Fees Approved For Attorneys Appointed By Court

Lynn County Commissioners met Tuesday, Dec. 18, discussing several agenda items including a fee schedule for court-appointed attorneys to serve indigents for District Court, County Court, and Juvenile Court. Lynn County Attorney Jay Napper met with commissioners to discuss the proposed fees, which were approved.

In other business, commissioners gave the okay for Lena Cloe to submit a grant application for the Lynn County Victim Assistance office, and a request to purchase a copier for the Lynn County Extension Office was approved.

No decisions were made regarding the possibility of exempting travel trailers from property taxes in the county.

SWCD Taking Orders For Windbreak Trees

The Lynn County Soil and Water Conservation District is currently taking orders for windbreak (conifers) and hardwood trees. Windbreak trees sell for \$2 and hardwoods are \$1 per tree.

Conifer trees available include Afghanistan Pines, Pinyon, Pines and Eastern Redcedars. Hardwood trees available are Amur Honeysuckle, Bur Oak, Catalpa, Desert Willows, Fourwing Saltbush, Green Ash, Hackberry, Honeylocust, Lacebark Elm, Nanking Cherry, Red Oak, Russian Olive, Sand Cherry and Sand Plum.

Wildlife packets for quail and pheasant, deer, turkey, and squirrel are also available. These packets consist of 100 hardwood trees and sell for \$55 per packet.

Orders will be taken until all trees are sold but orders should be turned in as soon as possible. All trees will be available for pick up on Feb. 28.

