I ONCE READ that you can tell a lot about a person's personality by his or her behavior while waiting for an elevator or by the way the person positions a chair when asked to come in and sit down.

There's one type they didn't mention: the person who picks up the chair and holds it in front of him or her with the legs pointed your way probably is the insecure, defensive type. Either that, or someone has warned them about you.





Parker Gets 3-Year Supt. Contract, Tommy Varner Named THS Principal

Tahoka High School Principal Jimmy Parker will take the top leadership position in the Tahoka school district on July 1, as Tahoka I.S.D. Board of Trustees voted unanimously to appoint him superintendent at a special meeting held Tuesday noon. A new high school principal was also hired, and three teaching positions were filled.

Trustees offered Parker a threeyear contract and an annual salary of \$65,000. He has served the district as high school principal here for the past three years, coming here from Clyde where he was principal for 3-1/2 years and assistant principal for 1-1/2 years. Prior to his administrative positions, Parker was an ag teacher at Clyde.

"I am looking forward to serving the district as superintendent," Parker told The News. "I am sorry that Mr. Hutton is leaving, and I have enjoyed working for him and my relationship with him, and wish him all the best. I'll have some big shoes to fill because of the good work he and the board have done in the last five years. I want to continue to improve Tahoka I.S.D. and am grateful to the Board of Trustees for this opportunity," he added.

In other action, Tommy Varner was named high school principal, with trustees approving a two-year contract and annual salary of \$54,500 plus \$100/month car allowance. Varner is currently high school principal at Abilene Wylie, and will take over duties here on July 1.

Varner's wife, Debbie, was offered a one-year teaching contract, and it is expected that she will serve as business/keyboarding teacher at the middle/high school level, taking over some of the classes currently taught by Angela Ehlers. Board President Greg Henley explained to The News that Mrs. Ehlers, who currently teaches a full schedule of keyboarding/computer classes at Tahoka High School, will be named Technology Coordinator for the district and will teach only two classes in addition to her new duties next year.

Supt. David Hutton informed the board that two positions which he had been authorized to fill have been filled. Travis Breitschopf and his wife, Jennifer, have been hired by the district as a teacher/coach and teacher, respectively. Breitschopf fills the assistant coach/teacher position vacated by Haskell Sinclair, and Mrs. Breitschopf will teach at the elementary campus, filling the position vacated by Misti Guess. The couple are from Coolidge, where he taught English and was assistant coach.

Henley told The News that two positions in the district remain to be filled, including the elementary principal position and assistant band director. He indicated that several candidates were being considered for the principal position which is being vacated by Ronald Roberts, who is resigning to accept a position else-

Present at the meeting were six trustees, including Henley, Brad Hammonds, Joe Calvillo, Carmen Chapa, Ty Askew and Math Bartley. Trustee Leighton Knox Jr. was absent from the meeting.

Lynn County Commissioners Monday accepted the lone bid from West Texas Caterpillars for a new maintainer for county precinct 4, at a cost of \$110,259, to be financed through First National Bank of Tahoka. All four commissioners approved the decision.

In other business at the routine meeting, monthly bills were approved as presented. Lynn County **Extension Agents Doris Collins and** Bryan Reynolds were at the meeting to present an update on activities at the County Extension Office.

Lynn County Judge J.F. Brandon presided at the meeting, with all four commissioners present.

Former Tahokan Randy White To Display Art In Post Exhibit

"Dreams, Dramas, and Fears", an exhibit of the art works of contemporary artist Randy White and metal artist Daryl Dissinger will open with an Artist Reception at the Algerita Arts Center in Post, June 4 from 7-10 p.m. The Algerita Arts center is located at 131 East Main Street in Post, one block east of the Main and Broadway red light. The exhibit will be open to the public until July 11.

The latest series of work for both artists are about tornados.

"Tornados are majestic and powerful, and as we witnessed the destruction in Oklahoma with fear and distress, we are trying to translate both the respect for nature's power and deal with the fear at the same time," White says.

