a house, condominium, or mobile home.

## Are other exemptions available?

If you're disabled -- or if you're 65 years old or older .. you are entitled to an additional $\$ 10,000$ school tax exemption on your home. And if yo locked-in "ceiling" on the school property taxes on your home. The over 65 homeowner's exemptions and school tax ceiling transfers to the sur viving spouse, if the spouse is 55 years of age or older at the time of death
and lives in and owns the home. Over-65 homeowners also may transfer the percentage of school tax paid, based on their former home's over-6 school tax ceiling, to a new home.

## Do I have to apply each year?

 No. If you had a homestead exemption on your home in $\mathbf{2 0 0 0}$, you won't No. Ir you had a homestead exempton on your home in on your present home -. or if you've moved to a new home -. you'll need to file for an exemption for 2001. If you are 65 this year, you may file for the over-65 exemption up to one year after the date you turned 65 . And if youbecame disabled during 2000, you need to file for the disabled person's became disa
exemption.