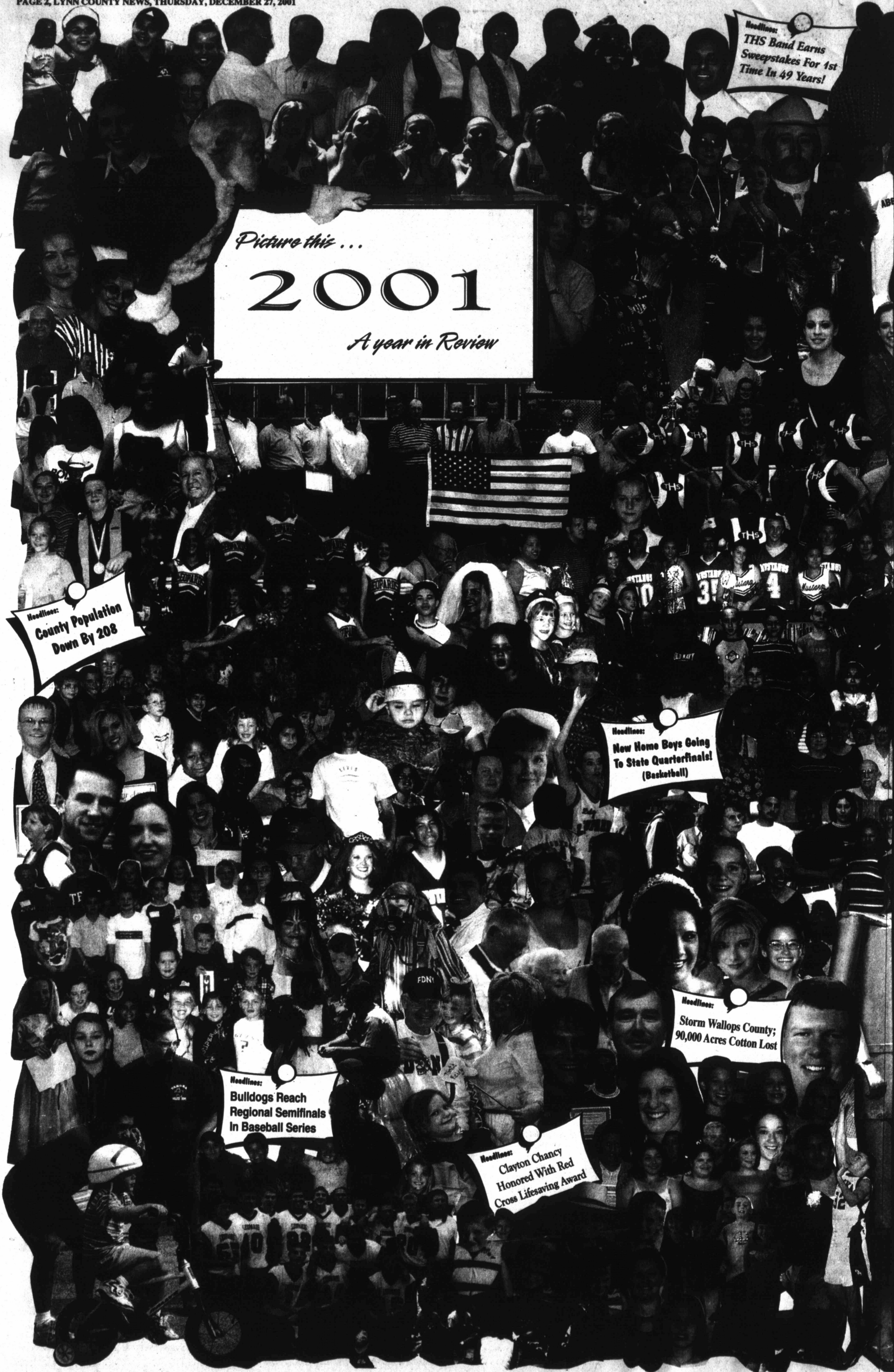

Though an individual may sign an organ donor card, medical professionals are required by law to ask the next-of-kin for permission to donate their loved one's organs. 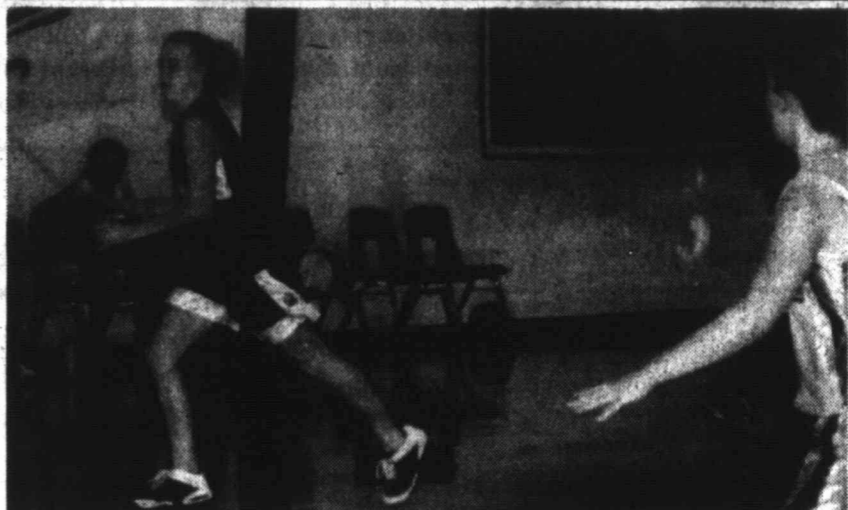
She was married to the Rev. Charles J. Uzzle who died June 19, 1980. She then married Conner Williams who died Oct. 24, 1998.

County city to show an increase over last year, receiving \$5,868.01 this year as opposed to \$5,102.04 last year, for a 15.01 percent increase. Wilson showed a 1.26 percent decrease, receiving \$380.38 this year versus \$385.24 for the same period last year. O'Donnell received \$577.46 this year as opposed to \$949.21 last year for a significant drop of 39.16 percent. Lynn County received \$6,825.85 this year; \$6,436.49 last year — an increase of 6.04.

Year-to-date, Lynn County has received \$95,633.75, while the city of Tahoka has received \$76,747.38. O'Donnell has earned \$12,791.04 and Wilson has been allocated \$6,095.33.

Rylander Delivers Sales Tax Rebates

Texas Comptroller Carole Keeton Rylander recently sent local governments their final sales tax rebates for 2001. The Comptroller sent \$217.8 million to cities and counties, up five percent compared to Dec. 2000.

December sales tax rebates represent sales taxes collected in October and reported to the Comptroller in November. The state's share of sales tax collected during the period was \$1.3 billion, up 1.6 percent compared to a year ago.

December sales tax rebates bring the total sales tax allocated to local taxing entities in 2001 to four billion, an increase of four percent compared to \$3.8 billion in sales tax allocations in 2000.

In 2001, Texas cities received \$2.6 billion in sales tax rebates, a 5.2 percent increase compared to 2000. Counties received \$221.8 million, a 4.4 percent increase over 2000.