White, a 1978 graduate of Tahoka High School, received his formal art training at Texas Tech, but says he rejected formality in order to capture the essence of dreams, dramas, and fears. As a young man, he wanted to view Texas in the rear view mirror. but later found that it was Texas that actually gave him his inspiration. After exploring art in Europe, New York, Los Angeles, and South America, he says he was drawn back to Teas to renew that inspiration so important for art exploration. He has always felt "on the edge" so he chose Post because it was the "edge" of the Hill Country and provides White the privacy to paint as well as a mixture of traditional and contemporary values to deal with his contemporary

Daryl Dissinger makes no claims as an artist, however, White considers him a genius. "Daryl thinks of things that most artist with art degrees wish they could think, the expression of purity that goes far beyond the educational system. Daryl always puts a bit of ingenuity into everything he does on a functional level, such

as storm cellars, etc. that would otherwise be a tedious job. Our collaboration is so rare, that in all the places that I've been, never have I met someone who has such a direct mind link as Daryl and myself. He dreams it; he makes it, and calls me for critiques. I am always a bit envious but delighted with his work, and I hope that eventually everyone in this area will know how much of a treasure that he is to the art community," White says.

White will be one of 300 artists chosen from 16 countries to exhibit in the Biennale Internazionale Dell Arte Contemporanea exhibit in Florence, Italy. The exhibit was cancelled for May, but is scheduled to resume once the war in Kosovo is resolved. White's artwork is in collections of Robert Redford, Jane Alexander, Whoope Goldberg and other celebrities. During his 24 year career, his work has promoted social concerns, with Whoopie Goldberg sponsoring an exhibition of his "Artifacts of the Streets" to raise funds for Comic Relief, a charity that helps the homeless. "Festival of Arts Collaboration" in Taos, New Mexico featured White's work for New Mexico Special Olympics. He also worked with the Native American Congress of Equator, South America, and the Native American Rights Fund in Boulder, Colorado, and was included in the National Traveling Exhibit of the Anne Frank holocaust tour.

Her name will appear in the United States Achievement Academy Official Yearbook, which is published nationally.





EMT Training Requires Dedication, Commitment, Lots Of Volunteer Hours

It is a way of life which few choose to embrace, because it requires stamina, split-second decision making, stressful situations - and that's just for starters.

On the Lynn County EMS, 13 volunteers are scheduled round-theclock for serving the needs of the people in the county, and more are obtaining certification to join the EMS force.

The EMT Basic Course is offered through Texas Tech Health Sciences Center, with college credit earned through South Plains College. Lynn County EMS coordinates with instructors to offer the class in Tahoka when there are enough interested participants. The last session in Tahoka just ended, with seven students completing the five-month

Classes for the Tahoka course began Jan. 11 and ended May 19, taught by Alvin Chatman, a Lubbock Paramedic with Lubbock EMS and TTHSC EMT instructor. Students completing the local class included Vondell Elliott, Steve McKay, Nikky Alvarado, Billy Flores, Alana Sholer, and Melissa Engle, all of Tahoka; and Andy Tate of Brownfield.

These students attended 18 weeks of class, two nights a week from 6-10 p.m., for 144 hours, and also attended three Saturday classes during the course, approximately 6 to 8 hours each day for an additional 18-24 hours of instruction. During the class course, students were required to pass four interim exams and a final exam.

One of the Saturday training classes was an all-day Extrication and Rescue Field Training Exercise held May 8 at the Lubbock Fire Station Training Center. Approximately 8 to 10 EMT certification classes from the South Plains area attended the all-day exercise, which included several training stations: school bus extrication: ropes instruction and use of a Stokes basket to lower a patient from the top of a roof or cliff; three-story tower transporting patients with a stair-chair or long spine-board in narrow stairs and hallways; 18-wheeler truck cab extrication; smoke-house and attic extrication; Jaws of Life and power tool demonstration for automobile extrication.

