


Dinner, Auction To Benefit Wilson VFD

Resigns Position Here

Lynn County Sheriff Jake Diggs has resigned his position here, submitting a letter of resignation to county officials on Friday, March 21, effective on Monday, March 31. Diggs was unavailable for comment. but County Judge H.G. Franklin told The News that Diggs' letter of resignation did not list any reasons for the action, but that the sheriff had told him he was leaving for "personal reasons," and not because of any issues with other county officials.

Franklin reported the resignation to county commissioners at Monday morning's regular meeting, but no action was taken regarding filling the position.

"We will most likely have to post the position and take applications for an interim sheriff," Judge Franklin told The News.

In the meantime, Chief Deputy at the Sheriff's Office is Jerry D. Franklin, who is the head officer during the absence of the sheriff.

Diggs was appointed interim sheriff by commissioners in October 1998 and then was elected sheriff in the 2000 election. His term would have been up in 2004, when the next general election occurs.

Last-Minute Filings Add Names To Elections

Several candidates added their names to election ballots during the last few hours of the filing period last Wednesday afternoon, including the Tahoka ISD election, City of Wilson election, and City of O'Donnell elec-

Shi Dotson filed in the Tahoka ISD election, making a slate of five candidates for two at-large seats on the board of trustees. Other candidates include incumbent Greg Henley, Valton Stephens, Reggie Moore and Jimmy Dorman.

Five candidates added their names last Wednesday to the City of O'Donnell election, which now has a grand total of eight candidates for three council seats up for election. Richard Luera, SanJuana Luera, Bryant Rayngay, Tommy Woolam and incumbent Larry Pyron added their names to the slate, joining three others who had previously filed, including incumbent Max Mendieta,

David Eaker and Simon Resendez Jr. Three more candidates added their names to the list in the City of Wilson election, making just enough candidates to fill needed slots on the city council, which has three regular terms and a one-year unexpired term on the ballot. Incumbents Victor Steinhauser and Lupe Guzman filed for regular terms, and Cody Donald filed for the unexpired term. Incumbent Helen Stephenson had previously filed for a regular term. City officials say they will not conduct an election, as all candidates are unopposed.

Wilson ISD will also cancel their election, as their trustee election failed to draw enough candidates for

three positions on the board. Two candidates had previously filed, including Donna Holdren for a regular three-year term, and Debbie Schoor for a one-year unexpired term, and these candidates will be declared elected. No candidate filed for the other regular three-year term. The WISD Board of Trustees is currently operating with only six trustees, and school officials say the district will probably continue operating with only six, although the board of trustees may, if they choose, appoint someone to fill the vacant position on the board.

New Home City and School elections have been canceled, drawing just enough candidates to fill positions. O'Donnell ISD will have an election, with three candidates for two seats on the board, including incumbent Renn Dorman, Monty Hancock and Ben Edwards. The City of Tahoka will also conduct an election, with three candidates for the District 1 seat on the city council, including Rudy Fuentes, John Baker and Jimmy McMillan. District 3 incumbent Amy Preston and Mayor Mike Mensch are unopposed in their bids for re-election.

Elections will be conducted May 3, with early voting scheduled April

The Lynn County Hospital District election has a different filing deadline for candidates, which continues through April 1. Thus far, the three incumbents, Billy Tomlinson, Virginia Griffing and Jerry Ford, are the only candidates to file for the three seats on the Board of Directors, all three-year terms.


Phil Reagan


