathers, all of whom have other responsibilities.

Lynn County EMS is made up of three intermediates, eight EMT's, three ECA's and one driver. They are Dee Dee Pridmore, Kathy Long, Donna Raindl, Steve Sanders, Todd Henry, Ginger Henry, Kent Stone, Sharon Gandy, Keith Paschal, Michael Angeley, Jeanie Stone, Bobby Jolly Jr., Pam Ashcraft, Janie Isbell and Jeremy Brandon.

The individuals who make up Lynn County Hospital District EMS have received training through Texas Tech, which has one of the top two EMS education programs in the state, and is rated among the top ten in the nation. Some of these members have as much as 18 years experience. They are required to do continuing education to keep their certification and must re-certify every four years, so they are continually learning and upgrading their skills.

Lynn County Hospital District EMS is responsible for covering 888 square miles of Lynn County, as well as serving as backup for O'Donnell EMS and Post EMS. These volunteers leave their homes and families and sometimes their jobs,

day or night, at a moment's notice to go to the aid of others. Many times these individuals report to work on time in the morning after having been up all night caring for someone who is ill or injured while the rest of the county sleeps.

Lynn County Hospital District EMS responded to 541 calls in 1997, averaging 45 calls per month. In order to cover this large area and to be available for needs as they arise, Lynn County Hospital District EMS has found it necessary and beneficial to our patients to transport them to the closest appropriate facility. Unless otherwise instructed by the EMS Medical Director, the majority of the time patients are transported to Lynn County Hospital, which is a Level IV Trauma Facility, designated by the state. Level IV Trauma Facilities are required to have a doctor on call in the emergency room twenty-four hours a day. Some situations require contacting the Lubbock Communications Center and launching a helicopter to come to the scene to transport a patient.

Each time the ambulance goes out, there is usually a crew of three, with at least two certified, as is required by the state, but usually all three are certified. They work closely with the local police, fire department, and the Lynn County Hospital to provide the best emergency pre-hospital care available for the citizens of Lynn County. Lynn County Hospital and the Lynn County Hospital Ladies Auxiliary provide the equipment and supplies that allow them to do their job.

It's a tough job, made even tougher sometimes because the very people these volunteers are called on to help may be neighbors, friends, or even family members.

During Texas EMS Week, give these hard-working volunteers a pat on the back and a work of praise...sometimes these words of encouragement go a long way towards making a tough job a little easier.