"We were all extremely tired at the end of the day, but it was a very educational and unique experience which will help us in the field," said Mrs. Elliott, one of the Tahoka class members. "We made some mistakes and learned what to do in certain situations. Our class, however, was faster than any other class in our first run in extricating "victims" from the school bus training exercise," she added

In addition to the class coursework, students were required to observe six 8-hour shifts at either Covenant Hospital (Methodist) or UMC ER departments, including one shift at Covenant Pediatric ER and at least one shift at either hospital in Labor and Delivery to observe the birth of a baby. Additionally, students must observe/assist with ten emergency ambulance runs with Lubbock EMS.

After all requirements are met, students can then take the Texas Department of Health Certification Exam, which is offered once a month in Lubbock.

All must complete their training and take a state TDH Certification Examination prior to being able to help on the Lynn County EMS service, except for those who volunteer strictly as ambulance drivers. And, on the local service, any volunteer must observe six practice runs before participating at any level.

Mrs. Elliott and Steve McKay are currently on the Lynn County EMS service as drivers and upon certification will be qualified to serve as EMTs; Alana Sholer, and Nikky Alvarado are joining the local service and are currently making their six practice runs before being able to take shifts as drivers, and, upon certification and more practice runs, as

medic. Lynn County EMS has one ECA (Donna Raindl), seven EMT-Basics (Sharon Gandy, Ginger Henry, Todd Henry, Bobby Jolly Jr., Kathy Long, Steve Sanders and Jeanie Stone, who is also Lynn County EMS Coordinator), and three EMT-Intermediates (Dee Dee Pridmore, Kent Stone, and Keith Paschal). Each level requires additional training and certification, and continuing education is required to maintain certification at all four levels of Emergency Medical Training.

O'Donnell also has a Volunteer EMS Service, with 10 certified EMTs and an ambulance driver. O'Donnell EMTs include Alan Barrett, Allen Eaker, Gina Hancock, Judy Williams, James Williams, Robyn Williams, Gustene Bairrington, Rebecca Childress, Denise Villarreal and Willie Villarreal; and Leo Bairrington serves as a driver.

New Home has a "First Responder" team which assists with emergency calls until ambulance or other emergency service teams arrive. Organized by Stacy Thornhill, a paramedic in Lubbock, the 16member First Responders have completed a first aid CPR course and include Ms. Thornhill, Rob Mello, Rick Clem, Dale Clem, Bob Clem, Jammie Clem, Britt Byerley, Don Smith, Martina Torres, Pedro Garza, Antonio Garza, Mary Flores, Patty Ramirez, Eddie Askew, Carolyn Askew and Judi Fillingim. According to Ms. Thornhill, the group plans to continue other emergency training courses in the future. The City of New Home has an agreement with Wolfforth and Lynn County ambulance services for emergency assis-

Lynn County EMS has two ambulances and serves approximately 800 square miles, including the entire north, west and eastern portions of Lynn County, and south to FM 3332. The service operates under the direction of Lynn County Hospital, which provides funding of \$20 per person per ambulance run.

O'Donnell EMS, with one ambulance, serves the southern portion of Lynn County as well as portions of Borden and Dawson counties, covering about 500 square miles.

Lynn County is fortunate to have these volunteers willing to serve the people of Lynn County 24 hours a day, seven days a week, to assist with emergency situations. It is a service which everyone needs, but few are able - or willing - to provide.

MANDATORY HEALTH EFFECTS LANGUAGE

Many public water systems are required by federal regulation to routinely analyze for fluoride levels in the drinking water they provide to consumers. Analyses of the drinking water in your community has found a level of 5.1 mg/l of fluoride. The U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) has set a standard for fluoride at 2.0 mg/l to minimize the occurrence of objectionable dental fluorosis.

Fluoride at the appropriate levels in the drinking water of children up to the age of nine. reduces cavities. However, children exposed to levels of fluoride greater than 1.0 to 2.0 mg/l may develop dental fluorosis in their permanent teeth. Dental fluorosis, in its moderate and severe forms, is a discoloration (brown staining) and pitting of teeth.

Because fluoride affects only developing teeth, households without children would not be expected to be affected by this level of fluoride. Individuals with children under the age of nine are encouraged to seek other sources of drinking water for their children

The EPA Maximum Contaminant Level (MCL) for fluoride is 4.0 mg/l. That standard is based upon protection from crippling skeletal fluorosis, which may result from levels of 4.0 mg/l or more. The MCL is an enforceable standard and has been set to protect public health.