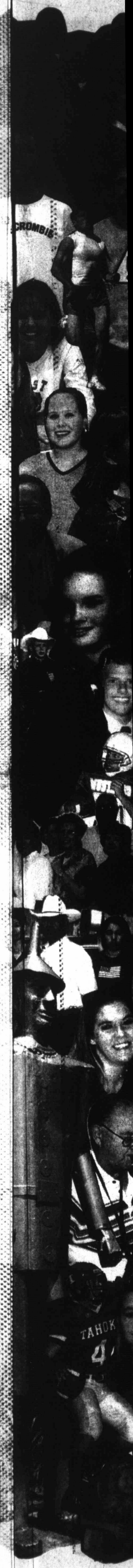

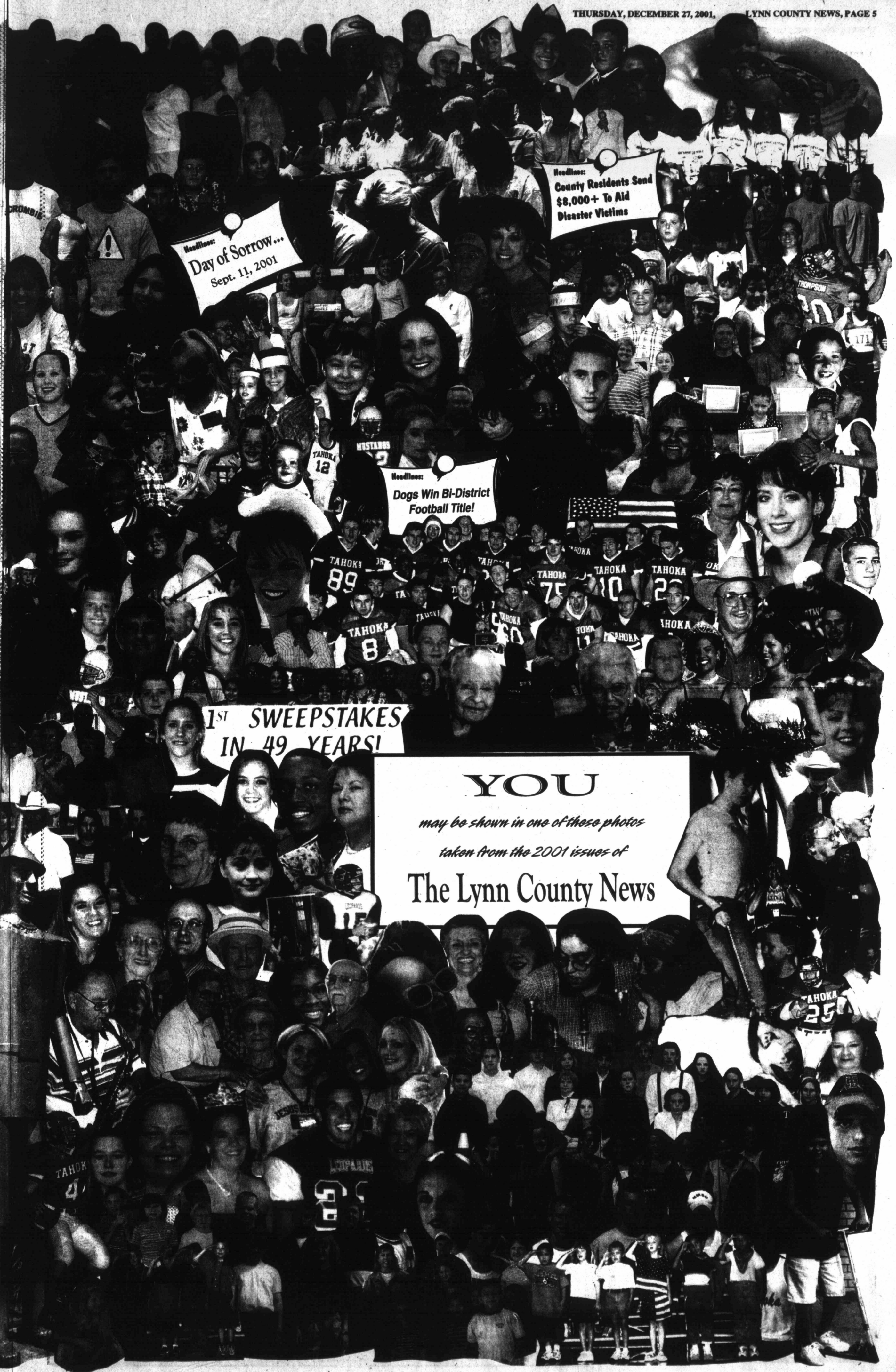