Your water supplier can lower the concentration of fluoride to the level where beneficial effects still occur (cavity prevention) and where the occurrence of dental fluorosis is minimal. The technology for the removal of fluoride is currently available but the use of this technology by your utility may increase your monthly water bill. Treatment systems for the removal of fluoride from drinking water are also available for home use. Information on such systems is available at the address given below. Farmers Urged To Look At Water As Commodity

Texas Farmers and ranchers will have unprecedented opportunities to chart their future in the next 50 years in light of predicted water shortages, a Texas Agricultural Extension Service agricultural engineer said.

their loved ones.

Texas is expected to fall short in meeting water demands: some say by the year 2050, the state's water demand will be 20.95 million acre-feet per year. However, the groundwater and surface water supply projected will fall short by 6.04 million acrefeet, enough water to cover the entire state of New Hampshire to a depth of one foot.

"Existing supplies will not meet the demand," said Dr. Bruce Lesikar of College Station.

It is expected that the shortfall will be met through more efficient agricultural, landscaping and household practices, waste water reuse, development of new resources, or reducing the amount used on irrigated

Already, irrigated agriculture use is predicted to drop to 5 million acrefeet of water from the current 11.1 million acre-feet of water. Still, Lesikar predicted, about 17 percent of the irrigation demand will go

"Our water path is not really charted," Lesikar said. "We have the opportunity to change how our water picture looks in the future, either by increasing the amount of waste water that we use for the irrigation of crop land or turf grass areas and using more potable water resources

for meeting other demands." Lesikar urged farmers to consider

was as a commodity. "When we start considering water as a commodity, we will be looking at what is the best use of that water resource," he said. "It may be more profitable for the farmer to actually sell the water to other sectors

than it is for him to use the water to grow an agricultural crop."

For instance, urban water consumers pay from \$1 to \$2 per 1,000 gallons of water in the first part of their water usage; then \$2 to \$4 per 1,000 gallons as they get up into a higher water usage and rate structure. That could increase to \$4 to \$6 per 1,000 gallons as water becomes more precious and alternative technologies are needed to treat the water to drinking water quality, he said.

If a farmer purchased his water for 65 cents per gallon and he grew a crop that required 2 acre-feet of water, or 650,000 gallons, to grow, his water cost would be \$422 per acre. On the other hand, the farmer could sell the water to the municipality, re-

sulting in a profit of \$422. The city could then transport the water, pay for the pipeline to bring it to the city and sell the water and still cover their infrastructure costs, he

The farmer could then use that land to grow dryland crops or could sell just a portion of his water and irrigate a smaller section of land, and still have an annual income coming from the sale of the water.

Lesikar warned, "If you sell the right to the water, you get a one-time sale to the city. So it would be better to lease your water or sell it on an annual basis rather than selling the right to the water.'

Not everyone will have this option to sell water; however, farmers near major cities may wish to con-

Water deficits also may be met through new technologies being developed for water treatment, allowing the use of saline groundwater resources or the Gulf of Mexico as supplies. There also may be a shift in the types of crops being produced form those that use more water to those that use less.

Farmers have been switching to more efficient means of irrigation over the last two decades, said Dr. Guy Fipps of College Station, Exten-

sion agricultural engineer. "One change we're seeing is the abandonment of furrow irrigation and a switch to center pivot irrigation," Fipps said. Long used on the Texas High Plains, the more-efficient center pivot method is being adapted widely in Southwest Texas. These types of systems put the water where the crop needs it, either on the surface of the ground or under the sur-

Lesikar added, "With irrigation scheduling, we can calculate what the water demand is for that crop and apply that water at the time the crop needs it or store the water in the soil profile. We get the maximum return on the water invested in the crop pro-



MANDATORY HEALTH EFFECTS LANGUAGE FOR NITRATE The Texas Natural Resource Conservation Commission (TNRCC) sets drinking water standards and has determined that nitrate poses an acute health concern at certain levels of exposure. Nitrate is used in fertilizer and is found in sewage and wastes from human and/or farm animals and generally gets into drinking water from those activities. Excessive levels of nitrate animals and generally gets into drinking water from those activities. Excessive levels of nitrate in drinking water have caused serious illness and sometimes death in infants under six months of age. The serious illness in infants is caused because nitrate is converted to nitrite in the body. Nitrite interferes with the oxygen carrying capacity of the child's blood. This is an acute disease in that symptoms can develop rapidly in infants. In most cases, health deteriorates over a period of days. Symptoms include shortness of breath and blueness of the skin. Clearly, expert medical advice should be sought immediately if these symptoms occur. The purpose of this notice is to encourage parents and other responsible parties to provide infants with an alternate source of drinking water. Local and State health authorities are the best source for information concerning alternate sources of drinking water for infants. TNRCC has set the drinking water standard at 10 parts per million (ppm) for nitrate to protect against the risk of these adverses effects. TNRCC has also set a drinking water standard for nitrite at 1 ppm. To allow for the fact that the toxicity of nitrate and nitrite are dditive, TNRCC has also established a standard for the sum of nitrate and nitrite at 10 ppm. rinking water that meets the TNRCC standard is associated with little to none of this risk and onsidered safe with respect to nitrate.

BBB Issues Alert On Bogus Pyramid

The Better Business Bureau has issued a national alert to warn consumers who are considering investing in an "international program of wealth distribution", called Pentagono or Future Strategies International.

The plan, which is based in Italy and promoted on the Internet, advertises that consumers can receive up to \$116,000 for an initial investment of \$120. Participants are asked to purchase three certificates, and to sell those to three other people. Tied to the promotion is a discount shopping card, which consumers complain is honored by very few businesses and saves shoppers at most a few dollars.

The Securities and Exchange Commission (SEC) has taken enforcement action against Future Strategies during its third nationwide Internet fraud sweep. The SEC alleges that Future Strategies sold "Pentagano Certificates" now called "Card Purchase Orders" to more than 400 investors in the U.S. making false promises that an investment of

only \$120 or so could earn up to \$115,400. The SEC alleges that the entire program was a sham, a fraudulent pyramid scheme, designed to bilk investors.

Pentagono promoters advertise the plan as an exciting short cut to riches, easy living and retirement; you're asked to pay a large entry fee; and the plan focuses more on the recruiting of other participants than on the selling of a product or service.

E-mail and calls to BBB indicate

that consumers are being lured by the company's claim that it is registered with the Italian government's Chamber of Commerce; its contention that any financial rewards are not subject to taxes; and, by the many enthusiastic testimonials posted on its web site.

Trying to stop foreign schemes such as this from operating in the United States is virtually impossible. BBBs nationwide are advising consumers to consider two facts: One, pyramids are illegal in this country and if you recruit others to join, you may be subject to prosecution. Two, if you choose to buy into this type of venture, there is no recourse if you end up dissatisfied.

"In order for everyone to profit in a pyramid scheme, there has to be a never-ending supply of potential and willing participants," says Nan Cambell, President of the South Plains Better Business Bureau. When the supply runs out, and it inevitably does, the pyramid collapses and most participants lose their investment.

"Like other pyramid schemes, this one seems intent on exploiting people with limited means and limited knowledge of business. It's also typical for pyramid schemes to target closely-knit groups, like churches or civic groups, and to encourage participants to recruit friends, neighbors and relatives," Campbell said. The Pentagono promotions have targeted deaf people in some states; in other states, the main focus appears to be on senior citizens.

State Attorney General Offices are taking action against Pentagono promoters. The Pennsylvania Attorney General's office and the State of Louisiana's Attorney General, for instance, have issued warnings in response to complaints from consum-

ers in their states. Consumers complain that they had joined the program but had yet to receive a return on their investment.

This award is a very prestigious honor very few students can ever hope to attain. In fact, the Academy recognizes fewer than 10% of all American high school students.


Tonya, who attends Tahoka High School, was nominated for this award by Cathy Box, science teacher at the school.
